



Association plans survey to put real numbers on nonprofit economic impact

he economic impact of the nonprofit sector on Colorado economy's is huge. Multibillion-dollar huge.

Colorado's nonprofit sector revenue in 2005, the most recent data available, is \$14.8 billion while total assets is \$31.4 billion, according to Charley Shimanski, president and CEO of the Colorado Nonprofit Association headquartered in Denver.

How individual regions and communities fare in terms of employment numbers and services rendered, however, is the great unknown. But not for long. The CNA plans to embark on a statewide survey that will look in-depth at the nonprofit sector. It will be a mammoth undertaking, which is why a yet-to-be-named firm that specializes in such data collection will be commissioned. Results should be available this time next year.

In the meantime, Shimanski noted that Colorado has 18,300 nonprofit organizations that file IRS Form 990, which is used to calculate organizational numbers. Of those, 8,000 are what many would consider traditional nonprofits with staffs and budgets greater than \$25,000. The remainder, he said, are usually run out of someone's home office, such as a youth athletic organization. Fifty-nine percent of all Colorado nonprofits are related to health and human services and education.

The nonprofit sector, Shimanski said, represents only 5 percent of the state economy compared to the national average of 7.8 percent. Colorado ranks 19th among all 50 states in the number of nonprofits.

"That we have more (than many other states) is not a surprise. With our low tax

base, our government is less able to provide health and human services than other governments," he explained.

Yet when it comes to actual charitable giving, Colorado ranks 42nd. In fact, according to Shimanski, Colorado has lagged other states for a decade. "We, on the average, earn 7 percent more than the average U.S. household, but in terms of charitable contributions, we give 8 percent less," he pointed out.

If Coloradans gave at the national average, nonprofits would realize \$477 million additional dollars in their coffers, he added.

"Everybody is surprised by the data," Shimanski said. "Everyone thinks Colorado is progressive."

Drop in the bucket

It's easy to see why Coloradans see themselves as generous when headlines boast of multimillion-dollar campaigns by such organizations as United Way, among others. But it's just a drop in the bucket.

"We're by no means 100 percent of any organization's budget," said Jeannine Truswell, executive director of United Way of Weld County, explaining her organization's role in funding local nonprofits. "We're 25 percent or less. I can only imagine what others are doing. Envision and North Range Behavioral Health are both multimillion-dollar organizations and have a huge impact on human need in Weld County. Just as important are Meals on Wheels and Suicide Education and Support Services."

Weld County United Way's 2006 campaign brought in \$4 million between local donations and grants.

Truswell said an important aspect of nonprofits that should not be overlooked is the social capital they bring to an area. People who volunteer tend to be happier and healthier, she explained.

She also noted that those working in nonprofits have wondered aloud what would happen if nonprofits went away: "When you think of the value of all those people volunteering and what the cost would be if you paid for that ..."

And Gordon Thibedeau, president and CEO of the United Way of Larimer County, said, "All of those dollars we get are spent here in Larimer County, be it salaries to employees or payments for services. We don't take any of those dollars and save them. They're all spent."

Larimer County is looking at a successful \$5 million campaign for 2006 with another \$1.5 million through grants and other initiatives. Thibedeau said this represents a 10 percent increase over the previous campaign.

Important on many levels

Nonprofits, he said, are "incredibly important on several different levels. They really do comprise the fabric of social services in the community. As we see the ebb and flow of government funding at all levels for social services, the nonprofits make up the difference.

Top ten tips for researching nonprofits

Before you open your checkbook or volunteer your time, GuideStar, an organization that connects people with nonprofit information, recommends:

1. Clarify your values. What is most important to you? Where do you want your money to go?

2. Identify your preferences. Do you want to give to a large or small charity? An old one or new one? One that does work locally, nationally, internationally? Religious or secular?

3. Search the GuideStar database at www.guidestar.com to find charities that meet your criteria.

4. Focus on the mission. Find nonprofits that fit your values and preferences; eliminate the ones that don't.

5. Verify a charity's legitimacy. All nonprofits listed on GuideStar are either registered with the Internal Revenue Service or have provided GuideStar with proof of their status as legitimate nonprofits according to IRS guidelines. If the charity is not in the database, ask to see its letter of determination. If it is faith-based, ask to see its official listing in a directory for its denomination.

