# State of Giving

Region's nonprofits ahead of projections, but worry about federal tax changes

Nonprofits in the Boulder Valley and Northern Colorado are experiencing a nice wave of giving, with most saying they are ahead of projections so far this year.

"We are in the midst of our busiest quarter as we head toward year end," says Jeff Hirota, CEO of Community Foundation Boulder County. "We won't really know how it is going or how it went until after the fourth quarter because of the season of giving and how it works with charitable donations."

Part of that jump can be attributed to the current political climate in the United States.

"Earlier in the year we were witnessing a lot of amplified energy around certain community issues: immigrants, women's reproductive health, civil liberties, to name a few, and LGBTQ rights as well so we ran a series of awareness messages and also signs throughout the county and had a forum calling leaders of these agencies together to make a connection between the national climate and how to make a difference locally," Hirota says.

He adds that, "ordinarily, grant making goes up when people feel concerned about the way things are going."

In general, Boulder County and Colorado don't have a great track record for charitable giving. In the foundation's Boulder County Trends Report, the giving ratio in Boulder County is 2.72 percent and the median contribution is \$3,052, which "puts Boulder County in the bottom third of charitable giving," says Hirota.

Colorado's giving ratio is 2.87 percent with a median contribution of \$2,958, which is lower than all of the surrounding states. Utah's giving ratio is 6 percent, in large part because of its large religious community, he adds.

The big question is why are Boulder County and Colorado so low? Hirota says that it could be because Boulder County is one of the least religious counties in the country, and there is a connection between participation in a faith community and charitable giving. Another theory is that there are a lot of small nonprofits in the area that don't have budgets to hire fundraising staff to seek out charitable giving. The one bright spot is that people in Boulder

County volunteer their time at twice the national average, he says.

Doug Yeiser, president and CEO of Foothills United Way serving Boulder and Broomfield, says that "we have a particular challenge in terms of building philanthropy in this community."

That is something that many different charities have been working on for a while.

"We know we have some very generous and giving people here. Part of the issue might be focusing their philanthropy on their home community. They have international and worthy interests all over the country," Yeiser says.

He voiced concerns about maintaining the current levels of philanthropy moving forward.

"This year and the next couple of years we're already seeing significant cuts from the federal level in terms of human services provided in our community. All charities are experiencing or are about to experience that, so regardless of what we are able to do, if you think about community work as collaborative work, with the government and nonprofits and all of us working together on this, when a particular sector like federal government



dollars start to shrink, it will impact services on the ground,” he says. “We’ve got a challenge in front of us to pick that up and make sure we maintain the level of services our community needs.”

Yeiser points out that Foothills United Way depleted its reserves when it stepped in to lead the collaborative flood recovery efforts in the area after the 2013 flood.

“We’re in desperate need of people thinking of United Way when they think about charitable giving,” he says.

With so many smaller nonprofits in the community, Foothills United Way made the decision to stop funding independent nonprofits and put people’s contributions toward collaborative efforts, with school districts, the faith community, government partners, foundations and business people all working together.

“We entice them to the table with the grants we make,” he says. “The average person can’t make a gift to pull together collaboration. What we’re doing is making grants that pull organizations together to combine efforts and solve the biggest issues facing our community.”

Foothills United Way has been doing this for a year and a half and so far is involved in 15 strong collaborations in the community.

“It’s being able to do together what we can’t achieve on our own,” he says.

Deborah Cameron, marketing and communications officer for the Community Foundation serving Greeley and Weld County, says that so far this year, charitable giving is up slightly from last year.

But, “we notice that there’s always more need than we can typically fill and we’re always looking to maximize our ability to fill the need that’s out there,” she says.

Attendance and sponsorships were up year over year at the organization’s 2017 Profiles Luncheon, which was good news.

The foundation has given \$22.8 million in grants over its two decades in operation. It started in 1997 with \$7.5 million in assets and distributions of \$357,891. As of Dec. 31, 2016, the foundation maintained more than \$1.5 million in grant scholarships and program support across 14 program areas, including education, charitable programs, housing and human services, arts and culture, she says.

