





Demand for services up, even as donations down

Economic difficulties are a familiar refrain these days, even though economists say the Great Recession technically ended a couple of years ago. Positive economic signs often are countered by downturns in one statistic or another. Executives at many for-profit companies tell me that they are having trouble determining a trend: sales are brisk one month, so-so the next.

Uncertainty remains the buzzword.

Imagine the difficulties faced, then, by the Boulder Valley's nonprofit sector, which has been hit doubly hard by the economic downturn: Not only do donations suffer, as individuals and businesses cut back on their charitable donations, but a poor economy also means that nonprofits experience a surge in demand for their services.





Helping kids make **healthy** choices

The Kitchen [Community], partners build Learning Gardens at elementary schools

Kimbal Musk and Hugo Matheson are adamant about helping kids eat better.

As co-owners of The Kitchen restaurants in Boulder, they recently opened The Kitchen [Next Door] that caters to kids with a menu full of healthy choices. But they wanted to do more.

Earlier this year, Musk and Matheson founded The Kitchen [Community], a nonprofit organization that partners with local organizations to help accelerate initiatives that connect kids to real food, with the ultimate goal of reversing the growing trend of obesity among children in the United States.

The Kitchen [Community] is partnering with The Grove Foundation to provide Boulder Valley schools with a Learning Garden and the Grove Garden-to-Table program, which is already in 16 Boulder Valley School District elementary schools and Slow Food Denver's Seed-to-Table program in 36

public schools in Denver.

In September, The Kitchen [Community] partnered with CU-Denver's Learning Landscapes, Denver Public Schools and Slow Food Denver to fund and build a Learning Garden at Schmitt Elementary School in Southwest Denver. It has plans to help create many more throughout the United States.

The Learning Garden was designed by artist and architect Jen Lewin, Musk's wife and co-founder of The Kitchen restaurants.

The garden is an extension of the classroom and an enhancement to the school playground. Students plant, harvest and consume their own fruits and vegetables such

as lettuce, peppers, basil, tomatoes, strawberries, plums, herbs.

Musk and Matheson believe their mission will help combat the epidemic of obesity among youth in America.

Thirty-five percent of American

children are overweight or obese, according to the International Obesity Task Force. The significant health risks associated with this increasing trend among school children was the primary motivation for The Kitchen Community.

According to the American Dietetic Association, sixth-grade students involved in a garden-based nutrition education program increased their fruit and vegetable consumption by 2.5 servings per day, more than doubling their overall fruit and vegetable consumption.

Fifth-grade students who participated in hands-on science lessons in a school garden scored 15 points higher on science tests on a 100-point scale than students who learned in a typical classroom, according to HortTechnology, the journal of the American Society for Horticultural Science.

“A Learning Garden is an extension of the playground that kids want to play in and around, and a natural outdoor space where teachers will want to teach,” Musk said. “The Learning Garden is a positive investment to benefit the school and its students for the long term.

“Our hope is that Learning Gardens will give children an understanding of food, healthy eating, lifestyle choices and environmental stewardship through lesson plans and activities that tie into the existing school curriculum.”

A Learning Garden is a permanent organic garden that includes fruit trees, shrubs and raised vegetable beds that provide an interactive outdoor space to connect children with real food.

It’s designed as an educational tool to inspire spontaneous play by children and create an attractive outdoor classroom for teachers.

Unlike simple garden beds, a Learning Garden comprises modular beds with built-in irrigation systems that can be shaped in any configuration to fit small and large plots in virtually any schoolyard. The Learning Garden design also includes hand-painted signs by children to increase their ownership of the garden.

Schmitt Elementary is the first school in the nation to receive a \$50,000 Learning Garden Grant on behalf of The Kitchen [Community]. The school is 97 percent Hispanic, and 91 percent of its student population is on a federally subsidized food program. The Learning Garden at Schmitt Elementary is 1,800 square feet, and volunteers were able to construct it in a few hours.

Legacy of Learning helps at-risk students turn around their game in the classroom

Nonprofit uses controversial teaching method to get results

Not all kids learn the same way, especially if they are dyslexic, autistic or suffer from some form of sensory overload and are easily distracted.

It's not that they aren't capable of learning, they just need be taught differently, said Iris Lee, program director of Legacy of Learning in Boulder.