6. Get the cold hard facts. A reputable organization will define its mission and programs clearly; have measurable goals; use concrete criteria to describe its achievements.

7. Ask to see the organization's most recent financial statements and current list of governing board members.

8. Compare apples to apples. The type of work a charity does can affect its operating costs dramatically.

9. Avoid charities that won't share information or use high-pressure tactics to get your donation.

10. Trust your instincts. If in doubt, find another organization to take your donation.

"What really happens is people donate and receive a break on their taxes," he continued. "That's fewer dollars the government receives in taxes, but that's OK because they don't pay for these nonprofit services. Some people say nonprofits provide these services more effectively than the government would."

Northern Colorado's newest economist, Martin Shields, said that regardless of what the economic numbers ultimately turn out to look like, the real impact of nonprofits is the difference they make in helping individuals and families.

And, he continued, the sector is an important one because it creates jobs, just like any other sector. It's also a growing sector.

"One thing we don't want to lose sight of is the real impact of the work they're doing, whether it's creating an arts community, helping elderly or taking care of low-income folks. There is a lot of value beyond jobs and dollars. It has an incredible impact on the quality of life on this region," Shields said.

Companies give back to local communities

Mutually beneficial relationships help entire region grow

ong before the words "corporate" and "largesse" joined together to prove that giant conglomerates do so have hearts, the local businesses of Northern Colorado practiced the kind of giving that /keeps the hearts of communities pumping.

"The businesses in Greeley take pride in supporting community events," said Rhonda Welch, festival coordinator for the city of Greeley. "They do it because they live here and understand that their giving contributes to the quality of life. We know we can always depend on Sears Real Estate, New Frontier Bank, Union Colony Bank and Ehrlich Motors to support us with money donations. Local companies like All-American Rent to Own have also been reliable sponsors for events like Cinco de Mayo."

She added, "We have a large Hispanic community, and there are a lot of businesses that want to say to that market, 'Hello, we're here.'"

Susan Herlihy, public relations coordinator for Lincoln Center in Fort Collins, said that for small business, giving not only benefits the community, but also allows the donors to grow and prosper so that they can continue to give back.

"This mutually beneficial relationship can actually become quite cyclical," she said. "As small businesses give to cultural institutions they help us reach more people. And as more people are exposed to those businesses through their community giving, they can continue to increase their customer base. It really can be a win-win relationship."

She noted that relationships with some companies have become well-established parts of the season. CooperSmith's Pub & Brewing sponsors the Lincoln Center Classical Music Series and Dance Series while Aggie Travel supports the Adventure Film Series. It also provides the opportunity for Aggie Travel to interact with an audience that has an expressed interest in travel and adventure."

Improving the bottom line

According to data from the 1999 Cone/Roper Cause Trends Report, 76% of consumers indicate they would switch brands or retailers to one associated with a good cause, when price and quality are equal, and 87% of employees at companies with philanthropic programs feel a stronger sense of loyalty to their employer.

A strong giving program can give a company a competitive advantage in attracting and retaining employees; provide leadership and development opportunities for employees; expose senior staff to new ideas, points of view and important social movements, and improve internal communication and common purpose.

While those in charge of city-sponsored cultural programs work diligently to develop that spiral effect Herlihy described, smaller nonprofits depend on support project by project. Independent businesses regularly get tapped for small donations that do not require an elaborate application process or much advance notice.

"We go broad rather than deep with our donations," said Carey Hewitt, owner of The Cupboard in downtown Fort Collins. "We don't like to say no to anyone, and so we give a \$25 gift certificate here, and another one there. We used to give merchandise, but then the city said we had to pay sales tax, so we quit."

Jeremy Reese, sales tax manager for the City of Fort Collins, explained that when a restaurant or a business donates a meal or a piece of merchandise, the donor is required to pay a "use tax" to the city.

"The use tax is a complement to the sales tax," Reese said. "When a piece of merchandise is donated and taken out of stock, the city misses the sales tax revenue, and so a use tax of 3 percent replaces a sales tax for the same amount."

Involving suppliers in good works

Rob Curci, owner of Spotlight Music in Fort Collins, shares the Cupboard's "Don't say no" attitude. He, too, uses gift certificates for small donations.

"A couple of times a year, our customers will come in and ask for a donation to support a benefit for a good cause," he said. "Then one time a year, we do a big music event in the parking lot that is fun for music lovers and good for the Food Bank [for Larimer County]."