“Our foundation supports the community at large. The grants we distribute are unique based on the fund they are in,” Cameron says.

Like Foothills United Way, Community Foundation serving Greeley and Weld

County is looking at collaboratives and building partnerships with others in the community. The biggest issue to overcome is “organizational turf and things like that. It is human nature to take pride in what you’ve built over the years. I think when people realize their mission can be expanded and extended and can be achieved with more speed when they combine assets and work together, people are excited by the opportunity,” Cameron says.

United Way of Weld County is also optimistic about the current year.

“We’ve seen slow steady growth in our overall revenue,” says Jeannine Truswell, president and CEO of United Way of Weld County. That boost has come from employees, individuals and from small and large companies. The organization’s biggest growth in revenue is from the private and public grant side.

Individual giving is not as high as Truswell would hope. She believes that is because many people live in Weld County but cross borders to go to work.

“I think it is a challenge for nonprofits, when people are commuting, to get people connected to their community,” she says.

Truswell adds that her organization is concerned that the “federal government is looking at changing some of the tax deductions that are available and what could, indeed, the impact be on nonprofit organizations. That’s significant.”

If people “aren’t going to get tax deductions they might be less generous and that will have a negative impact on communities,” Truswell says.

Ella Fahrlander, vice president for community engagement for Community Foundation of Northern Colorado, says that her organization doesn’t gear up for the end of the year giving season like a typical nonprofit.

“Our asset base has continued to grow year after year with the generosity of our community. This year our organization surpassed \$100 million in managed assets, and I believe this represents Northern Colorado’s commitment to philanthropy and the philanthropic plan for the region,” she says.

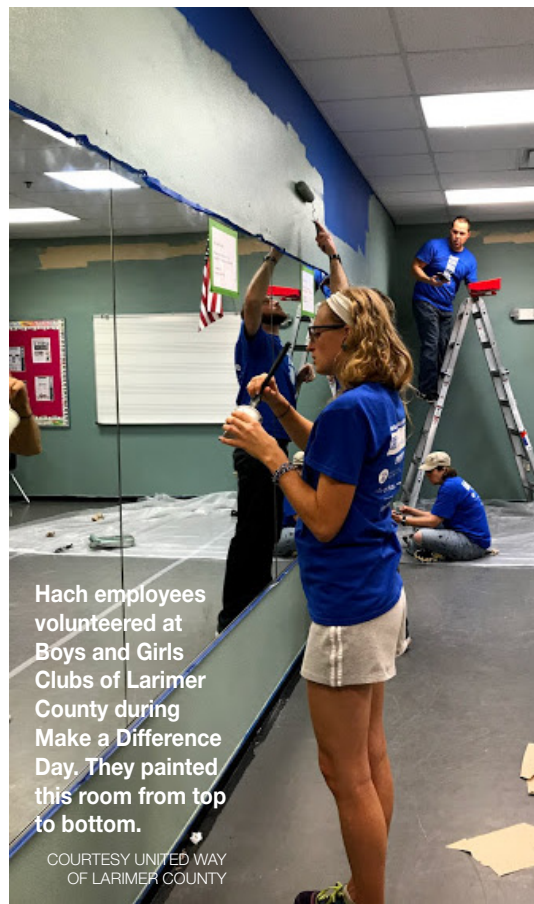
On Colorado Gives Day last year, more than 5,000 donors gave to that online giving campaign for a total of almost \$1.5 million, “which was very significant and we certainly expect that number to go up this year,” Fahrlander says.

Community Foundation of Northern Colorado granted out just under \$6 million in 2015. In 2016, they granted out \$6.5 million. This year, the foundation is going to grant \$7.8 million, “which is a huge jump from last year. Certainly the

organization is growing. More donations are coming in but, far more importantly, more contributions are going out to support nonprofits all across our community and the northern Colorado region.”

Annie Davies, president and CEO of United Way of Larimer County, says her organization is in the middle of its campaign season right now, but “in general we are really pleased that corporate support this year is really strong.”

The organization recently wrapped up a full week of service projects for Make a Difference Day where more than 900 volunteers assisted with 60 projects for 5,000 hours of service.

