The YMCA of Boulder Valley has seen a drastic increase in the support it provides to low-income families over the past year. In 2015, the nonprofit gave out around \$474,000 in financial assistance to families and individuals in need. That number has skyrocketed in 2016 to \$800,000—letting thousands of low-income children, adults and seniors access Y programs like

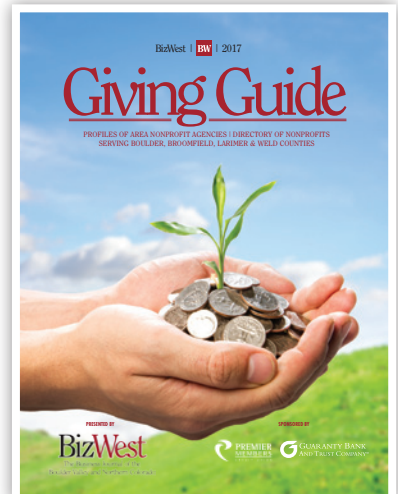

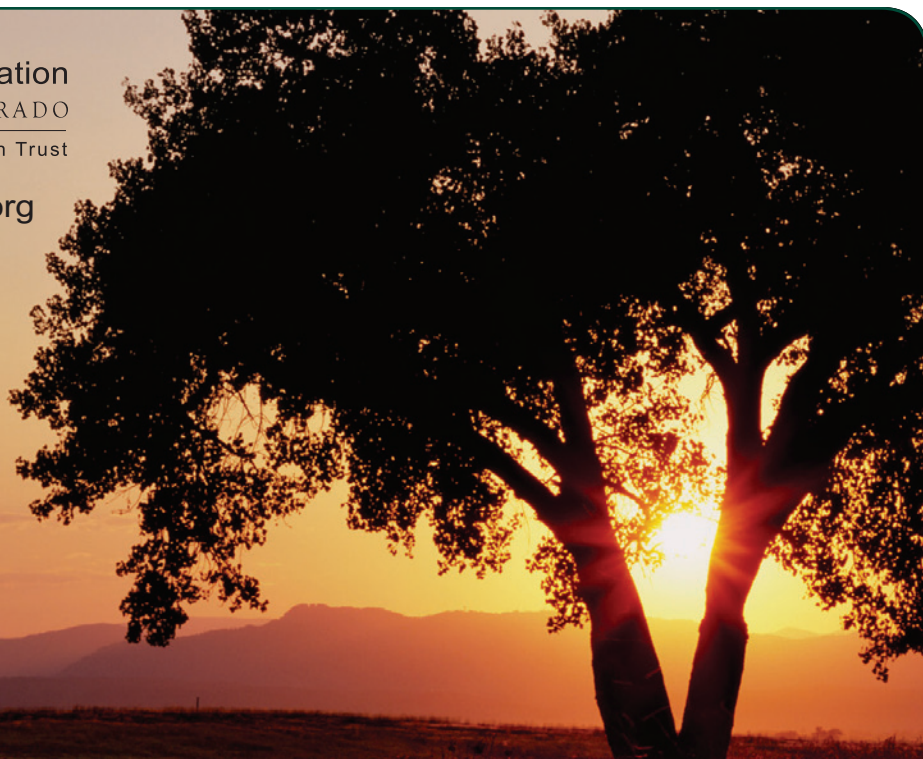

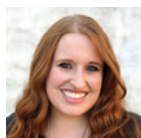

Every victim of child sexual abuse has a past that's traumatic and daunting. When they come to ChildSafe, they count on us to help them heal.

Their journey is a long and difficult one. It's a daily struggle, but our clients heal, and we're there for them every step of the way. We at ChildSafe are honored to walk alongside our clients as they take this healing journey, and we hope you will join us.

Over 85% of our clients are low income, which is defined as 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) and below. No one is turned away due to an inability to pay. While fees are assessed according to a sliding scale, are based on income level, and can be as low as \$5 per session, we have clients who struggle to afford that amount.