Curci reported that in 2006, Spotlight Music collected and donated 9,000 cans of food by enlisting his suppliers in the cause — and allowing them to promote their products at the same time — with a raffle.

"Every raffle ticket 'costs' two cans of food. Last year, guitar manufacturers donated 12 top-of-the-line guitars, not cheap ones, some \$2,000 guitars," he said. "We want to get more this year and double the donation to the food bank."

The Spotlight-sponsored event is a good example of how giving in a comparatively small way tends to grow. For one day, the store's South College Avenue parking lot becomes a venue for five diverse local bands — last year's lineup included a Christian biker band, a little girl who plays a mean blues guitar and the rock group Piggies playing for a big and enthusiastic crowd, big enough to catch the attention of the Gibson guitar rep.

So this year, on May 5, Gibson will be there with its sound trailer. Anyone can test-strum the best Gibson has to offer and for a brief, shining moment channel Eric Clapton, BB King or even Les Paul himself. And other companies are jumping on the band wagon.

HOW TO GIVE WISELY

Businesses large and small regularly receive requests to support good causes, with cash or in-kind donations. And with 1.6 million nonprofits raising money nationwide – an increase of 60 percent over the last decade – it takes some conscious effort and planning to make sure your company's contribution goes where you want it to make a difference.

Whether your aim is to give back to the local community that has supported your business, or to provide an avenue for your employees to help express your shared corporate values, there are four key ingredients to successful corporate philanthropy.

1. Encourage employee participation. A survey conducted by the Minnesota Keystone Program showed 89% of corporate givers involve their employees in the company's charitable giving decisions.

2. Manage the process. Have a rationale for what you are doing, develop guidelines and objectives, budget your giving and stay focused.

3. Keep top management involved. The single most important ingredient for starting a corporate giving program is a strong value and support for corporate giving from top management.

4. Talk to your accountant. At tax time, you'll need to know if you have been doing well by doing good.

Do things the right way

While independent local businesses remain a reliable source of broad, relatively "hoop-free" support for local causes, larger chains make it a point to be present in the community as well.

In addition to awarding cash grants to charity, companies often offer to match their employees' gifts of cash and volunteer time to nonprofit organizations. Many companies assist and encourage their employees to give by organizing workplace giving programs and by facilitating payroll deductions for employees' charitable gifts. Companies sometimes match gifts that their employees make through workplace giving programs.

Some companies also organize employee workplace volunteer efforts, such as answering phones for public television pledge drives; offer their services to charities on a free "pro bono" basis, as in "phone-a-lawyer" nights, or donate "in-kind" gifts of their products.

The readiness to respond to a donation request was of particular interest to Kate Browne, an economic anthropologist who has just edited a book, "Economics and Morality."

"For the last 20 years or so, a new social movement called Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), has been slowly emerging in business," she said. "The public has come to expect businesses to follow standards that promote the well-being of employees and the community. As a result, even large corporations are finding it increasingly profitable to do things the right way."

What has been a longtime habit of Northern Colorado businesses, whose owners tend to give first and think about target markets second, appears to have made its way into a different kind of supply and demand equation: consumers demand certain standards of corporate behavior and corporations supply it.

Good for community nonprofits and good for business, too.

Of those volunteers, each spent a median of 52 hours on volunteer activities. Most volunteers were involved with either one or two organizations — 68.5 and 19.8 percent, respectively.

Local figures register some pretty hefty volunteer activity. For example, the Fort Collins Library has logged 700 volunteers putting in 15,553 hours for 2005 (2006 figures are currently being compiled), according to Barbara Crandall, special services coordinator. She estimated that to be equal to 7.5 full-time employees.

The Fort Collins Senior Center had 530 volunteers who put in 26,804 recorded hours in 2006. That figure is up from the 483 volunteers who provided 25,569 recorded hours in 2005, reported Pat Moore, recreation coordinator.

Volunteers vital


Nonprofit agencies rely heavily on volunteers to carry out their work. Neighbor to Neighbor puts a dollar amount on their volunteer work, reporting a value of \$81,432 in 2005 for the 4,640 hours given and \$57,037 in 2006 for 3,250 hours. No small change.

The benefits are very straightforward from the perspective of those who use volunteers but what about for those who give their time so freely? The volunteers profiled here list a variety of reasons that include a sense of duty, personal contentment, a way to meet people, and just plain passion.