“That is a great testament to the strength and engagement in Larimer County and that, across the board, people really want to be involved,” Davies says.

She adds that, “Private citizens, corporations and public and nonprofit agencies throughout the community work collaboratively to continuously seek solutions to social issues and improve the quality of life for all. There is a strong sense of responsibility for ‘taking care of our own’ in Northern Colorado and that translates into strong support for the nonprofit sector and the programs and services that help people locally.”

# Give Next encourages secondary students to get into donating spirit

In five years, Larimer County students have given \$261,000 in 160 grants to local nonprofits while going to school.

The students — middle and high school students attending Thompson and Poudre schools — distributed the money through their elective classes, after-school clubs and advisory periods as part of Give Next. The year-long philanthropy program, supported by the Bohemian Foundation and the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado, provides students with experience in philanthropic giving while teaching them the important roles nonprofits play in their communities.

"It's designed to give them hands-on experience in philanthropic giving," said

Sara Maranowicz, community programs director for the Bohemian Foundation. "What we hear from students is it feels really great to give."

The students design and manage their own grant-making programs and get funding from fundraisers and donations. Local businesses, foundations and individuals donate \$5,000 to each school in the program, and the students determine how to divide up and distribute the money through grants for Larimer County nonprofits.

"Fostering youth engagement, giving of their talent, time and treasure, is powerful for a community," Maranowicz said. "It's about inspiring that next generation of people who love to give."

This year, there are 15 schools handling the Give Next grants, though the idea is to expand to all 26 middle and high schools in both school districts by 2021.

Give Next starts each school year with a kickoff celebration — this year, more than 400 students and 36 local nonprofits attended a four-hour mini-conference at Colorado State University on Oct. 4. The conference included speakers, a nonprofit fair and workshops led by nonprofit staff members to give students the tools they need to work through the Give Next program. The students learned about some of the work the nonprofits do in Larimer County and beyond and the impacts they are making on social and systemic issues.

"They often find they can start making a difference right away when they're young people. They don't have to wait until they're grownups," said Jodie Riesenberger, community programs manager for the Bohemian Foundation, which oversees the Give Next program.

Each year, an average of two to four

schools join the program, which began as a pilot project during the 2012-2013 school year. Two schools joined this year. When the program started, there were five schools involved, seven the next year and 10 schools the year after while the United Way of Larimer County handled the operations.

The Bohemian Foundation took over administration of the program in 2015, and the Community Foundation agreed to manage the donations, grant applications and nonprofit awards.

The program follows a curriculum adopted from the Oregon Community Foundation’s Community 101 program, which is modeled after the El Pomar Youth in Community Service (EPYCS) program pioneered by El Pomar Foundation in Colorado. The curriculum engages students in all aspects of the grant-making process as they work with their teachers trained as Give Next sponsors to teach the program. The students identify community needs, choose a focus area and create a mission statement to guide their work and issuance of grants.

The students make a request for grant applications in their focus areas and set application deadlines. To help with their decision process, the students conduct research about a few local nonprofits that interest them, volunteer at various agencies, engage in site visits and meet with nonprofit leaders to try to understand the work the nonprofits do.

As they gather their material, the students ask “amazing and inspiring” questions about social issues in a community, Maranowicz said.

“Never underestimate the power of great questions, especially when it’s coming from middle school or high school students,” she said.

Once the grants are in, the students review the applications to make final funding decisions, awarding an average of three to

## Key to giving: Finding your passion

Giving is a habit and a mindset, and the leaders of Give Next want to get youth motivated to give of their time and talent.

Teachers, parents and the community can encourage philanthropic giving to embody the principles of Give Next, a yearlong program that teaches middle and high school students attending Thompson and Poudre schools about the grant-making process and the important roles nonprofits play in their communities.

“There are volumes of opportunities to volunteer, and we do believe in giving of time, talent and treasure,” said Jodie Riesenberger, community programs manager for the Bohemian Foundation, which supports Give Next with the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado. “It can open their eyes to issues.”

Programs like Give Next give youth a connection to their local communities and help them realize that they can make a difference, Riesenberger said. Youth learn they don’t have to have a checkbook to give but can donate their time and still be effective, she said.

