

Ranch gears up for Sept. opening

LOVELAND — When The Ranch the Larimer County Fairgrounds and Events Complex — celebrates its grand opening the weekend of Sept. 19, events planned that Friday and Saturday in the Budweiser Events Center promise something brand new in this area.

"It will be something that this market has never seen," said Jay Hardy, manager of The Ranch.

Just exactly what those events might be Hardy won't say.

"They all fit in the general categories on the Web site." The broad range of events listed there include horse shows, rodeos, concerts, hockey, figure-skating shows, circuses, conventions, trade and consumer shows.

The "never before seen here" nature of the yet-unnamed events is a fitting way to open the facility. With its approximately 6,000-seat multipurpose events center, exhibition halls, indoor arena and livestock pavilions, The Ranch represents a new type of venue in Northern Colorado.

Unique entertainment venue

The events center, in particular, is unique in the region as an entertainment venue, said Jan Raybourn, manager of Loveland's Rialto Theater.

"There isn't really a facility, and certainly not an indoor facility, that will seat as many people as the new

Speakers bureaus offering keynote assistance L

You've got a big event coming up but no clue as to how to enlist a dynamic, knowledgeable and entertaining speaker? Meeting planners can often save time and effort and ensure a better outcome by working with a speakers bureau.

A speakers bureau knows how to find

and arrange the best speaker for the job, said Ann Clarke, a Loveland-based professional speaker and marketing consultant.

Clarke represented Loveland entrepreneur Deb Alles and her Speaking Of International Speakers Bureau at a recent networking gathering of meeting professionals at Sylvan Dale Ranch.

"It makes the job so much easier," Clarke said. Meeting planners often don't know specifically who to arrange for keynote speakers and presenters. "They have a general theme. ...

Probably the easiest thing for them is to contact a speakers bureau and sav 'I want this speaker to talk about this theme. What do you have available?"

Meeting planners may not realize that they don't pay anything extra for the service a speakers bureau provides, Clarke said. "The speakers bureau fee is basically paid by the speaker. The meet-

Small event centers benefit from slow economy

Now that the economy has gone downhill, one of the first corporate casualties has been the travel budget. But while business gatherings have been reduced in number and in the numbers of those attending, business still needs its conferences and retreats.

Smaller business-hosting venues are absorbing some of the travel business that previously would have gone to fancy hotels with big conference rooms.

"Over half of our guests are in business," said Jenna MacGregor, director of the Lake Shore Lodge and Conference Center in Estes Park. "We do get a lot of conferences."

Small event centers like the Lake Shore Lodge, Sylvan Dale Guest Ranch in Loveland, the Greeley Guest House and the Cottonwood Club in Fort Collins are getting some business clients that have formerly gone to a bigger venue. At the same time, small centers still get much of their clientele from weddings, local businesses and family reunions.

"We call people at businesses in advance because if we don't, we'll be filled up on the days they want with weddings," said Trina Anastasia, marketing director for Sylvan Dale Guest Ranch.

Regional firms are mainstay

Small event centers are picking up more business from companies, but they are primarily local companies that they deal with anyway. Companies like Hewlett-Packard Co., Con Agra, Agilent Technologies Inc. and other regional firms make up about 90 percent to 95 percent of Kelly Schroeder's business at the Cottonwood Club in Fort Collins.

Diana Goebel, manager of the Greeley Guest House, said smaller event centers like hers have to stay on their toes all the time and market themselves constantly or they may be ignored or forgotten. Small event centers do not have that instant name recognition that a chain like the Holiday Inn or Ramada has. The Greeley Guest House is fairly new — only seven years old — but it's tucked away on Greeley's west side and not close to an interstate interchange, which is part of its appeal.

"Almost all of our business is referrals and second visits," she said. Goebel said she's not seen a big change between now and the '90s — at least not yet but talking to people in the industry, it is apparent that it is on the way.

"We appeal to local companies and people who otherwise would spend a lot of time in hotels," said Schroeder. "We feel more like a home. The ambience here is not like anywhere else."

Fire comment hurt business

Schroeder is quick to acknowledge that the economy has made businesses change their conference strategies. But other factors, including Gov. Bill Owens' declaration last year that the state was "on fire," didn't help the overall level of tourism and travel in the state and the subsequent effect on small business centers.