Those who volunteer and have reaped the two-way benefits urge others to become involved, even in some small way. "I think everybody, no matter who you are or what your challenges are, should volunteer," Julie Tynan said. "It doesn't have to be a big time commitment. You can start small, maybe even once a month. Anything you can do is helpful."

There's so much to be gained, Ray Kepler, owner of Ray Kepler Plant Care in Fort Collins, explained. "The more you give, the more you get back and the quality of people you meet will enrich your life tenfold."

A volunteer with the Noontime Kiwanis and the Family Center, Kepler added that it's all personally related. "Your success is my success and the better the community, the better we all are."





We had our own spread but we didn't have running water or electricity. If someone butchered a steer they would divide it up among all the families. If someone came over, my mom would give them something. She always gave to others no matter how little we had." Her mom was a major influence on her sense of giving. "There were 13 of us and then my mom took in my two cousins after their parents passed away. She would make up these little sacks for all of us for Christmas with candy and nuts and an apple or an orange and put our names on them and that's what we got for Christmas. She never asked for anything. She always gave. When we left the reservation and came here in 1961, it was the same. It was just natural to give and you never ask for anything in return."

Up next: More of the same, she said, but she added that she already has other charities lined up if something happens. "I'm always looking ahead and there is just so much to do."

Funds follow passion, but require oversight

Nonprofit boards need members with diverse skills to guide efforts

There's nothing more vital to the success of a nonprofit organization than the people sitting as its board of directors. Without a diversely skilled group of individuals who not only care about the organization's cause, but also understand the responsibility that comes with governing its funds, a nonprofit simply can't go far.

Board members are the face of an organization. They give it credibility, and they fuel the passion of its supporters. Thus, recruiting a nonprofit board should be a careful and deliberate process.

And though that process can vary dramatically among organizations, nonprofits around Colorado are eager to promote and share the skills they've found are essential to a board's effectiveness.

Metro Volunteers in Denver teaches other nonprofits about board management and recruitment. "What we usually tell folks when we do board trainings, the basic skills every board needs are good financial management, marketing and public relations, someone with fund-raising experience, somebody who understands good board governance, and then it's according to your particular organization," explained Metro Volunteers Executive Director Jackie Norris. "I think it really varies, depending on what your goals are. Take a look at what you've got and see what the gaps are. It may be obvious stuff like strategic management, or it may be specific to your industry."

The most critical skills, she added, are finance, fund raising and strategic planning. Beyond that, it's extremely valuable to get somebody with nonprofit board experience who can help grow the board. "A lot of small nonprofits that are just starting their board development for the first time think, 'I just need to get five people and then figure out what I need,' instead of figuring out, 'What are the skills and assets I need and how do I go about finding those people?'"

Norris knows there's a significant demand for nonprofit board members. Her organization has a board bank program in the metro area that recruits, trains and places individuals on nonprofit boards. At any given time, there are 100 to 130 nonprofits seeking board members through Metro Volunteers.

"There's a significant need for board members who understand what the job is and will commit to doing it and be active and engaged in doing it," she said.

It's critical, when interviewing prospective board members, to be clear about the time commitment and realistic about what people can give as volunteers.

Fiduciary responsibility

Likewise, Candace Mayo, executive director of the Fort Collins Habitat for Humanity, said it's essential that people understand the fiduciary responsibility they take on as board members. At each board meeting, a treasurer presents the profits and expenditures for each month, and it's up to the board members to ask the right questions.

"It's your responsibility to oversee the whole organization," she said. "The board's purpose is to oversee the staff, and to make sure the staff is spending the money correctly."

Mayo said the skill set needed on a nonprofit board really depends on the organization. Habitat for Humanity builds houses. Thus, its board members include a banker who can help secure financing, a developer, a real estate professional, and — in the near future — a builder.

Of course, Mayo explained, every board needs a financial expert, someone like an accountant who can give the bookkeeping a higher "There's a significant need for board members who understand what the job is and will commit to doing it and be active and engaged in doing it."

level of scrutiny. A retired auditor who sits on the Habitat board has been an amazing asset as far as setting up the organization's books and reporting on financials each month, Mayo said.

Habitat even goes so far as to have a grid by which to judge its board makeup. It calls for each board to include a pastor, because it is a Christian-based organization, the appropriate financial experts, and for the board members to reflect the diversity of the area population.