“Giving is best when it’s anchored in individual passions and interests,” said Sara Maranowicz, community programs director for the Bohemian Foundation.

Parents and teachers can help youth explore what inspires them and encourage them to engage in volunteering activities around those passions, interests and values. The students can find an interest, such as food insecurity or wildlife protection, and research which nonprofits, events and activities would allow them to offer help in that area.

“Help them find out what their interests and passions are and then giving becomes an extension of their passions instead of a to-do list,” Maranowicz said.

Telling youth to give to something or volunteer in a particular area is far less inspiring, Riesenberger said.

Instead, expose them to a wide variety of volunteering opportunities to help them find those passions, Maranowicz said. She encourages adults to ask youth what they think are the challenges a community faces and

the areas where help might be needed. They can ask the youth what they want to see change and how they could go about making those changes, she said.

“You’d be surprised at what motivates kids to give,” Maranowicz said.

The youth have a diversity of ideas when it comes to that giving, Riesenberger said.

“They have innovative and great ideas that come from being a kid,” she said.

If youth start giving when they are young, giving becomes a habit and they develop an understanding of the complexity of the issues any community faces, Riesenberger said.

Youth can find multiple ways to give, such as attending fundraising activities, volunteering at nonprofits or participating in volunteer days or volunteer events. They can check traditional and social media, rely on word of mouth, listen to school announcements or check out posters and flyers on business windows and bulletin boards to learn about the specific ways they can volunteer.

“We believe that giving adds tremendous value to communities. It adds value to our individual lives. It gives us something that we can do through our lifetime,” Maranowicz said.

The youth learn that doing small things can make a difference, said Sarah Dobo, math teacher and co-leader of Give Next at Cache La Poudre Middle School in LaPorte.

“They’re one person and, individually, they can’t do much, but if they do it together, they can see collective change,” Dobo said. “If everyone is contributing something, it will actually make a difference. .... The biggest thing is for them to be open to opportunities.”

four grants a year. They give out the grants during an award ceremony in April or May, the amounts varying depending on how much they engage in additional fundraising activities through crowdfunding, art sales and in-school fundraisers.

Cache La Poudre Middle School in LaPorte is in its second year in the program, offered through the National Junior Honor Society as an after-school club. This semester, there are 15 students in the program, and next there will be 30 — the students have to be members of the honor society for a semester before they can participate in the club.

“Even though they’re young, they have a lot of good ideas. They actually have the ability to impact other people and make change for the better,” said Sarah Dobo, math teacher and co-leader with Elizabeth Lautenschlager of Give Next.

This year, the students are focusing on raising awareness about sexual assault as a societal issue, while last year, their focus was on homelessness and food insecurity.

“They have a lot of tough conversations about what they see as needs and what would be difficult to talk about, but they know that it’s worth it,” Dobo said. “The kids love it. They think it’s great they

can make decisions, grownup decisions, about things.”

Thompson Valley High School in Loveland is in its third year in the Give Next program, which is offered in conjunction with a leadership class that meets four days a week.

Through Give Next, the 15 students in the class meet local community leaders, explore nonprofits and identify problems in the community, said Nathan Fristed, physical education and leadership teacher and facilitator of Give Next at Thompson Valley High School. They learn if current approaches to those problems are reactive or proactive and are ultimately effective, he said.

“Our students get an opportunity to see what a grant application looks like, and they get to analyze the grant applications we take in ... and evaluate them for effectiveness and areas of interest,” Fristed said.

The students also learn that as individuals they can make a difference.

“It’s the idea if you see a need, you can do something about it,” Fristed said. “There’s lot of opportunities for them to make a significant difference just by going and doing instead of thinking and talking about it. It gives them great opportunities to make small but significant changes.”

# Pledge 1% Colorado marks decade of giving

A Boulder County organization claims a decade of success in getting startup businesses and entrepreneurs to focus on charitable giving.

According to Pledge 1% Colorado's website, client contributions have totaled more than \$5 million since 2007. Originally known as the Entrepreneur's Foundation of Colorado, it was renamed Pledge 1% Colorado in 2016 and became a program of Community Foundation Boulder County.

