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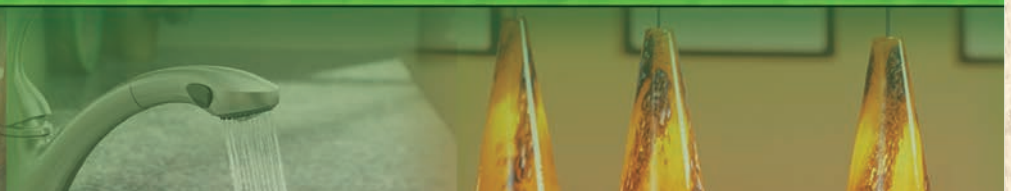

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Aspen Homes offers net-zero options

Technology package saves homeowners both money, energy

LOVELAND — Greenspire, an 800-lot subdivision wrapping around Windsor Lake east and north of Windsor's downtown, appears to be yet another in Northern Colorado's growing portfolio of new-home communities. A handful of homes — both completed and under construction — dot the landscape.

Yet one home by Aspen Homes LLC is different. Solar panels on the south-facing roof are the only telltale sign that it's a net-zero home, meaning it produces as much energy as it uses — which translates into no energy bills for the homeowner.

The net-zero model caught the eye of Michael and Ann Smith of Roanoke, Va., who will move to Windsor next summer. "We looked at a lot of homes in the area," Michael Smith said from their 3,200-square-home in Virginia. Nothing struck their fancy until they happened upon Aspen Homes' 1,400 square-foot net-zero model home.

"We've always been interested in saving energy," Smith said. "We've owned many homes in our lives, but we've never bought a new house. With Aspen Homes, and the net-zero package, even though it'll take eight to nine years to recover the initial cost, it seems to make so much more sense. Why spend too much money on energy when we can actually cut our costs?"

It takes homeowners like the Smiths to make net-zero homes work like they should, said Jammie Sabin, president of Loveland-based Aspen Homes. He said that of the 400 lots Aspen Homes will build at Greenspire, the company goal is that a third of those will be net-zero. Net-zero homes, he explained require unobstructed south-facing orientations.

Going green takes green

Being green doesn't come cheap, however. The complete net-zero package adds \$42,000 to the cost of a new home. Homeowners, however, can still have an energy-efficient home by electing options that suit them and their budgets without going for the full net-zero package. "All of our homes come with systems that will use 50 percent less energy than a typical home," Sabin said. "All of our homes exceed the na-

tional Energy Star program.”

In a net-zero home, the biggest piece — literally and expense-wise — is the photovoltaic solar panels connected to Xcel Energy’s power grid. When homeowners aren’t tapping into the energy supply, Xcel pays the homeowners for energy produced.

What else do you get with the net-zero option? Aspen Homes takes a “systems approach,” Sabin explained. It starts with an energy-efficient shell and includes a solar-powered, tankless water heater; backup heat pump; passive solar heat; whole-house fan; Low-E, dual-pane windows; 92 percent efficient furnace; R-20 insulation; and Energy Star-rated appliances.

“In the last year we’ve had a lot of people looking at what we’re doing,” said Sabin. Consumers, he said, are just now starting to ask how they can reduce their carbon footprints. And a broader range of homebuilders are taking a serious look at how to incorporate green technologies into new homes as well.

Sustainable technology

Aspen Homes was founded in 2001 by Jim Sabin, Jammie’s father. In 2002 he began implementing energy-efficiency technologies promoted by Lorax Energy Conservation LLC. The company won the 2007 Gold EnergyValue Award given by the NAHB Re-


search Center, a subsidiary of the National Association of Home Builders, and the U.S. Department of Energy.

Jammie and his brother Rob took over the reins of Aspen Homes following Jim’s fatal heart attack in 2003. They and Jon Easterbrook, building manager for Aspen Homes, are also partners in Lorax, which promotes the advancement of sustainable technologies and energy-efficient products used in Aspen Homes. The products are available to homebuilders and homeowners as well.

Products are totally vetted before Lorax adds them to the lineup of energy-saving technologies, Jammie Sabin said. The Acadia heat pump, for example, pulls heat from outside air down to 30 degrees below zero. “It’s half the cost of geothermal and the payback is much quicker.”