In addition to oversight, the board's other major responsibility is to help raise money, which is why it is so important to have people who are passionate. "I would not even take somebody on a board who is not passionate about what you're trying to do," she said. "If they don't have passion why would they want to serve?"

Habitat looks for something it calls "habititis" - because the passion is infectious. "We want our board members to care about what we do."

Mayo said her organization has never had difficulty finding board members with the right skills. "There's so much wealth of people in Fort Collins who want to serve in that capacity," she said.

Variety key to success

Ruth Lytle-Barnaby, executive director for the Poudre Valley Hospital Foundation, said variety is key to a successful board. The worst thing a nonprofit can do is create a board of all the same types of people. Her foundation looks to attract attorneys, small business owners, bankers, people who have worked for large corporations, financial experts, doctors, representatives of the health department, people with experience in the nonprofit world, and — because a major role of the board is fund-raising — individuals with connections to the wealthy, as well as well-known, well-respected business people.

But mostly, like Habitat for Humanity, the PVH Foundation looks for people who care about the cause, especially past donors or people who have spoken about or been affected by the issues at stake.

"I think the passion for the cause is the most important because money will follow that," Lytle-Barnaby said.

When you really

need professional help

How, when to hire full-time fund-raiser for your nonprofit our nonprofit needs to raise \$3 million in the next six months. Hiring a full-time fund-raiser might be just the ticket. But what does a fund-raiser do and what should you look for on a resume?

Setting the stage

Well, first things first. You might have to change your expectations or your timeline. It might not be that easy to raise millions in a matter of months.

Often, nonprofits start out with board members and executive directors doing the fund raising.

"Lots of times it falls on the feet of the executive director," said Art Bavoso, principal and owner of Third Sector Enterprises Inc. of Fort Collins. Bavoso has 38 years of nonprofit experience both inside organizations and outside, as a consultant who coaches staff and board members.

At first, the executive director might spend a percentage of her time on fund raising. Later, the organization might hire a part-time grant writer or development person, Bavoso said. A full-time fund-raiser would come after that and the effort would expand.

"The executive director is the chief fund-raiser, but they can't do it alone," cautioned Bavoso. Board members must realize that one of their responsibilities is to raise money and do the networking to bring in other donors, he said.

Once it's time to bring on a fund-raiser, then the board should agree on what criteria and skills they're looking for, said Allison Robin, coordinator for corporate and alumni relations for Colorado State University and a fund-raising instructor for the city of Fort Collins Recreation Department. A board may hire a fund-raiser to change things, but not realize they're only comfortable with the status quo.

"Conflict can be a huge problem," Robin said, adding fund-raisers sometimes quit when they can't resolve issues with the board.

Beth Flowers, outgoing station manager of KRFC grassroots community radio in Fort Collins, elaborated. "Be clear if you want marketing or fundraising," she said. People with marketing experience will know more about advertising and putting on events, while fundraisers will know more about sales and making "the ask." Development people will do some of both, she said.

What a fund-raiser does

A fundraiser handles a variety of tasks that are heavily centered on communications. To understand the job better, it helps to know about the donor pyramid.

At the base of the donor pyramid is a wide pool of members or friends of the nonprofit, explained Virgil Scott, president and CEO of the University of Northern Colorado Foundation. At the next level, a donor would make an annual gift. As the donor "matures," he gives more. So, at the third level, he would make a major gift. Ultimate gifts and estate planning comprise the top level.

It's also important to recognize that some nonprofits are at the bottom of the pyramid, said Camy Cooney, development director for Hospice of Larimer County and a 19-year veteran of fund raising in this area. Those groups are building their base of support and spending lots of time on special events. Eventually, those groups will want to graduate to higher levels of fund raising.

At the base level, a fund-raiser would be making presentations to small and large groups, said Gordon Thibedeau, president and CEO of United Way of Larimer County. He would contact companies to arrange events, such as a cook-off, skit or silent auction. He would also work with the company to collect pledges.

For major gifts, a fund-raiser would make appointments and meet one-on-one with donors. She would organize a prospecting event, such as a cocktail party, to begin to find new donors, Thibedeau said. Fund raisers also help design campaign materials and posters, he said.

Fund-raisers must like people and engage them with the nonprofit, Scott said. By involving them on advisory councils or as volunteers, "They see and experience the (organization's) need for themselves," he said.