MacGregor said Owens' remark, plus the wildfires around Pinewood Springs near Estes Park, caused a flood of cancellations at Lake Shore Lodge — so many that her transient business was cut in half during the tourist season. The overriding concern, common to businesses and people alike last year, was saving money. "I have actually seen some people shift from us to the 'Y," she said. Small event centers still get their tra-

Small event centers still get their traditional business from universities, weddings, holiday parties, small conventions and the like, but some newer industries have been creeping in.


"Three or four years ago, we had tech companies coming to us — a lot of them," said Schroeder. "They were looking to have meetings outside their own area. Now that the economy's changing, we have different industries calling us." Schroeder said that includes local schools and police and fire departments.

Perfect niche

Anastasia said small event centers like Sylvan Dale are in a perfect niche to pick up business that might have gone to a large hotel. About 90 percent of meetings are groups of fewer that 75 people, she said, and almost all small event centers have a room or rooms that can handle that number of people. Many also have hotel rooms and cook their own food.

Schroeder said she's been approached several times to turn the Cottonwood Club into a restaurant or a bed and breakfast on the basis of the quality of its food alone.

Even with the economic slowdown, small event centers still have one major advantage — being located in Colorado. And while Greeley Guest House may not be in the mountains, it has a spectacular view of them that can make visitors yearn to live — and relocate their businesses — in the state.







Budweiser Events Center," in Northern Colorado, Raybourn said.

"Definitely having a venue that size is going to, I would hope, allow some biggername entertainers to play up in this part of the country on a year-around basis.'

To date, the only events Hardy could say are officially scheduled at the new Budweiser Events Center facility are Central Hockey League games. The events center is scheduled to host 32 regular and two exhibition games between mid-October 2003 and mid-March 2004.

In addition, there are a dozen events scheduled for the summer of 2004 that are related to the first-ever Larimer County fair at The Ranch set for late July and early August 2004. The dates for those events have been secured, Hardy said, but the entertainment has not.

At this point, Hardy said, the hockey games are the only events specifically under contract for the Budweiser Events Center. "We have about 10 events or so that are sort of in a 'let's try to get them confirmed" status, Hardy said. "We're envisioning doing about 120 events a year."

With the \$61.2 million fairgrounds facilities still under construction and opening dates still eight months away, Hardy said planning and scheduling is on track. "Traditionally, events like concerts don't book more than about six months out, anyway," he noted.

Once complete, the 243-acre site will feature 13 structures including the Budweiser Events Center, two exhibition halls, an indoor arena and two livestock pavilions.

Tractor pulls to ice shows

The largest of these — and the cen-terpiece of the facility — is the events center, which will seat 4,100 to 7,400 people depending on the event it is hosting. Along with ice hockey, projected uses for the events center include rodeos, tractor pulls, concerts and ice shows.

Hardy said active promotion of The Ranch facilities has not vet begun. "Most has been word-of-mouth." He said plans are to begin advertising and promotions this spring.

It will take time to build a resume and reputation for the facility, Hardy said. Because The Ranch doesn't represent a "must play" venue like the Pepsi Center, "we have to do an extra special

job of delivering what we say and meeting the needs of promoters.'

Even without a resume, however, interest in the facility "has been just shy of overwhelming," Hardy said. "Almost without exception we've moved almost every event from the old fairgrounds over to the exhibition buildings or indoor arena."

Oct. 1 marks the date that events will begin taking place at The Ranch and stop being held at the old fairgrounds. "As of Oct. 1, everything from then on will be at the new grounds," Hardy said.

Among the events that are moving from old fairgrounds to new are horse shows, craft shows, dog and cat shows, gun shows, the Loveland Public Library's annual used-book sale and the Larimer County tax lien sale.

In addition, he said, home and garden shows, boat shows and RV shows are planned. The indoor arena is drawing teampenning competitions, rodeos such as the Little Britches Rodeo and the Colorado High School Rodeo state finals and a teamroping series called Rope the Rockies.

2001 statistics for the existing fairgrounds facility in central Loveland showed 661 events took place there, from meetings to horse shows, said Bob Holt, fairgrounds manager. The fairgrounds were used 318 out of 365 days and drew an estimated 218,146.

Up to 800,000 visitors expected

While 2002 statistics aren't available yet, Holt said the numbers are likely similar.