Lee said the nonprofit is having success in providing an alternative method of teaching fundamental skills in reading, writing, spelling, math and critical thinking through its tutoring programs.

Legacy of Learning is using Direct Instruction, a controversial teaching technique developed by Drs. Siegfried Engelmann and Wesley Becker in the late 1960s. The technique emphasizes the use of small-group, face-to-face instruction by teachers and aides using carefully scripted lesson plans and structured teaching techniques.

"This method has been the most researched and most misunderstood," Lee said, referring to the national debates among teachers and school districts since Direct Instruction was debuted in 1968.

Part of what has made Engelmann's program so disliked in many quarters is that it removes the chance for teacher error. In essence, the popular valuing of teacher creativity and autonomy as high priorities give way to following certain carefully prescribed instructional practices. Engelmann created the program based on years of clinical research.

"It's often criticized for being too

regimented, too structured, too much like the military," Lee said. "But over the years it has been proven to work. We can help struggling students improve by several grade levels."

The method is based on the theory that clear instruction eliminating misinterpretations can improve and accelerate learning. For example, teachers talk in low voices and refrain from being animated in their movements. Working face-to-face with students, they tackle complex tasks one element at

a time and don't go on to the next one until the previous one is completely understood. When teaching spelling, the letters of words are said rhythmically by the teacher and the student repeats the letters at the same pace the teacher delivers them.

"It's just like a dancer trying to learn new choreography or a football player learning a new play. They practice the same thing over and over again until they

FOOTHILLS UNITED WAY LOOKS TO THE FUTURE

FOOTHILLS UNITED WAY CELEBRATES ITS 90TH ANNIVERSARY in 2012 with a fresh operational model that puts people together with problem-solvers. Organization leaders see this as a progression of their mission, a way of doing things that adds to the group's classic model, that of raising and allocating money. That classic model began back in 1922, when Foothills United Way began its life in Boulder County (and what would eventually become Broomfield County) as the Community Chest. The organization began a transition to a model focused on long-term change when it became clear that building a stronger community required looking beyond immediate needs.

Pat Monacelli, Foothills United Way director of communications and marketing, said that the hope is to help to create lasting change. "We look at how many people are served (by a particular program) in addition to, what is the long-term outcome? What will happen further down the road?" he said. "If you want to create long-term change you have to think about it both ways."

United Way far reaching

United Way Worldwide, which began in Denver 125 years ago, is now in nearly 1,800 communities in 45 countries, helping people to help others improve their living conditions through giving, advocacy and volunteering. Foothills United Way collaborates with other United Ways in Colorado on many projects such as 2-1-1 Colorado, a state-wide 24-hour hotline that connects people with vital health and human services.

However, Foothills United Way's mission, to mobilize people and resources to address vital is-

ues and build a stronger, thriving community, also points the organization in its own directions.

One, a project that originated with Foothills United Way and Boulder County Commissioners, is called the Non-Profit Cultivation Center. At the Center, non-profits can get help integrat-

ing and coordinating the delivery of human services throughout Boulder County. The program is designed to help local nonprofits leverage resources and build capacity in order to do their work as efficiently and effectively as possible.

Another collaboration between Foothills United Way and Boulder County Community Action Programs, Personal Investment Enterprise, helps low-income residents to

save money and build economic stability.

Foothills United Way also helped to stabilize a community devastated after the Fourmile Canyon fire in 2010. Hundreds of homes were damaged, and millions of dollars lost, but Foothills United Way responded with immediate relief to those affected through the Fourmile Canyon Fire Relief Fund and today continues with long-term recovery efforts.

Reaching still further: The story of Jane

Foothills United Way's investment in the community is both wide-spread and quite personal. When families have access to affordable, quality childcare, the parent or parents can stay employed. The story of how Foothills United Way helped Jane (the names in this story have been changed to protect individuals' privacy) is a good example.

Jane, a single parent with two children, struggled financially, but she worked hard at being self-sufficient. Money was tight. It was difficult enough to hold down a job, but when her youngest, Michael, became ill shortly after his birth, things got even tougher. There was no child support for Michael and any unusual expense put her budget in the negative.