Delegating and inspiring volunteers to do more is worth its weight in gold, agreed Flowers.

"You cannot possibly do the job alone," she said. "People who like to work with volunteers reveal that pretty quickly in an interview."

Another thing fund-raisers must do is listen. Donors are becoming more results-oriented, Scott said.

"We're matchmakers," he said. "We align the needs of our institution to the interests of our donors."

Major donors not only have the ability to give, but they also feel connected to and have developed an interest in the nonprofit, said "The executive director is the chief fund-raiser, but they can't do it alone."

"The essence of fund raising is creating relationships," he said. That's why nonprofit fund-raisers typically are paid a salary. A commission sends the wrong message to donors and can put pressure on the relationship, he added.

Ideally, that relationship grows even after the gift, said Cooney. Keeping donors informed about progress, writing letters and inviting them to events are a few of the ways that fund-raisers provide "donor stewardship."

What to look for

When it's time to review resumes, a four-year degree is a must, according to Cooney. Some places prefer a master's degree, but graduate programs in philanthropy are rare, she said. Instead, different certificate programs are offered, such as the certified fund-raising executive or special events and meetings management.

Having some years of hands-on experience of making "the ask" and leading volunteers is another thing to look for, Robin said. Letters of recommendation can tell whether a fund-raiser has surpassed expectations, she said.

The most important quality is the attitude, Thibedeau said.

"You have to believe in what we're doing. It comes through really quickly if you're just doing a job," he said. "It's a hard job. You have to be constantly up. You can't be cranky."

A thick skin is also required because prospective donors will say no sometimes, he said.

Being a self-starter is important, too, Scott said. "It's very competitive. As government funding ... goes down, the need for private dollars continues to go up," he said.

The fund-raiser will have a close relationship with the executive director, so be sure they can work together, Flowers said. If someone is smart and ambitious, she said, then he can be trained.

"What is really important is the person you hire really fits the team," she said.

In the end, though, the challenges of hiring a fund-raiser and being one are worth it." Literally thousands of people's lives will be impacted because of what you did," Thibedeau said. "That's really rewarding."



Glossary of fund-raising terms

Advised or designated fund – A fund held by a community foundation where the donor may recommend eligible charitable recipients for grants.

Affiliate fund – Local fund affiliated with a foundation.

Agency endowment – A fund established within a community foundation or other public foundation by a nonprofit organization.

Anniversary or birthday campaign – A fundraising campaign centered around an anniversary date of an institution on the premise that the occasion will stimulate giving.

Area of interest fund – A fund that allows donors to direct funding to a particular cause or specific geographical area.

Bequest or charitable deferred gift – A donation made to a charity named as beneficiary under a will or trust.

Cause or cause-related marketing – A partnership between a for-profit company and a nonprofit organization that increases the company's sales while raising money and visibility for the cause.

Challenge, condition or matching gift or grant – A grant that is paid only if the nonprofit is able to raise additional funds from other sources.

Charitable class – The group of people that may legally receive assistance from a charitable organization. A charitable class must be large or indefinite enough that providing aid to members of the class benefits the community as a whole.

Charitable deduction – The portion of a gift to a qualified charity that is deductible from an individual's or corporation's federal income tax, individual's gift tax or individual's estate tax.

Charitable gift annuity – A contract under which a charity, in return for a transfer of cash, marketable securities or other assets, agrees to pay a fixed amount of money to an individuals during his or her lifetime.

Charitable lead trust – A trust that provides an income stream to a charity for a specified period of time. At the end of that period, trust assets are distributed to noncharitable beneficiaries such as children or grandchildren.

Charitable remainder trust – An arrangement in which property or money is donated to a charity, but the donor continues to use the property and/or receive income from it while living.

Community or public foundation - A

nonprofit, publicly supported, nonsectarian philanthropic institution with a goal of building permanent funds established by separate donors for the broad-based charitable benefit of the residents of a defined geographic area.

Community fund – An organized community program that makes appeals to the public for funds to be used for the ongoing operational support of local agencies.

Corporate citizenship – Business giving, including business relationships and partnerships with nonprofit organizations.

Corporate foundation – A private foundation that receives its funding from the for-profit company whose name it bears but is legally an independent entity.

Corporate giving program – A grantmaking program established and administered within a for-profit corporation.