But what about that added upfront cost of a net-zero home? Sabin rattles off a quick mathematical formula that includes a 30-year mortgage at 6.5 percent, factors in tax deductions and utility bills and comes up with an estimate of the total cost of ownership at “almost breakeven” with a new home without the net-zero option.

“They’ll be saving money as utility bills go up,” he said. “All of the technology involved has been around for over 20 years, but we use the new and more efficient versions. It’s all very stable technology.”

Focus on triple bottom line can help control costs

Every company is looking for ways to grow the bottom line. How about expanding yours by widening the view to the “triple bottom line” — people, planet and profit?

All companies regardless of size should be doing a few green things that require fairly little cost and minimal planning. In addition to doing right by the environment and your employees, your business is likely to find cost savings, and perhaps a jump-start to investigate more involved projects with an even bigger impact on the environment and your budget.

So, let's look at the low-hanging fruit, so to speak, that anyone can pick.

1. Convert to green cleaning

When you convert to green cleaning products, you eliminate common industrial chemicals from your work environment like chlorine bleach, glycol ethers, acids, alcohol, ammonia, phosphates, dyes and perfumes. Many of these chemicals are known to aggravate health problems in humans such as asthma and allergies, can cause headaches, and have even been linked to cancer.

Cleaning up your company's indoor environmental quality can mean happier, healthier employees taking fewer sick days and generally operating at higher levels of performance. At the same time these toxic chemicals aren't finding their way into our natural environment, or into our drinking water.

Compliance Partners of Fort Collins made the switch to green cleaning products about a year and a half ago while working on Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design — LEED — certification for an existing building. The company's janitorial service, Porter Industries, was able to put the company on their green cleaning program.

In addition to bathroom hand towels that are now made of 100 percent recycled paper, Compliance Partners uses all environmentally friendly cleaners. Elimination of antibacterial products, which ultimately find their way from your building into our local water supply, is a major objective of green cleaning. Overuse of antibacterial soaps and cleaners is believed to be contributing to the growth of multi-antibiotic-resistant bacteria, the drug resistant “super bugs.”

Any company, big or small, can switch to green cleaners. For small businesses without a cleaning service, it is as simple as purchasing new products that carry a reliable certification, like the Green Seal mark. Green Seal is a third-party not-for-profit organization that certifies a wide range of items, including cleaning products, as environmentally preferable.

2. Create an aggressive recycling program

Recycling programs make sense by reducing monthly trash hauling fees and keeping tons of unnecessary waste out of the landfill. In fact, according to John Armstrong of the city of Fort Collins' Natural Resources Department, “It's very expensive to throw away recyclables.” He estimates it costs a business about \$100 per ton to send cardboard to the landfill, and about \$160 per ton to send aluminum.

Armstrong says about 75 percent of waste generated in the commercial sector can be recycled, yet many organizations still don't recycle their aluminum cans, plastic, cardboard and paper, not to mention large items that take up significant space in the dumpster, like wooden pallets and cardboard packaging.

Neenan Archistruction of Fort Collins implemented a recycling program about a year ago, and has seen about a 30 percent reduction in trash hauling fees with the help of Waste Not Recycling of Johnstown.

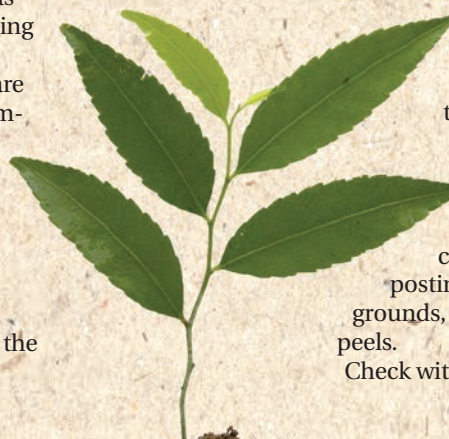
It was a bit of a challenge initially to get employees on board, admits Annie Lilyblade of Neenan, who was one of the team members who implemented the change.

“Over one weekend, our team snuck into the building and stole everyone's trash cans and replaced them with recycling bins for paper,” she said. They simultaneously provided each employee with a list of all of the items that could be recycled, including paper, aluminum, glass, plastic, cardboard, batteries, light bulbs and “e-waste” items such as computers.