Jane found what she was looking for in a local childcare center supported in part by Foothills

Typical Cases of Relief Work Being Carried On In Boulder Briefly Outlined—Campaign for Funds To Begin Monday

"Everybody Give" in order that every needy person in Boulder may be helped is one of the slogans of the Community Chest which will start a campaign for \$12,000 Monday.

The Chest is relying upon big donors, as in the past, but will have to get small sums from hundreds of people who have never given before if the campaign is to be successful.

Persons who have no other interest than that the poor of Boulder be provided for and who are giving not only of their own money and time, will take the field Monday morning to visit every home and business house in Boulder.

They should be met by merchants who have made up their mind of the amount they are going to give and time should be given to the workers to see each employee.

Some examples of help that have been given distress cases follow:

Young working girl, who became ill and lost her position, was boarded for a month, provided with groceries and coal for three months, is now able to work again.

Young mother of twins, deserted by her husband, and unable to work because both babies were in delicate health, was supported; given special diet, medicine and clothing for the baby, bedding, shoes, garden seed and other aid.

Three children of an unemployed father were ill with septic sore throat and were given the services of a doctor and a nurse. A special diet for the patients was prepared and supplied. Father and mother were given help so that they could take care of the children. The fatherly were "not papers" and influenza for aid from the county.

Two quarts of milk were supplied a family, the father of which was unable to earn enough money to care for them. There were two babies in this family besides several children.

Young man from Eastern Colorado came here with wife and baby because conditions in his county were bad. Became destitute, however, was supplied with bedding and food until he could secure work.

Family here for six months exhausted their resources. The husband and father could find no work. They were supplied with transportation to the home of relatives who promise to assist them. The county and city was thus relieved of the duty of taking care of one family and itself was benefited.

Man, wife and five children stranded here. Police called the Social Service bureau at 3:30 a.m. They were given groceries and oil to enable them to continue their journey to Kansas where they have legal residence.

United Way. This United Way partner program had a sliding fee scale that allowed Jane to get Michael the quality daycare he needed at a price that allowed the family to survive financially. Jane was delighted.

"It was difficult to entrust my child to a caregiver, but I could see that the child care staff loved Michael," she said. "It's not really daycare. It's care at a higher level, a level close to the care that I would give Michael if I could stay home with him."

Foothills United Way provides funding for 70 local programs to meet health and human service needs in Boulder and Broomfield Counties. Programs meet immediate needs as well as work together to help families and individuals turn their circumstances around, to be productive members of the community and to have a better quality of life.

get it right,” Lee explained.

“We make sure we praise our students when they get something correct. We praise them on a ratio of four to one, praises to corrections,” Lee said. “And we don’t try and move to fast. We introduce only 10 percent new material each lesson.”

In October 2011, a study conducted by the American Institutes for Research’s Comprehensive School Reform Quality Center, rated the Direct Instruction method “moderately strong,” the highest rating given.

Jake’s story

Jake Leslie, now 17, was diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder when he was in kindergarten. ADHD, a problem with inattentiveness, over-activity and impulsiveness, plagued Jake. He hated school. He attended private school before moving to public middle school where he was placed in special education.

“Jake always wanted to get good grades. He never had a problem with discipline,” said his mother, Lorraine Leslie. “But he struggled all the time. As a parent, it’s the hardest thing to see your child work so hard and simply fail.”

Prior to Jake entering ninth grade, he began taking classes at Legacy of Learning. Dreading the start of the school year, Lorraine recalled they were both “scared to death.” But to their surprise, Jake began bringing home A’s and B’s. “He conquered his disability; he learned how to learn because of the programs Legacy of Learning supported,” Lorraine said.

Making headway

Legacy of Learning was established in 1998 to combat illiteracy by funding students of economically challenged families. Over years the program expanded and evolved. Hundreds of instructors and volunteer teachers have educated more than 125 low-income students at centers in Louisville and Boulder.

Lee, who also serves as the director of Dreamcatcher Direct Instruction Centers, a segment of Dreamcatcher, Legacy’s sister nonprofit organization, said there has been a significant increase

in the acceptance of Direct Instruction this past year.

“We have had more referrals than any previous year, and families are simply walking in and requesting services for their children,” she said.

Recently the organization was approved for a \$10,000 work-study grant from the University of Colorado.