Corporate volunteer council – A network that businesses join to address community needs through workplace volunteering.

Corporate, employee or workplace volunteer program – A company-managed program that coordinates company staff with nonprofits looking for volunteers.

Demonstration grant – A grant made to establish an innovative project or program that will serve as a model. If successful it may be replicated by others.

Designated endowment – Established by an individual, family or business to benefit one or more charities.

Employee matching gift or grant – A program whereby an employee's contribution to a charitable organization is matched by a similar contribution from the employer.

Endowed fund – A fund created by gifts that establish its principal, which then makes grants from the income generated by that principal. An endowed fund exists in perpetuity and continues to carry out the donor's wishes after death.

Endowment – A permanently restricted fund, the principal of which is protected and the income from which may be spent.

Evaluation or pilot grant – A grant that supports the external evaluation of a project. With a successful project, the evaluation grant works as a leveraging tool, enabling the recipient to seek further funding.

Federated funder – A joint fundraising effort administered by a nonprofit "umbrella" organization that in turn

distributes funds to nonprofit agencies. Examples include United Way, United Jewish Appeal and United Negro College Fund.

Flow-through funds – Contributions to a foundation that are used primarily for direct grant making rather than for endowing the foundation.

Foundation – A public or private nonprofit corporation or trust that makes grants to organizations, institutions or individuals for scientific, educational, cultural, religious or other charitable purposes.

In-kind donation or gift – A gift of goods or services rather than cash or property.

Initiative-based grant making – A grants program based on applicants responding to a request for proposals.

Irrevocable trust – A gift in trust that cannot be rescinded.

Limited-purpose foundation – A foundation that restricts its giving to one or very few areas of interest, such as higher education or medical care.

Memorial or named fund - A fund estab-

lished by, or named for, an individual, family, corporation or other group to carry out the charitable interests of the donor or honoree.

Nonendowed fund – In contrast to endowed funds that can only make grants from interest income, a nonendowed fund's principal can be used for grants.

Nonprofit – An organization established for activities other than profit making. Some non profits are exempt from federal income taxation, but they may be taxed on income from unrelated businesses they conduct.

Common nonprofits include: **501 c (12)** – A public charity or private foundation. Gifts to a 501 c (3) are tax-deductible.

501 c (12) – A social welfare or employees' association whoswe net earnings are used solely for charitable, educational or recreational purposes.

501 c (6) – A trade association or business leagues not organized for profit or private benefit.

501 c (7) – A social club organized for pleasure and recreation.

501 c (8) – A fraternal beneficiary society, order or association operating under the lodge system that provides ben-

Operating foundation – A private foundation that uses the bulk of its income to provide charitable services or to run charitable programs of its own.

Partnership funding – A grant program where "partners" - often government and philanthropic sources - have input into the project.

Pass-through foundation - A foundation that receives funds and makes distributions with little or no principal remaining with the foundation.

Perpetual trust – A trust established

with the intent to keep the principal invested in perpetuity and distribute the income from investments to one or more charities.

Program or project grants – Funds to support specific projects or programs as opposed to general support grants.

Program related investment – A loan (not a grant) made by a foundation to another organization for a project related to the foundation's interests.

Restricted endowment income – Income from a permanent fund used for a specified purpose.

Restricted fund, gift or grant – Money given with donors' specifications on how a nonprofit may use it.

Revocable trust – A trust that can be recalled by its creator. Revocable trusts become irrevocable when their creators die and can become irrevocable sooner if the creators give up the power to revoke.

Social enterprise – A nonprofit venture that combines the passion of a social mission with the innovation and determination commonly associated with for-profit businesses.

Social entrepreneur – An individual who engages in social enterprise, drawing upon the best thinking in both the business and nonprofit worlds.

Social venture funds – Charitable funds in which donors invest their expertise as well as their money, providing support and requiring accountability of nonprofit organizations just as venture capitalists do in business enterprises.

Socially responsible investing – The practice of aligning a foundation's investment policies with its mission. This may include refraining from investing in corporations with products or policies inconsistent with the foundation's values.

Unrestricted fund – A fund that is not specifically designated for a particular use by the donor, or for which restrictions have expired or been removed.

