



ven in these economic times, many companies in the region remain steadfast in their commit-

Ement to give back to the community.

For some organizations this means supporting specific community initiatives financially, organizing food drives, or purchasing corporate tables at nonprofit events. Other companies allow employees to volunteer on the company dime.

Offering paid time off or donating to nonprofits may seem counterintuitive when times are tough and teams are ultra-lean, but this type of investment still makes good business sense.

LSI in Fort Collins, McWhinney in Loveland and Connecting Point in Greeley are three organizations that strive to be stewards in the community. Each takes a different approach to giving that aligns with its corporate mission and supports organizational goals. The manner in which they offer support varies but these companies realize unique internal rewards while also having a positive impact in the world.

LSI employees have participated in two Team Build projects for Habitat for Humanity. Most recently a group of 12 employees were able to work side by side with the homeowner. "This really personalized the experience and made it easy for each of us to see the good we were doing," accord-

ing to Cindy Richards, a supervisor at LSI. "Because the team was made up of employees from across the organization we were able to meet new people and form better connections with our colleagues. It is also nice that Habitat for Humanity gives public kudos to their volunteer organizations."

Richards highly recommends this type of project both from a teambuilding as well as community service perspective.

At McWhinney in Loveland, community service is an ongoing part of doing business. Each company Associate receives two hours of paid time off per month to volunteer. Flexible scheduling allows employees to give extra time when projects really excite and interest them.



How to be a good business citizen

The Denver Office of Strategic Partnerships has compiled these steps for creating a corporate giving and volunteer program that gives your company a greater sense of purpose and supports important community causes.

- **1.** Identify corporate priorities and goals that can be met by your program. A successful corporate program reflects the culture and values of your company and brings added value to business goals.
- **2.** Determine employee interests through surveys or an advisory committee representative of all departments. Survey your employees to determine their experience and specific interests.
- **3.** Determine community needs and develop your company's program around these needs. Call 2-1-1 to find out which organizations are in need of what kind of contributions.
- **4.** Develop a program structure that facilitates and encourages participation at all levels. Your program management structure should reflect employee interests and should include an employee steering committee to determine activities.
- **5.** Develop written corporate policies to support your program. For example, release time for volunteering and monetary grants for service are powerful incentives for employee participation in projects.
- **6.** Select projects relative to company interests and community needs. For example, if you are a construction company, it would be relevant to support a nonprofit that builds houses for homeless people.
- **7.** Evaluate your program to measure its impact on employees and the local community. You can measure the impact on employees by surveying them. You can measure the impact on your reputation by tracking media coverage and awards. You can measure the impact on the community by asking for statistics on how your support helped a non-profit or initiative reach its goals.
- **8.** Publicize your company's efforts, both internally and externally, to the media, senior management, and partnering nonprofits to communicate the level of impact. You deserve to be recognized for your good works!
- **9.** Reward and recognize your employees through external and internal award programs, CEO receptions and recognition gifts.

Associate in the People Services Department. "Our McWhinney Associates get very excited about different causes and our overall focus on service unites us in meaningful and satisfying ways."

Ted Warner, CEO of Connecting Point in Greeley, believes it is important to give back to the community in which one does business. Connecting Point's leadership team targets specific opportunities, then invites employees to participate and matches employee donations. Employee participation in community service projects is always quite high.

"Our community focus gives encouragement to our employees and instills them with a greater sense of company pride," he explained. "Community involvement also provides us with opportunities to network with other businesses in the region. Working handin-glove with like-minded people opens doors and allows us to form business relationships and partnerships that otherwise may not have been possible."

How companies benefit by giving

It is important to find ways to serve that match your company's specific mission, vision, values and goals. When close alignment exists, the rewards often increase exponentially.

Consider the following benefits as you customize your approach to corporate giving:

■ Leadership and skill development

Volunteering is a great way to provide cross-training and professional development to your employees. Projects can take employees out of their comfort zones to work in challenging situations. Employees develop new skills to enhance their regular jobs. Community service can also expose employees to different leadership styles or ways of doing business.

■ Create buzz

A commitment to the community can help organizations stand out from the competition, expand their customer base and increase name or brand recognition. But beware of tooting your own horn. It is a turn-off when an organization's interest in volunteering appears to be more about promoting the company image than actually doing some good in the world. Commit to the right causes, work hard to make a difference and allow others to sing your praises.

Employee engagement

Not every company provides a product or service that inspires the heart, but all organizations can approach their work in a manner that brings out the best in people and in the world. When employees are given opportunities to volunteer, it can increase job satisfaction and

instill a greater sense of company pride. Volunteer work can also stir creative juices. Employees who donate time in the community tend to be more productive, innovative and happy.