Legacy’s teachers not only work at the center, but also onsite at Justice High, the college prep school for students who are truant, expelled or in the criminal justice system. And they recently began teaching classes at Columbine Elementary in the Boulder Valley School District.

Lee said the organization’s proudest accomplishment is witnessing dramatic changes in its students.

“Our philosophy is based on the belief that all students can learn, regardless of their histories, behavioral patterns or learning preferences. With our academic system, students suffering from low self-esteem are discovering untapped resources and finding their unlimited potential.”

Funding challenges

Legacy of Learning is operating on a budget of \$85,000 this year, and is always looking for financial support. It pays some of its teachers, and other teachers volunteer their time.

“We charge a sliding scale, and some students are tutored for free. We don’t turn anyone away. We find a way to make it work, Lee said.

Lee said donations are the organization’s greatest need.

“We rely on financial contributions from our community and local and national foundations to support our work. We also need more volunteer teachers who can commit two hours a week for four months.



KULA Causes turns benefits from unclaimed loyalty points over to nonprofit organizations

While most of us pay no more attention to our rewards program than a casual glance before Christmas, a new Boulder startup has a plan to change that for the better.

“Companies are starting to realize that they have to offer more than a \$10 backpack that they are charging \$100 in points for,” said Gerrit McGowan, chief executive of KULA Causes Inc. “It just doesn’t build a meaningful relationship between the customer and the brand.”

The vast majority of loyalty points, about 80 percent, go unclaimed. Whether that’s because of shoddy prizes, or the consumer doesn’t have enough points to claim a prize, more than \$16 billion worth of loyalty points go unused each year that still have to be kept on the books by the issuing company.

KULA Causes aims to change that by creating a portfolio of nonprofits that can accept these points or unused frequent flyer miles, McGowan said. This would mean that consumers can help out the worthy cause of their choice, and presumably brands could also create a loyalty program that consumers actually find worthwhile.

In many nations — especially Britain, Canada, Australia and New Zealand — such brand loyalty programs are a pretty big deal. For instance in Canada, where McGowan spent the last decade, about 60 percent of the nation’s credit-

card wielding consumers participate in air miles programs, in which they can stock up points from a number of retailers, including the local grocery store and gas station.

Grocery stores are really the lynchpin for the success of such programs, McGowan said, and the more regionalized nature of the U.S. grocery market is one reason that idea has really taken off here.

“Today’s consumer demands more from customer loyalty programs.

They want rewards offering choice, liquidity and immediacy,” notes a prepared statement from Bill Hanifin, co-founder of Customer Strategy Network, a professional organization studying best practices in consumer loyalty programs.

“KULA Causes enables any brand to connect emotionally with their customers, increasing customer engagement and satisfaction, while making a real difference in the world through their ‘currency of giving.’”

Of course, many loyalty programs do offer a handful of donation options, but charitable organizations receive less than 1 percent of all rewards issued annually, McGowan said. He stressed that lack of choice also results in missed

opportunity for meaningful engagement by businesses striving to reach consumers through their cause-related marketing efforts.

KULA has already put together a portfolio of more than 2 million organizations in five countries that can accept such loyalty points or flyer miles, which is half the equation. The issuing companies also have to be in on the deal, of course, and McGowan said that over the course of the next couple months there will be announcements by at least several major brands that they will also participate.

Consumers can also participate in the beta launch of a site, www.kulacauses.com that will allow them to participate. That may seem enough of a market to tackle, and it may be in the short term, but McGowan envisions something much bigger from his startup.

Kula (kurlə) in Kilifvila means a ceremonial gift exchange based on the belief that the more one gives, the richer one becomes. In Sanskrit, it means a community of the heart, which is what the company is really driving at.

After graduating from the University of Colorado, McGowan worked for United Nation community development programs, bringing together governmental and private sector stakeholders to create economic opportunities. While working in Africa and the Far East, he said, his business idea began to generate.

“More than a decade of work in the nonprofit sector made it evident to me the divide between charitable causes and the power of business community was massive, and the programs to close the gap didn’t exist,” McGowan said. “Today there is greater pressure for the government not to provide services, while charities and nonprofits, which are supposed to fill in the gap, are receiving less money.”

