

History & Roots

It was Horace Greeley, editor of the New York Tribune, who popularized the phrase, "Go West young man, go West," but it was his visionary agricultural editor, Nathan C. Meeker, who spearheaded one of the most successful colonization experiments ever attempted in the "Great American Desert."

In 1869, the transcontinental railroad was completed, and a spur from Cheyenne to Denver was built. This part of the country was now open for settlement. Meeker was inspired to go forward with his idea to plant an agricultural utopia. Where the railroad crossed the confluence of the Platte and Cache le Poudre rivers, the city of Greeley was born — an ideal location where both natural resources and transportation were abundant.

Although Horace Greeley visited

his namesake community only once, he supported Meeker in his dream to build a community based on cooperation, irrigation, temperance, religion and education. In December 1869, Greeley and Meeker issued a call for ambitious individuals with high moral standards and a bit of money to invest. The call elicited 3,000 responses, and 300 families were elected to be part of the initial joint stock venture called the Union Colony.

In the spring of 1870, the colonists arrived. Though a few got back on the train, most stayed, and by the end of 1870 there were 1,200 residents in the community. They had erected houses on town lots, established a newspaper, opened a reading room, built irrigation canals, and designed streets to be 100 feet wide and lined with beautiful trees. They built two ditches and an

expansive fence around the Colony to keep the open range cattle from destroying newly planted gardens and crops.

Residences, businesses, schools, churches, hotels, buffalo-tanning factories, flourmills, produce warehouses and opera houses sprang up between 1870 and 1885. Meeker's concern for the moral and financial well being of the community led him to require the original settlers to be solid enough to allow the community a good start. This foresight helped the city of Greeley become successful when other similar ventures failed.

Greeley and Weld County are among the fastest-growing areas in the nation and consistently rank high in national surveys of the best places to live and do business. Strongly rooted in the agricultural values of hard work and the appreciation of natural resources and holding fast to a sense of community and pride, the Greeley/Weld County area has maintained a small-town feel with the amenities of a larger community.

Horace Greeley would be proud.




September 6 Potato Day at Centennial Village







Trails — Hiking — Biking

Poudre River Trail Corridor

The Trail project is an excellent example of private and public sectors coming together to make the community a better place to live, work, and conduct business. The Poudre River Trail is a 22-mile-long trail that will ultimately extend from Island Grove Regional Park in Greeley to Hwy 392 in Windsor along the Cache La Poudre River. The Trail offers non-motorized recreational opportunities, including biking, walking, running, and rollerblading. The trail, currently is Pawnee National Grassland. And together, they're one of Colorado's best-kept secrets.

This is the place to go when you want a peaceful drive or near-solitary hike, a short drive from Greeley. Far from the hordes of visitors seeking tourist-town glitz and more familiar Rocky Mountain views, the short-grass prairie spans 193,000 acres. Opportunities for recreation, wildlife study, sightseeing, photography, and bird watching abound. The Pawnee Buttes



tower 250 feet above the prairie and are a popular destination for hikers, horseback riders and day-trippers. Due to the intermingling of private and public land, a Pawnee Grassland map is recommended for planning your trip.

The Grassland supports many bird species and has been named one of the top 10 birding areas in the United States by the Nature Conservancy. At least 296 species of birds have been identified in the Grassland. The area is known internationally as an area to see birds of prey and has good breeding populations of unique high plains species. The flat to gently rolling topography is occasionally bisected by habitats of mid-grasses, shrub lands, arroyos and cliff areas. Observations throughout these habitats have resulted in the identification of 60 mammal species and more than 500 species of plants.

Poudre Trail

For the starry eyed, don't miss "Galaxies and Grasslands", a stargazing event hosted by the Greeley Convention & Visitors Bureau in the fall. This nighttime viewing is spectacular on the Grassland because the stars and planets are unencumbered by city lights. Transportation is provided via motor coaches from Greeley. Telescopes are provided while guest lecturers enlighten stargazers about our galaxy. (970) 352-3567.