It was time to expand, said Nicole Glaros, a current Pledge 1% Colorado adviser and former EFCO board member. "The board thought we could do more," said Glaros.

First, EFCO launched a global philanthropy initiative called Pledge 1%, which is now run by the San Francisco-

based Tides Center. The local spinoff, Pledge 1% Colorado, is locally operated and offers several ways for member companies to give to nonprofits. They can pledge 1 percent of annual profits or equity, their products and services, and even employee volunteer time, to charitable organizations.

The organization now includes more than 100 Colorado companies.

Boulder-based entrepreneurial network Techstars is one of them. Glaros, Techstars chief innovation officer, explained that the worldwide firm wants to help create a "cultural shift" by encouraging all companies to contribute to social causes.

According to Glaros, Techstars is in a position to evangelize this through its work with Pledge 1% Colorado.



"We have over 350 companies that go through a Techstars accelerator program each year, over 100,000 attendees at Startup Weekend, and thousands of mentors and Startup Week attendees."

Techstars doesn't require the companies it works with to contribute, but Glaros said they use their cultural values to convince others that giving back to communities is "a good thing to do."

Seth Levine, co-founder of Boulder venture capital firm Foundry Group and a Pledge 1% Colorado adviser, said he's motivated by helping businesses that are responsible to their customers, employees and communities. He believes such companies are more innovative and successful, no matter their product or service.

"I also believe that responsibility for creating a better world is something that can happen at all businesses," he added. "Not as a side project or something that happens after your 'core' work is done, but rather in the actions your business takes every day."

When firms join Pledge 1% Colorado's network, they can choose several ways to contribute, and which nonprofits they want the money to benefit. Young companies can agree to pledge 1 percent

of their company equity and/or annual profits. With equity, the option is liquidated when there's an exit. Pledge 1% Colorado passes the proceeds directly to the charitable organization. Owners of more mature companies can pledge their personal equity, or any products and services that contribute to solving a social problem or support a nonprofit's mission.

Companies of all ages can also commit to employee volunteerism. Techstars has an annual employee initiative called 'give-back days,' which, according to Glaros, is "a great opportunity for our staff to spend a day volunteering with an area nonprofit."

Both Levine and Glaros stressed that the desire to be a part of a network of socially responsible entrepreneurs must start at the top.

"For a long time I've been fascinated by the intersection between entrepreneurship and social change," said Levine. "When I say that I'm not describing social entrepreneurship — it's not a subset of entrepreneurship — it's simply entrepreneurship, or impact investing."

Levine noted that the Foundry Group's founders agreed on an early set of core principles that included charitable

giving. It also extended to a rule that, in its current form, is known by the hashtag #givefirst, something he developed along with Techstars.

Glaros agreed, adding that #givefirst is a core value at Techstars.

"It's written on the walls of our offices, our employees tweet it out, it's in almost everything we say and do," she said.

While such thinking may have to be embedded with the company's founders, executives, and boards of directors, the end result has a wide-ranging effect.

"It's great for the community," Glaros said, "because it creates jobs, builds sustainable companies and can help pass down ethical best practices. Social impact is something we look for in our hires; it's weaved into our daily language, and we focus real time and capital resources to social impact. I would say it's a critical part of the engine that makes Techstars go."

Added Levine, "All businesses, regardless of the product or service they produce, can work to create positive change in their communities, including with their employees, vendors and partners."

Each year, the Colorado Children's Campaign generates the Kids Count report showing data on the well-being of children, youth and families in Colorado. This year's report examines the disparities for children of color and families living in poverty. The numbers are undeniable. There are barriers to opportunity for many children and families in Colorado.

United Way of Weld County's Promises for Children Early Childhood Initiative and Early Childhood Council was pleased to host more than 80 early childhood and human-service professionals, educators and community leaders for a recent forum presenting the Kids Count results for Weld County.

I often start by thinking about a project or problem with the end in mind. I ask myself, what is the result we want, what change is it that we want to see? The end result we all want for Weld County is strong communities. This means a strong

educated workforce and families who are healthy and financially stable.