What KULA Causes ultimately hopes to be able to fashion are rewards programs that will actually support local community causes, whether they aid the homeless or the booster club of the local high-school football team. The company will soon be creating a pilot program, probably in New Zealand or Australia, which will work on the community level, something that could aid both the community and the small businesses that are supported by that community.

“We want to provide them the same tools as a billion-dollar retailer,” he said. He added that most loyalty programs, and online marketing programs such as Groupon, actually hurt small businesses.

While it appears the tax deductibility of the exchange will have to be verified by the consumer, McGowan said recent changes in financial law have actually strengthened his company’s position.

“The royalty industry long afraid their programs would cause consumers to be taxed,” he said. However, today “the royalty industry doesn’t have to be concerned about taxation.”

McGowan started his company 18 months ago, with about \$500,000 in angel investment. Today the company has seven employees, mostly business-development experts, but is

looking for a multimillion-dollar Series A investment and could be employing a couple dozen employees in the next few months, including web developers.

And as they help develop the local economy, they may in fact be creating a process in which all communities can help their own.

“And you can donate to your child’s classroom, or pay your dues to the alumni association, or give it to your church,” he noted. “We are really attaching an emotion to a brand.”

GLOSSARY of Nonprofit Terms

ADVISED OR DESIGNATED FUND

A fund held by a community foundation where the donor may recommend eligible charitable recipients for grants.

AFFILIATE FUND

Local fund affiliated with a foundation.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT

A fund established within a community foundation or other public foundation by a nonprofit organization.

ANNIVERSARY OR BIRTHDAY CAMPAIGN

A fundraising campaign centered around an anniversary date of an institution on the premise that the occasion will stimulate giving.

AREA OF INTEREST FUND

A fund that allows donors to direct funding to a particular cause or specific geographical area.

BEQUEST OR CHARITABLE DEFERRED GIFT

A donation made to a charity named as beneficiary under a will or trust.

CAUSE OR CAUSE-RELATED MARKETING

A partnership between a for-profit company and a nonprofit organization that increases the company's sales while raising money and visibility for the cause.

CHALLENGE, CONDITION OR MATCHING GIFT OR GRANT

A grant that is paid only if the nonprofit is able to raise additional funds from other sources.

CHARITABLE CLASS

The group of people that may legally receive assistance from a charitable organization. A charitable class must be large or indefinite enough that providing aid to members of the class benefits the community as a whole.

CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The portion of a gift to a qualified charity

that is deductible from an individual's or corporation's federal income tax, individual's gift tax or individual's estate tax.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

A contract under which a charity, in return for a transfer of cash, marketable securities or other assets, agrees to pay a fixed amount of money to an individual during his or her lifetime.

CHARITABLE LEAD TRUST

A trust that provides an income stream to a charity for a specified period of time. At the end of that period, trust assets are distributed to noncharitable beneficiaries such as children or grandchildren.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUST

An arrangement in which property or money is donated to a charity, but the donor continues to use the property and/or receive income from it while living.

COMMUNITY OR PUBLIC FOUNDATION

A nonprofit, publicly supported, nonsectarian philanthropic institution with a goal of building permanent funds established by separate donors for the broad-based charitable benefit of the residents of a defined geographic area.

COMMUNITY FUND

An organized community program that makes appeals to the public for funds to be used for the ongoing operational support of local agencies.

CORPORATE CITIZENSHIP

Business giving, including business relationships and partnerships with nonprofit organizations.

CORPORATE FOUNDATION

A private foundation that receives its funding from the for-profit company whose name it bears but is legally an independent entity.

CORPORATE GIVING PROGRAM

A grant-making program established and administered within a for-profit corporation.

CORPORATE VOLUNTEER COUNCIL

A network that businesses join to address community needs through workplace volunteering.

CORPORATE, EMPLOYEE OR WORKPLACE VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

A company-managed program that coordinates company staff with nonprofits looking for volunteers.

DEMONSTRATION GRANT

A grant made to establish an innovative project or program that will serve as a model. If successful it may be replicated by others.

DESIGNATED ENDOWMENT

Established by an individual, family or business to benefit one or more charities.

EMPLOYEE MATCHING GIFT OR GRANT

A program whereby an employee's contribution to a charitable organization is matched by a similar contribution from the employer.