Instead of being able to throw things away at their desk,

employees had to walk to trash and recycling bins in the main entry area, and many were not happy about it at first. Over time, though, employees wholeheartedly bought into the value of the program. Now each employee has a mini-can at his or her desk for true trash — all other items are recycled. The company even has a composting system for things like coffee grounds, tea bags, apple cores and banana peels.

Check with your local community about avail-



able recycling programs.

3. Purchase reusable dishware

For a fairly small upfront cost, smart companies these days are replacing paper and polystyrene cups and plates, plastic cutlery and other eating item with reusables. RB+B Architects in Fort Collins converted from paper products to reusable dishes, cups, utensils and water bottles about a year ago. The company now fills and runs their dishwasher once a week, and RB+B's Jayne Kafka estimates the company saves about \$50 per month.

If your firm does a significant number of events and entertains, the value of looking for alternatives only increases. If reusables don't make sense, recyclable and compostable items are a great choice. Most major suppliers now offer utensils and hot and cold cups made of corn starch — a renewable resource — that can be composted. Or, at the least consider using paper products made with recycled content to save money and landfill space.

4. Encourage alternative forms of transportation

With the cost of gasoline rising, more people are investigating alternative ways to get to work, from creating carpools to finding bus routes that work for them or pulling out that old bicycle.

In addition to the obvious cost savings to employees from less gasoline used fewer and miles put on vehicles, not to mention less carbon generated, everyone benefits from improved employee health from biking or walking.

Companies can have a huge impact by supporting and actively promoting alternative transportation. Some organizations are already providing discounted or free bus passes, offering a site to coordinate carpools, or encouraging biking. Nonetheless, most workers in Northern Colorado still get into their cars each day and drive alone.

Incentives and competitions seem to work well for companies interested in motivating employees to use alternative transportation. Nolte Associates Inc., a civil design and survey firm in Fort Collins, has created a bike-to-work challenge with a monthly prize for the person who bikes the most days.

In addition, for every 1,000 miles biked (or walked or bused) by all employees, \$100 is donated to a charity. With about 25 percent of employees participating, by the end of September 2008, 3,500 miles have been biked this year, according to Senior Engineer Michele White.

Businesses should also ask, "Is this trip necessary?" More firms are offering employees the option to work from home at least part-time. For businesses with satellite offices or remote sales people, it's worthwhile to research whether face-to-face meetings are always necessary, or whether video conferencing or teleconferencing can suffice. All it takes is a little creativity to get people engaged.

5. Get educated about other green business practices

There are obviously a multitude of other green business practices that can help the triple bottom line. Not all are easy and cost-free, but often can have a far greater positive impact on both the environment and cost savings.

So, get smart. There are many resources available to companies locally, including programs supported by municipal government that provide technical assistance, grant money, credits or rebates for making certain changes.

Xcel Energy offers a wealth of resources and financial incentives for customers to implement energy efficiency improvements. The cities of Greeley, Fort Collins and Loveland all have excellent programs to support water conservation, and Fort Collins and Loveland also have energy efficiency programs. The Climate Wise

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City building under LEED review

Student project could result in first existing municipal building rating in region

FORT COLLINS — Colorado State University graduate student Jon Wagner is getting a chance to put his training in construction management to the test in a real-world project that will benefit the city of Fort Collins.

And the collaboration between CSU and the city could be the first of other such partnerships aimed at making city buildings — and those in the private sector — more energy efficient and easier on the environment.

Wagner, a student in CSU's Institute for the Built Environment, said he and his fellow classmates will provide information that the city can use to consider whether to seek gold LEED Existing Building: Operations and Management certification for its facility at 215 N. Mason St.

"I think it's one of the great things about the (institute) program, that you can get a lot of hands-on experience," Wagner said. "There's not a lot of textbooks out there on this, but with LEED being the market standard for construction it's really beneficial for the students to get experience with that rating system."

Kathy Collier, the city's Climate Wise director, said the collaboration with the CSU Institute for the Built Environment began about a year ago during a conversation with director Brian Dunbar about student service projects.