Gossary of terms for various funds

Donor Advised

These funds are established by donors who wish to actively participate in the grant-making process. Individuals, corporations, families, or committees who establish a fund advise the Foundaton staff with respect to grantmaking that benefits charitable projects or organizations of their choice. Donor advised funds make it easy to give to multiple nonprofit agencies in varing amounts at numerous times throughout the year. Please note that our Board of Directors is legally responsible for approving all grants.

Agency

These funds are established by a nonprofit agency for the benefit of that agency: all gifts come from the agency and all distributions go to the agency. Many nonprofit organizations establish these endowments with us in order to grow assets to meet both current and future needs. They look to our Board of Directors for strong investment oversight services and ask our staff to manage all of the administrative details of the endowment. This can provide a relatively constant source of annual income and help maintain their mission in perpetuity. It also frees the nonprofit to focus on what they do best in the community. Agency funds are considered an asset of the named agency and should be listed accordingly. This type of fund is carried on the Foundation's books both as an asset and as a liability.

Designated Agency

These funds ar established by the Foundation, usually to serve as a "sister fund" to an already established or simultaneously established agency fund (see above). A designated agency fund, except that gifts to the designated agency fund come from individual donors rather than the agency. Where no sister fund exists, this fund is established by the Foundation or an individual as a mechanism for receiving donations from multiple donors to benefit the agency or program.

Donor Designated

Donors who wish to support specific agencies or causes can establish a designated fund; in the alternative, a donor may choose to contribute to an existing designated fund. If the original charity ceases to exist, becomes obsolete, or is unable to perform their charitable purposes, our Board of Directors is able to redirect the funds to an organization providing similar services without the cost of expensive legal action. Although donors other than the founding donor can donate to the fund, such donors should understand that the foundation normally allows the founding donor to change designations during his or her lifetime. This type of fund is thus identified with a single donor and the Foundation defers to the wishes of that donor with respect to changes to the fund.

Field of Interest

These funds are often established to support particular interest areas, specific program initiatives, causes, or geographic areas. At the donor's request, use of the funds is restricted to a specified area of interest, but flexibility remains to meet changing situations. In other words, a field of interest fund is identical to an unrestricted fund (see above), except that with a field of interest fund the donor has specified a general area of use at the time the fund is established. The donor does not reserve an ongoing role in advising the foundation.

Scholarship

The creation of a scholarship fund is attractive to many donors; these funds an be structured to benefit students at any education level, and may be directed to a specific educational institution. A scholarship fund can also be established to honor a loved one. Some donors choose to stay involved through advisory relationships, while others name advisory committees to assist in the selection of recipients. Either way, our staff will handle the necessary paperwork and will ensure that scholarships are distributed in an equitable manner. Distributions will be exclusively for scholarships in accordance with objective criteria established for the fund. Charitable Remainder Trust

A community foundation like ours can administer charitable remainder unitrusts and annuity trusts, both of which pay lifetime income to you or other named beneficiaries. Establishing a trust is simple. Cash or property is transferred to the trust. The income beneficiaries receive annually an amount equal to a fixed percentage of the trust's fair market value (unitrust) or a fixed dollar amount (annuity trust). Upon termination of the trust, the assets are transferred to your named charitable fund to support your individual or personal charitable giving goals.

Charitable Gift Annuity

A charitable gift annuity from our community foundation allows you to receive a guaranteed income for life and an immediate income tax deduction, while at the same time, leaving a legacy to the charitable cause of your choice. Through a charitable gift annuity, you receive a fixed stream of income for life. After paying the lifetime annuity to you and your spouse, the remaining principal is transferred to your named charitable fund to accomplish your specific charitable goals. Our payments to you are based on your age; the older you are, the higher the rate. If the annuity is for you and your spouse, the calculation is based on your joint ages. If you need the income now, you can use our deferred plan and receive the income tax deduction now, but begin receiving payments when you reach a specific age. This is an excellent complement to your existing retirement plan. The tax advantages of both a current and deferred annuity are two-fold. First, you receive an immediate income tax charitable deduction when you create your annuity. This is based on your age and annuity payout rate. Second, a portion of the payments you receive may be treated either as tax-free return of principal or long-term capital gains. These tax advantages increase the net income you receive.

Unrestricted

These funds are not specifically designated for use by a particular agency, cause or area of interest. Our Board of Directors oversees the use of these funds, setting priorities for their use and determining how grants will be distributed to support the charitable needs of our community. Unrestricted funds give us the ability to respond to pressing and often changing needs in the community.