ENDOWED FUND

A fund created by gifts that establish its principal, which then makes grants from the income generated by that principal. An endowed fund exists in perpetuity and continues to carry out the donor's wishes after death.

ENDOWMENT

A permanently restricted fund, the principal of which is protected and the income from which may be spent.

EVALUATION OR PILOT GRANT

A grant that supports the external evaluation of a project. With a successful project, the evaluation grant works as a leveraging tool, enabling the recipient to seek further funding.

FEDERATED FUNDER

A joint fundraising effort administered by a nonprofit "umbrella" organization that in turn distributes funds to nonprofit agencies. Examples include United Way, United Jewish Appeal and United Negro College Fund.

GLOSSARY of Nonprofit Terms

FLOW-THROUGH FUNDS

Contributions to a foundation that are used primarily for direct grant making rather than for endowing the foundation.

FOUNDATION

A public or private nonprofit corporation or trust that makes grants to organizations, institutions or individuals for scientific, educational, cultural, religious or other charitable purposes.

IN-KIND DONATION OR GIFT

A gift of goods or services rather than cash or property.

INITIATIVE-BASED GRANT MAKING

A grants program based on applicants responding to a request for proposals.

IRREVOCABLE TRUST

A gift in trust that cannot be rescinded.

LIMITED-PURPOSE FOUNDATION

A foundation that restricts its giving to one or very few areas of interest, such as higher education or medical care.

MEMORIAL OR NAMED FUND

A fund established by, or named for, an individual, family, corporation or other group to carry out the charitable interests of the donor or honoree.

NONENDOWED FUND

In contrast to endowed funds that can only make grants from interest income, a nonendowed fund's principal can be used for grants.

NONPROFIT

An organization established for activities other than profit making. Some nonprofits are exempt from federal income taxation, but they may be taxed on income from unrelated businesses they conduct.

Common nonprofits include:

501 C (3)

A public charity or private foundation. Gifts to a 501 c (3) are tax-deductible.

501 C (4)

A social welfare or employees' association whose net earnings are used solely for charitable, educational or recreational purposes.

501 C (6)

A trade association or business leagues not organized for profit or private benefit.

501 C (7)

A social club organized for pleasure and recreation.

501 C (8)

A fraternal beneficiary society, order or association operating under the lodge system that provides benefits to members and their dependents.

501 C (12)

A benevolent life insurance association, cooperative or ditch or irrigation company.

OPERATING FOUNDATION

A private foundation that uses the bulk of its income to provide charitable services or to run charitable programs of its own.

PARTNERSHIP FUNDING

A grant program where "partners" often government and philanthropic sources have input into the project.

PASS-THROUGH FOUNDATION

A foundation that receives funds and makes distributions with little or no principal remaining with the foundation.

PERPETUAL TRUST

A trust established with the intent to keep the principal invested in perpetuity and distribute the income from investments to one or more charities.

PROGRAM OR PROJECT GRANTS

Funds to support specific projects or programs as opposed to general support grants.

PROGRAM RELATED INVESTMENT

A loan (not a grant) made by a foundation to another organization for a project related to the foundation's interests.

RESTRICTED ENDOWMENT INCOME

Income from a permanent fund used for a specified purpose.

RESTRICTED FUND, GIFT OR GRANT

Money given with donors' specifications on how a nonprofit may use it.

REVOCABLE TRUST

A trust that can be recalled by its creator. Revocable trusts become irrevocable when their creators die and can become irrevocable sooner if the creators give up the power to revoke.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

A nonprofit venture that combines the passion of a social mission with the innovation and determination commonly associated with for-profit businesses.

SOCIAL ENTREPRENEUR – An individual who engages in social enterprise, drawing upon the best thinking in both the business and nonprofit worlds.

SOCIAL VENTURE FUNDS

Charitable funds in which donors invest their expertise as well as their money, providing support and requiring accountability of nonprofit organizations just as venture capitalists do in business enterprises.

SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INVESTING

The practice of aligning a foundation's investment policies with its mission. This may include refraining from investing in corporations with products or policies inconsistent with the foundation's values.

UNRESTRICTED FUND

A fund that is not specifically designated for a particular use by the donor, or for which restrictions have expired or been removed.




