AMERICAN RED CROSS: COMPASSIONATE CARE AT HOME AND AROUND THE WORLD

With its network of donors, volunteers, and employees, the American Red Cross exists to prevent and relieve suffering across the U.S. and around the world.

Well known for its disaster relief work, the Red Cross responds to approximately 70,000 disasters in the U.S. every year. These range from home fires that affect a single family to hurricanes affecting tens of thousands, to earthquakes impacting millions. The Red Cross provides shelter, food, health and mental health services designed to help families and communities get back on solid ground.

It is an essential part of disaster response, says Erin Mounsey, executive director of the Northern Colorado chapter. "We directly help people in time of crisis, and we can gather and bring in resources from around the country. We work in partnership with many other agencies and organizations that

provide services to disaster victims."

The Red Cross helps in other ways as well. It is the largest single supplier of blood and blood products in the U.S. Close to four million people donate blood through the Red Cross every year, accounting for more than 40% of America's blood supply.

Internationally, the Red Cross is part of the world's largest humanitarian network with 13 million volunteers in 187 countries, reaching an average of more than 100 million people each year.

It also helps America's military families prepare for, cope with, and respond to the challenges of military service, providing an average of 150,000 military families and veterans with emergency communications, training, support to wounded warriors and veterans, and access to community resources annually.

Additionally, the Red Cross is the nation's leading provider of health and safety courses, including CPR, First Aid and Life-

guard training. More than 9 million Americans participate in these programs each year.

"It's critical we have the Red Cross because it's strong and ready to respond," Mounsey says. "Unfortunately, we keep seeing larger and larger disasters. Fortunately, we bring the expertise to do large scale recover down the street or anywhere in the world."



- Increase the participation of students at the Regional Science Fair and school level through more teacher support.







OFFERS EDUCATION AND SAFE HAVEN

Denkai Animal Sanctuary offers a service that, sadly, is greatly in need, says Floss Blackburn, president and founder. “Annually, close to four million pet animals are euthanized in shelters and tens of thousands of equine animals are slaughtered for human consumption overseas.”

Denkai specializes in the rescue of pet animals, equine and farm animals and is the largest no-kill organization for domestic animals in Northern Colorado. The demands are great, Blackburn says. “The need just in this state alone is enormous and overwhelming.”

The numbers speak for themselves. Denkai’s adoption center has found homes for more than 2,000 cats and dogs, 20 horses, and five goats and, in the low-cost and subsidized Veterinary Clinic, over 500 public animals have been spayed/neutered.

Education is a key component. “There is a lack of education especially when it comes to horses and farm animals,” Blackburn says. “These animals are seen as disposable when they’ve lost their use or when the owner can no longer afford to feed them and it turns into a cruel situation.”

Denkai’s education effort has affected over 6000 community youth. Denkai works with programs such as Turning Point of Fort Collins, Colorado and Weld County Mentors, and Friends of Greeley, Colorado. The programs teach compassion for animals, people and the environment as they encourage kids to become productive members of society through hands on activities at Denkai’s facilities.

Founded in May of 2004 by Floss Blackburn, Denkai began with 25 animals on 15 acres with minimal facilities and a few volunteers. The sanctuary now totals 646 acres and includes numerous outbuildings, sever-

al acres of pasture, and cares for more than 200 domestic animals.

“People can really make a difference and help animals that can’t speak for themselves,” Blackburn says. There are several avenues for helping, she adds. “Donations are always a key to keeping us viable. People can also volunteer on the farm or they can adopt. And,” she adds, “foster homes are always needed.”

EMPOWERING AND ENCOURAGING: THE WOMEN'S FUND OF WELD COUNTY, INC.

The Women's Fund of Weld County became a reality in 1999 when a group of community women began looking at support systems dedicated to improving the lives of women and girls in the area.

"There were lots of programs but nothing specific to women and girls," says Julie Jensen, the organization's president. "These were very strong and accomplished women and they wanted to create opportunities for others. They knew that, if you gave women and girls the skills and knowledge, they would be more likely to become self-confident, independent, and contribute to the community."

So it was that The Women's Fund was established. Its purpose was to create a permanent fund that would find, fund, and

nurture programs addressing unmet needs of women and girls in Weld County.

"We have granted to educational programs and to those who offer ways to learn new skills – not only work skills but also life skills. We want women and girls to further better their lives and be self-sufficient," Jensen says.

Funded programs typically focus on economic development and job creation, as well as providing career counselling, business planning and job seeking skills.

"What sets us apart is that we not only raise money for our grants every year, we also have an endowment that will continue long after I'm gone," she says. Because income, not principal, is distributed, contributions made to The Women's Fund will help the organization continue to grow and keep the mission alive for years to come.