We start by making sure all children get a good start in life. We start by assuring that parents, child care providers and caregivers have the information, knowledge and support to provide nurturing, caring and healthy experiences and environments for all children.

After all, would we build a strong town or city with buildings expecting those buildings to be solid for 75 years if they were built on faulty foundations? Ensuring a strong Weld County means working to take away the barriers for success for all children.

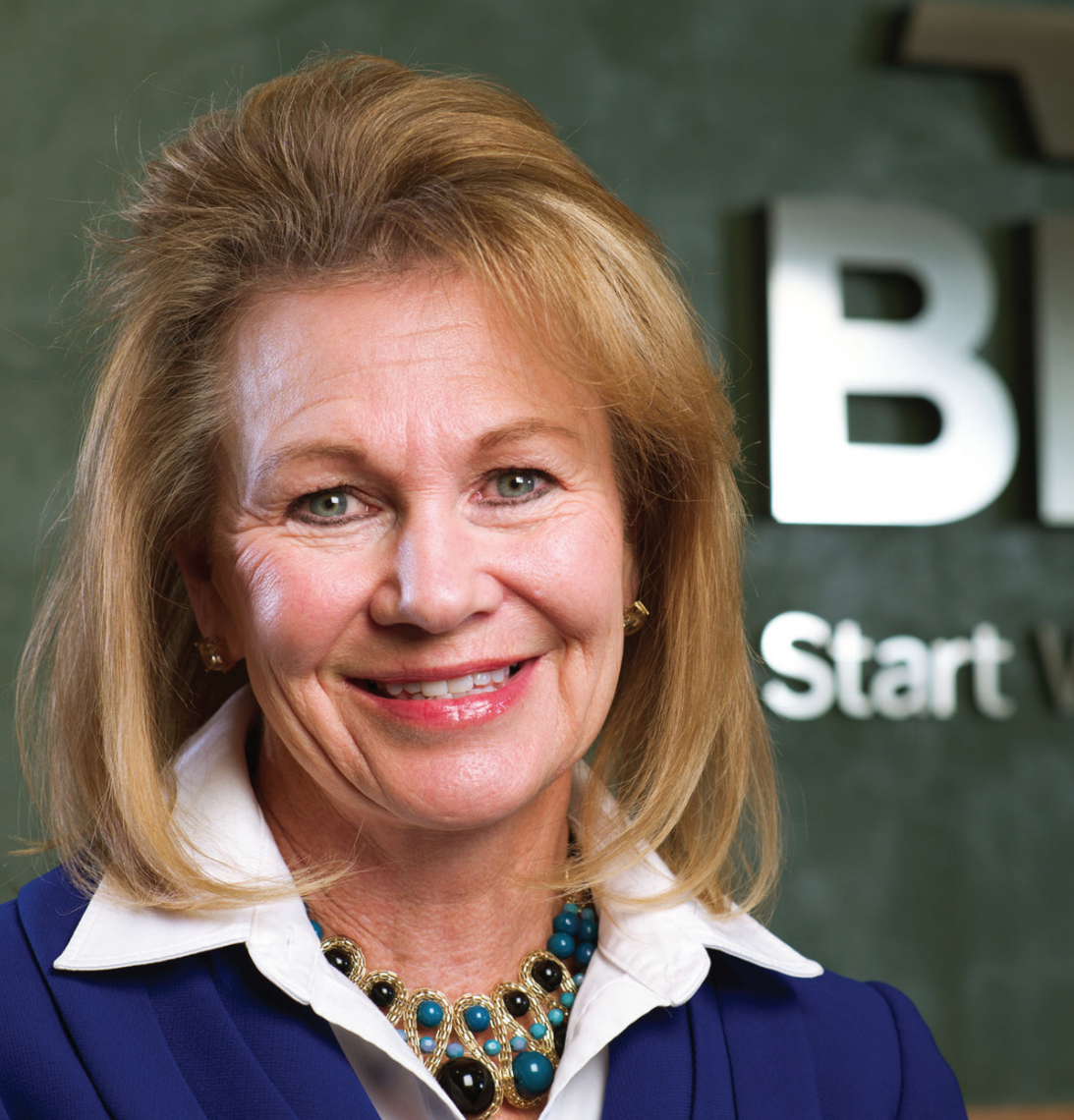

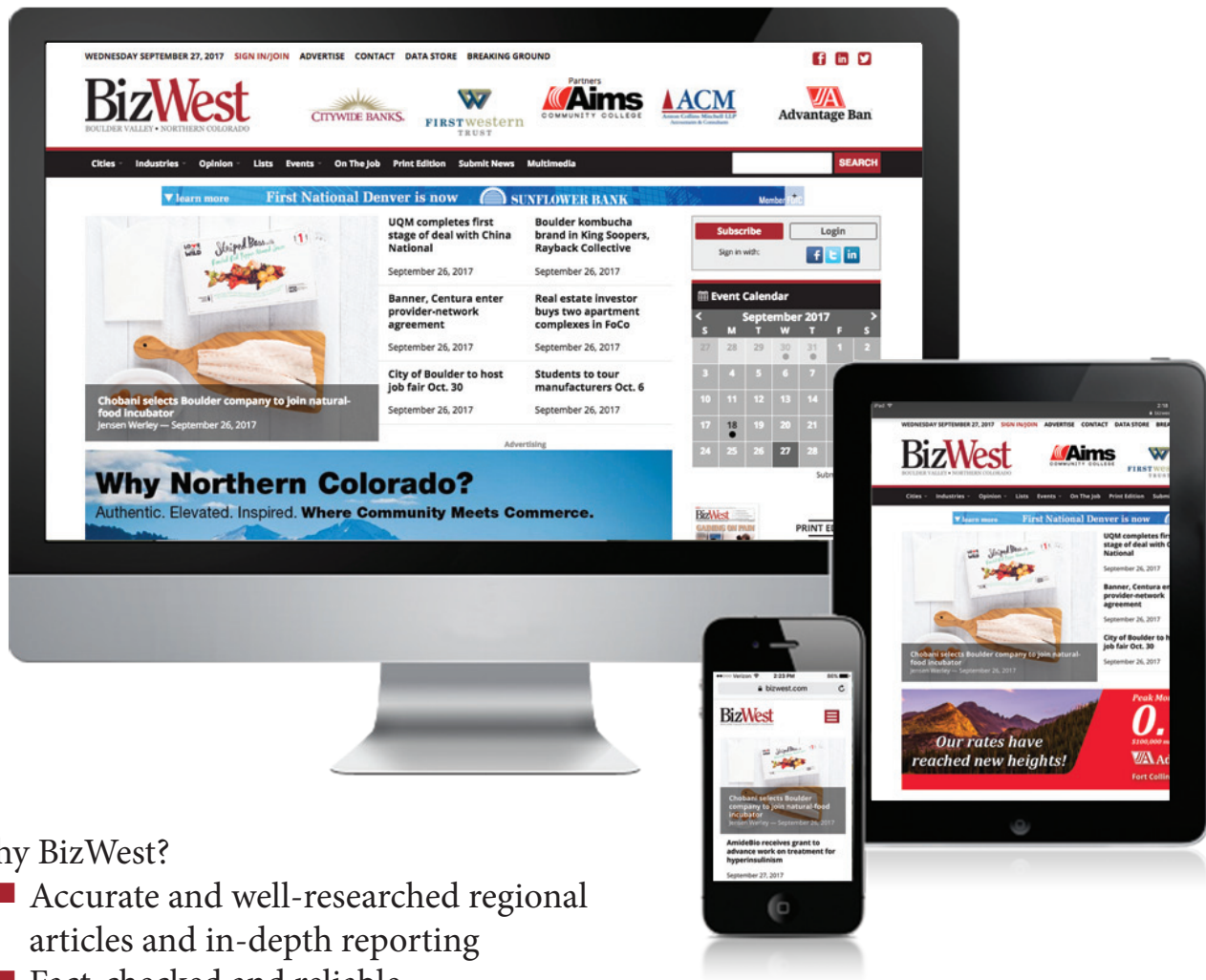