■ Attracting and retaining Generation Y

Most of us appreciate organizations that give back, but to Generation Y this is more than a perk. The generation just starting up the career ladder longs to work for a cause bigger than themselves and they target employers that can help them fulfill that longing. A commitment to community service can help an organization attract key talent as Baby Boomers retire and the workforce continues to shrink.

■ Flexibility and work/life balance

By giving employees opportunities to volunteer during the workday, employers are essentially supporting work/life balance. Many employees appreciate flexible scheduling to volunteer even if they are not compensated for their time. A break in the normal routine and time away from the office can be rejuvenating and can add to the overall quality of life for your employees.

Despite economic signs to the contrary, this is not the time to pull back from providing community support. There are too many compelling reasons and competitive advantages to suggest that corporate giving is a worthwhile investment. Just as surely as we rely on a strong business community for our future success, nonprofits play a vital role in ensuring Northern Colorado remains a great place to live and work.

Some may call it good business. Others may call it good karma. In either case, what you give is sure to come back to your organization in many positive and powerful ways.

showcases
artwork
of clients
in need

VANS — When Jamie Breitzman took over as director of adult day services for Envision — a nonprofit serving people with developmental disabilities in Weld County — he noticed clients using coloring books. An art major himself, Breitzman didn't think crayons were age-appropriate. So, he started to research art as it related specifically to people with developmentally disabilities.

He found that in the late 1800s a director at an institution in Germany had, upon observing the work patients would produce on scraps of paper they collected, sparked a movement for nonprofessional artists, acknowledging that people can produce art without being trained professionals. In a lot of ways, Breitzman found that people outside the realm of formal art training produced the best work because they're enjoying art without overly scrutinizing how something is "supposed" to look.

The art program at Envision was soon born, with a simple objective: Breitzman would provide interested clients with acrylic paints, canvas and other materials and a space to work, then get out of their way, letting them produce what they wanted.

At first the program was just another activity to assist participants with everyday life skills. There were people, for example, who used to have difficulty focusing on any one task for more than five minutes who learned to focus on their art for an hour at a time.

In 2003, Envision hosted its first art show and found that people were interested in buying the work. Over the next several years, the program evolved into what it is today: a viable business model that is self-sustaining for the organization and creating some income for the artists.


Envision acts as an agent, promoting the artists' work and providing sales agreements. The organization's 35 percent commission — the average painting sells for between \$110 and \$130 — pays for the frames and art supplies. Clients have even begun a retail operation making cards and paper.

Budget crisis could cut services

Now Envision hopes to parlay the success of that program into an effective fundraising tool to help combat a looming budget crisis that threatens to cut services. In operation since 1964, Envision is the community center board for Weld County. That means it's the county's single point of entry for people with developmental disabilities seeking support — and its services are unique. It serves clients from birth to old age, providing everything from early intervention for children under the age of 3 to adult

day services, residential and supported living services, to more than 1,000 Weld County residents.

"Right now it's pretty desperate," Executive Director Mary Lu Walton says of the organization's funding situation. With the state budget shortfall, she expects to have to cut services while the waiting list for those same services

grows. Already, the wait list includes 351 people with few other alternatives.

"It has that mushroom or snowballing effect," Walton said. "If they haven't got a place to meet their primary needs then all of the other needs start surfacing also."

That's when people may become homeless, show up more frequently in emergency rooms, or get caught in the criminal justice system.

Internally, like nonprofits everywhere, the organization has done everything it can to stretch a dollar, expecting staff to do more with less, restructuring programs and renegotiating contracts. Envision historically has depended primarily on state and federal government funding. Walton says the organization didn't have the extra funds or the specific expertise it takes to launch fundraising campaigns in the past.

Last year, however, the board decided that had to change if the group was going to withstand the economic times and decreasing government support, and hired Brian Hughes to focus fulltime on community outreach and fundraising.

"When I came on, I joked that they were a victim of their own success," Hughes said. "They'd been around since 1964 providing a valid service to the community and nobody really knew about it, because they'd been providing preventive care in such a way that people weren't becoming a burden to the community or causing problems that eventually fall onto the shoulders of the community."

Getting the word out

His strategy is to get the word out about what Envision does in a way that gives him a lot of bang for the buck. "When you have a little bit extra, it's much easier to believe you have to spend money to make money," he said. "And now when you don't have that, you try to find ways to maximize the power of

your own dollar. I'm not looking at spending a lot of money on marketing. I'm hoping that word of mouth and our own efforts at fundraising will help get the word spread about our events and what we do."

The art show in February was an ideal way to not only showcase and sell the fruits of the art program, but raise the profile of the organization as a whole. The show, the group's largest thus far with 100 pieces, also had musicians with disabilities performing. Hughes called it a "friendraising" event.