The Fund needs donors and volunteers to

keep it vital, she adds. "We really need people to become involved because there's such a need. Many of us wake up every morning and realize how lucky we are. We want these women and girls to wake up and feel that same way because they are empowered and they have choices. By giving your time or donations, you are supporting that effort."

REALITIES FOR CHILDREN CREATES SAFETY NET

"We have a significant number of child abuse, domestic violence and abandonment issues in our community," says Craig Secher, Realities For Children President and Founder.

The numbers, according to the Larimer County Department of Human Services substantiate Secher's statement. In 2012, of 5,686 child abuse cases referred in Larimer County, 2,079 were assigned for assessment. Of those, 428 were substantiated and 357 were listed as inconclusive.

The need for help is evident, Secher says, and that's what his organization is about. Realities For Children addresses the unmet needs of abused and neglected children in Larimer County. The organization's unique structure ties two entities together. The first is Realities For Children Charities, a 501(c)(3) charitable organization through which all tax deductible donations and fundraising returns are directed. The second entity, Realities For Children, is a marketing orga-

nization for local businesses. Through the monthly membership fees, the businesses receive marketing and the positive consumer appeal based on their support of the needs of abused children. Fees, which are a tax deductible marketing expense, underwrite all administrative costs and implementation of services so that 100 percent of all donations to Realities For Children Charities go directly to the needs of the vulnerable youth in the community.

Secher, previously a child protection case-manager with Larimer County Child Protective services, became frustrated seeing children slip through the systems' "cracks." That inspired him to create Realities, incorporating it in 1995. Currently, Realities supports the services of 22 local youth agencies and represents over 150 business members invested in making a difference. It has won a number of awards including being named Colorado Charity of Choice for 2013 by the Colorado Family Support Council.

Realities For Children serves area youth in four ways: emergency funds distributed

through affiliate agencies, youth agency support, community awareness, and youth activities. In addition to donations, it raises funds through events including its annual "NightLights" where businesses, individuals, groups, and families can sponsor a light on the 50' Tree for \$100. The event offers warm beverages, roasted nuts, desserts and hot soup donated by Qdoba Mexican Grill. Carolers and photos with Santa top the December 1st activities.

GLOSSARY OF NONPROFIT TERMS

ADVISED OR DESIGNATED FUND

A fund held by a community foundation where the donor may recommend eligible charitable recipients for grants.

AFFILIATE FUND

Local fund affiliated with a foundation.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT

A fund established within a community foundation or other public foundation by a nonprofit organization.

ANNIVERSARY OR BIRTHDAY CAMPAIGN

A fundraising campaign centered around an anniversary date of an institution on the premise that the occasion will stimulate giving.

AREA OF INTEREST FUND

A fund that allows donors to direct funding to a particular cause or specific geographical area.

BEQUEST OR CHARITABLE DEFERRED GIFT

A donation made to a charity named as beneficiary under a will or trust.

CAUSE OR CAUSE-RELATED MARKETING

A partnership between a for-profit company and a nonprofit organization that increases the company's sales while raising money and visibility for the cause.

CHALLENGE, CONDITION OR MATCHING GIFT OR GRANT

A grant that is paid only if the nonprofit is able to raise additional funds from other sources.

CHARITABLE CLASS

The group of people that may legally receive assistance from a charitable organization. A charitable class must be large or indefinite enough that providing aid to members of the class benefits the community as a whole.

CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The portion of a gift to a qualified charity that is deductible from an individual's or corporation's federal income tax, individual's gift tax or individual's estate tax.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

A contract under which a charity, in return for a transfer of cash, marketable securities or other assets, agrees to pay a fixed amount of money to an individual during his or her lifetime.

CHARITABLE LEAD TRUST

A trust that provides an income stream to a charity for a specified period of time. At the end of that period, trust assets are distributed to noncharitable beneficiaries such as children or grandchildren.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUST

An arrangement in which property or money is donated to a charity, but the donor continues to use the property and/or receive income from it while living.

COMMUNITY OR PUBLIC FOUNDATION

A nonprofit, publicly supported, nonsectarian philanthropic institution with a goal of building permanent funds established by separate donors for the broad-based charitable benefit of the residents of a defined geographic area.

COMMUNITY FUND

An organized community program that makes appeals to the public for funds to be used for the ongoing operational support of local agencies.

CORPORATE CITIZENSHIP

Business giving, including business relationships and partnerships with nonprofit organizations.

CORPORATE FOUNDATION

A private foundation that receives its funding from the for-profit company whose name it bears but is legally an independent entity.

CORPORATE GIVING PROGRAM

A grant-making program established and administered within a for-profit corporation.

CORPORATE VOLUNTEER COUNCIL

A network that businesses join to address community needs through workplace volunteering.