By comparison, Hardy expects The Ranch will draw 600,000 to 800,000 people to events currently booked in the first 12 months of the facility's operation.

Ultimately, the Budweiser Events Center will host some 125 events and other buildings at The Ranch will log close to 300 event days.

"We'll have something going on, whether it's a small 4-H function or a rodeo, I would bet, 300 days a year."

Hardy said first visits to The Ranch, hen it opens, are likely to offer a pleas ant surprise. The décor and finishes are "really very classy," he said. "It's not the Pepsi Center, but it's not far from it in terms of the finishes."

Meanwhile, folks will have to wait a bit longer to learn just what the inaugural events at The Ranch will be. Look for an announcement sometime in late March.

"We don't want to announce anything until we are 100 percent confident that all our construction timelines are in order." The Sept. 19 to 20 dates push the construction schedule by about two weeks, Hardy said.

ing planner doesn't pay anything extra for the service."

As her business, Gr8 Ideas at Work, has evolved, Clarke said she has found herself on both sides of the podium. She has organized speakers for conferences, encouraged clients to use public speaking venues to market their companies and now works as a professional speaker.

Recalling efforts to arrange speakers for events in the past, Clarke said: "I know from experience that you can waste a lot of time trying to figure out who to get."

Bureau handles details

The speakers bureau takes charge of finding the right speaker and making arrangements. If something comes up, illness or bad weather, for instance, that prevents the speaker from following through, the speakers bureau makes sure a suitable replacement is engaged, Clarke said.

Using a speakers bureau takes the work out of finding and evaluating prospective speakers. "They have a menu of speakers they are familiar with," Clarke said. "They know their presentations, their styles and how they connect with audiences."

It also ups the chances of procuring the speaking services of that great speaker the boss or a friend of a friend of a friend heard last July. Oftentimes, if a speaker isn't part of the speakers bureau stable, the bureau will still contact and negotiate with the sought-after speaker.

Considering the hundreds of people in the area who call themselves speakers, this can be a particularly helpful service, Clarke noted.

"There are a lot of people out there who want to be speakers and who call themselves speakers but they aren't at the professional level yet. They are speaking from knowledge but they don't have what we would call the platform skills yet."

In addition to commercial speakers bureaus, whose fees are paid by the speakers they represent, many educational institutions, advocacy groups and nonprofit entities maintain speakers bureaus.

Speakers can be free

A quick search of the Internet turns up speakers bureaus in a broad range of interest areas from the Business Marketing Association and the Rocky Mountain Land Use Institute to the Humane Society; the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network of Colorado; and Mothers of Preschoolers.

Speakers arranged through organizations like these often speak at no charge or for their expenses.

Shirley Medbery, who coordinates a speakers bureau at Aims Community College, said Aims offers the speaking services of employees and affiliates free of charge. "We want to be a service to the community," Medbery said. "If there are groups out there that need our expertise, we will go out and provide the service."

Aims sometimes asks organizations hosting its speakers to cover transportation costs if speakers will be required to travel a distance. Generally, Aims speakers prepare presentations of 15 to 20 minutes. Thirty minutes is the maximum, Medbery said. "If they are looking for speakers for longer conferences or seminars, then I ask them to negotiate directly with the speaker."

The Aims' speakers bureau offers orators in seven topic areas: communications, culture, education, entertainment, health and safety, history and work and technology.

Reflecting the new era of introspection that the events of Sept. 11, 2001, ushered in, the most sought-after topics tend to be on managing stress or the history of the home state, Medbery said.

Substance wanted now

Politics, current events and the economy all play a role in dictating trends among speakers, Clarke said.

Right now, as the economy tends toward uncertainty, "meeting planners and businesses all want to get more bang for their buck," Clarke said. "They are less willing to pay for entertainment. They want substance and especially since 9-11."

Where in the recent past people were more likely to want to be entertained by speakers and keynote presenters, Clarke said these days motivational and inspirational speakers are popular. Meeting planners also tend to be looking for experts who can present information in an entertaining way and those who can customize their message for specific groups.

Another trend Clarke said she's observed is organizers shortening the lead time they employ in arranging speakers. "It used to be speakers would be booked a year to at least six months in advance. Now I get calls: 'Can you speak in two weeks?'"

For Medbery, the ideal lead time for arranging speakers is one month. "We've done it within a couple of weeks ... but the more time they can give me, the better."