"I do believe the first component of fundraising is friendraising," he said. "If people aren't aware of what Envision does, there's no real incentive to support it."

Thus, while this show was free, Hughes hopes to make it into an annual fundraising event in the future.

Walton says she doesn't expect donations from individuals, corporations and foundations to make up for the governmental shortfall Envision will experience, but she's hoping they can provide a cushion so that fewer people fall through the cracks.

"The population we work with are extremely vulnerable citizens, and there aren't a lot of other resources in communities for them," she says. "They deserve to have the same quality of life as the rest of us. If they are given that opportunity they certainly can reach a greater potential and they become highly productive citizens in our community too."

Nonprofits pump economic

benefits into region

Charitable gifts flow to economy in jobs,

onprofit organizations hold a special place in American society. Unlike business, they can invest in socially important activities that produce no immediate financial return. Unlike government, they can focus their support to address the needs of those overlooked by bureaucracy.

"Most nonprofit organizations deal with concerns that the private sector and the government either cannot or will not address directly and adequately," according to Robert J. Shapiro, chairman of the Washington, D.C., consulting firm Sonecon LLC and author of a 2008 study of the economic value of private and community foundations.

Private foundations generally receive most of their funding from a single source, such as one family or corporation, and primarily provide support to other charitable activities, while community foundations — also known as public charities — raise and receive funds from many sources and generate income from activities in support of the charitable mission. Churches, hospitals, medical research groups and schools are all examples of a public charitable organization; foundations acknowledged at the end of a National Public Radio show are typically private.

Whether public or private, charitable organizations are exempt from federal taxation under the section of the Internal Revenue Service tax code known as 501(c)(3). The tax code also allows individuals and corporations to deduct from their taxes gifts they make to a 501(c)(3) organization.

The past decade has seen giving to tax-exempt organizations soar. The assets of U.S. foundations, which totaled \$329.9 billion in 1997 doubled to \$669.5 billion in 2007 — equal in value to all of the fixed assets of the American agriculture, mining and utility industries combined.

According to Shapiro's research, on average, each dollar granted by private and community foundations in 2007 generated an estimated average return of \$8.58 in direct, economic benefits. So, how many foundation dollars found their way into the U.S. economy in 2007? A total of \$42.9 billion, which produced some \$367.9 billion in direct, social and economic benefits. The country's 501(c)(3)s also supported 9.2 million jobs.

Indirect benefits

Shapiro and co-author Aparna Mathur also calculated the indirect economic benefits of foundation grants — additional employment and incomes for the beneficiaries of the grants and new government revenues generated by that employment. The overall additional household income of nearly \$512 billion translated into about \$145 billion for local, state and federal coffers.

Put another way, private and community foundations are already pumping approximately the value of the federal stimulus package into the national economy, thanks almost entirely to the favorable tax treatment of donations.

However, because most of the phenomenal growth in philanthropic activities and assets was fueled by the stock market, the current recession is having the same adverse effect on foundations as it has had on corporate and individual retirement plan investments.

"2008 was a difficult year," acknowledged Ray Caraway, president of the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado. The foundation reported a 15 percent drop in total assets from \$39 million to \$33.4 million on Jan. 30, but an increase of \$500,000 in gifts from 2007 for a total of \$6.3 million.

"The vast majority of donors and agencies we serve understand that one — or even two — years is a very short time in the life span of a permanent fund that is designed to produce support for charitable causes decades into the future."

Community Foundation distributed \$3 million in 2008, so applying Shapiro's multipliers, that means that its 270 individual charitable funds and 30 agency endowments added \$25.74 million in direct economic benefit, \$35.75 million in additional household income and \$10 million in tax revenue to the Northern Colorado economy.

And it is only one philanthropic organization in the region. So even though charitable giving might seem like an easy place to balance the budget in tough times, the consequences could ripple throughout the economy, and not in a good way.

Not all nonprofits are charitable organizations

The IRS grants tax-exempt status to a wide range of organizations established for activities other than profit-making, but not all can accept tax-deductible gifts.

- 501(c)(3) A public charity or private foundation. Gifts to a 501(c)(3) are tax-deductible.
- 501(c)(4) A social welfare or employees' association whose net earnings are used solely for charitable, educational or recreational purposes.
- 501(c)(5) A labor or agricultural/horticultural organization.
- 501(c)(6) A trade association or business league not organized for profit or private benefit.
- 501(c)(7) A social club organized for pleasure and recreation.





HOW MUCH WE GAVE

Coloradans who itemized charitable contributions for 2006 gave an average of \$4,046 to charity, while all Americans with itemized charitable contributions averaged \$4,403, a differance of almost 9 percent. Coloradans in the lowest income category gave a much higher percent of their income to charity than all others – 5.1 percent for those with adjusted gross income under \$50,000.