CORPORATE, EMPLOYEE OR WORKPLACE VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

A company-managed program that coordinates company staff with nonprofits looking for volunteers.

DEMONSTRATION GRANT

A grant made to establish an innovative project or program that will serve as a model. If successful it may be replicated by others.

DESIGNATED ENDOWMENT

Established by an individual, family or business to benefit one or more charities.

EMPLOYEE MATCHING GIFT OR GRANT

A program whereby an employee's contribution to a charitable organization is matched by a similar contribution from the employer.

ENDOWED FUND

A fund created by gifts that establish its principal, which then makes grants from the income generated by that principal. An endowed fund exists in perpetuity and continues to carry out the donor's wishes after death.

ENDOWMENT

A permanently restricted fund, the principal of which is protected and the income from which may be spent.

EVALUATION OR PILOT GRANT

A grant that supports the external evaluation of a project. With a successful project, the evaluation grant works as a leveraging tool, enabling the recipient to seek further funding.

FEDERATED FUNDER

A joint fundraising effort administered by a nonprofit "umbrella" organization that in turn distributes funds to nonprofit agencies. Examples include United Way, United Jewish Appeal and United Negro College Fund.

FLOW-THROUGH FUNDS

Contributions to a foundation that are used primarily for direct grant making rather than for endowing the foundation.

FOUNDATION

A public or private nonprofit corporation or trust that makes grants to organizations, institutions or individuals for scientific, educational, cultural, religious or other charitable purposes.

IN-KIND DONATION OR GIFT

A gift of goods or services rather than cash or property.

INITIATIVE-BASED GRANT MAKING

A grants program based on applicants responding to a request for proposals.

IRREVOCABLE TRUST

A gift in trust that cannot be rescinded.

LIMITED-PURPOSE FOUNDATION

A foundation that restricts its giving to one or very few areas of interest, such as higher education or medical care.

MEMORIAL OR NAMED FUND

A fund established by, or named for, an individual, family, corporation or other group to carry out the charitable interests of the donor or honoree.

NONENDOWED FUND

In contrast to endowed funds that can only make grants from interest income, a nonendowed fund's principal can be used for grants.

NONPROFIT

An organization established for activities other than profit making. Some nonprofits are exempt from federal income taxation, but they may be taxed on income from unrelated businesses they conduct.

Common nonprofits include:

501 C (3)

A public charity or private foundation. Gifts to a 501 c (3) are tax-deductible.

501 C (4)

A social welfare or employees' association whose net earnings are used solely for charitable, educational or recreational purposes.

501 C (6)

A trade association or business leagues not organized for profit or private benefit.

GLOSSARY OF NONPROFIT TERMS

501 C (7)

A social club organized for pleasure and recreation.

501 C (8)

A fraternal beneficiary society, order or association operating under the lodge system that provides benefits to members and their dependents.

501 C (12)

A benevolent life insurance association, cooperative or ditch or irrigation company.

OPERATING FOUNDATION

A private foundation that uses the bulk of its income to provide charitable services or to run charitable programs of its own.

PARTNERSHIP FUNDING

A grant program where "partners" often government and philanthropic sources have input into the project.

PASS-THROUGH FOUNDATION

A foundation that receives funds and makes distributions with little or no principal remaining with the foundation.

PERPETUAL TRUST

A trust established with the intent to keep the principal invested in perpetuity and distribute the income from investments to one or more charities.

PROGRAM OR PROJECT GRANTS

Funds to support specific projects or programs as opposed to general support grants.

PROGRAM RELATED INVESTMENT

A loan (not a grant) made by a foundation to another organization for a project related to the foundation's interests.

RESTRICTED ENDOWMENT INCOME

Income from a permanent fund used for a specified purpose.

RESTRICTED FUND, GIFT OR GRANT

Money given with donors' specifications on how a nonprofit may use it.

REVOCABLE TRUST

A trust that can be recalled by its creator. Revocable trusts become irrevocable when their creators die and can become irrevocable sooner if the creators give up the power to revoke.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

A nonprofit venture that combines the passion of a social mission with the innovation and determination commonly associated with for-profit businesses.

SOCIAL ENTREPRENEUR

An individual who engages in social enterprise, drawing upon the best thinking in both the business and nonprofit worlds.

SOCIAL VENTURE FUNDS

Charitable funds in which donors invest their expertise as well as their money, providing support and requiring accountability of nonprofit organizations just as venture capitalists do in business enterprises.

SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INVESTING

The practice of aligning a foundation's investment policies with its mission. This may include refraining from investing in corporations with products or policies inconsistent with the foundation's values.

UNRESTRICTED FUND

A fund that is not specifically designated for a particular use by the donor, or for which restrictions have expired or been removed.

BUSINESS REPORT EVENTS

The time and place for business information, connections and celebration. Register and nominate at NCBR.com.