"We started thinking, why not do something with the city?" Collier said, noting that the city has a commitment to incorporating green-building practices in all of its new buildings and when renovating existing buildings.

The city's 215 N. Mason Street facility cost \$11 million when it was built in 2001, and houses the city's municipal court, parking services, finance, recreation, IT and human resources depart-

What is LEED?

LEED, or Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, is a green-building rating system developed by the U.S. Green Building Council in 1998. The system has been applied to more than 14,000 building projects in all 50 states and 30 countries since its inception to raise awareness about the benefits of green building practices and establish a common standard of measurement in meeting LEED certification requirements.

Buildings are rated on a point system with four ratings awarded in ascending order — certified, silver, gold and platinum.

ments. Ken Mannon, the city's director of operations services, said the building included many green-building aspects but did not obtain LEED certification when it was constructed.

"I think the building was intended to be a LEED-certified building and was built and designed to be a green building but never certified," he said. "What they're doing is going back and re-examining the building to see how it's performing and what can we do to bring it into the gold (LEED) standard."

Project half done

The project kicked off in September with IBE students beginning to analyze various aspects of the building's construc-

tion and operations to see where green practices can be added to those of the original design. Students are looking at such things as energy and water use, waste and recycling practices, green cleaning, indoor air quality and green materials procurement.

Wagner said his focus is on waste management and purchasing. "It's trying to divert as much waste generated from the landfill as possible and that can be done through recycling and composting," he said. "We're also trying to purchase materials that are more environmentally conscious and that are produced within a 500-mile radius to cut transportation costs and emissions."

Students will compile their data and make recommendations to the city in December about what additional things can be done to make 215 N. Mason more green in its operations.

Dunbar said 215 N. Mason has many green features already, making it a great learning experience for students.

"There's a lot of learning that takes place when they see a good green feature operating well in the building," he said. "They're finding out things that work well and analyzing them against the national rating system and maybe discovering some aspects that could function even better."

Costs will be considered

Some student recommendations for improving the building's operations and maintenance and achieving a gold LEED certification will have a cost impact, Dunbar acknowledged, but not all.

"There might be some that don't cost anything and some that may be too costly to implement," he said.

Mannon said the recommendations will be studied by city staff to see what's affordable within the city's budget constraints and what can be done in a step-by-step way to ultimately achieve a gold rating for the building.

Mannon said the project is a good one for both partners. "It's good for the students and the city because they're doing the work and we're providing a place to study," he said.

Dunbar said the Porter Industries building in Loveland is the first existing building in the region to receive LEED gold certification but the 215 N. Mason facility could be the first public building north of Denver to do so.

Collier said the city hopes to make 215 N. Mason a demonstration project for other existing buildings in the region. "The city is fine-tuning all of its green practices and buildings and I think a lot of

businesses are also doing that," she said. "This was a great opportunity to sort of showcase what could be done for existing buildings, not just for the city but for other businesses as well."

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Back to the future with straw bale construction

Ancient building method creates 21st-century energy savings

Straw isn't just for fall decorations and feeding cows these days — it's also finding its way into homes.

Straw bale homes are growing in popularity, one of the many new green alternatives to traditional building. And skip the jokes about a Big Bad Wolf blowing the house down — the builders have heard it.

In fact, straw bale proponents say the agricultural byproduct has long been known as a durable building material.

"People kind of have it in their heads that natural building materials aren't as good as modern building materials," said Brian Fuentes, founding architect of Fuentes Design in Boulder. "Around Europe, there are thousands of (straw bale) buildings still standing. It's a completely legitimate technology that has a lot more history than a lot of the building materials we're used to."

The straw bales are mainly used in walls, typically accounting for only 20 percent to 25 percent of the structure. While straw bale homes tend to incorporate conservation and green techniques throughout, traditional materials still play a role.

"You still have to be a concrete person, and a carpenter, too," said John Rehorn, president of the Colorado Straw Bale Association, a group that helps connect consumers with builders and other resources.

Start with a concrete foundation

The foundation of a straw bale home is constructed the same as any other home, he said, excavating below the frost

line to pour concrete. The concrete can be in the typical slab style or mixed with recycled Styrofoam, a green technique Fuentes regularly uses.

Next come the walls.

While some skip the wood, relying on pressurized bales to provide support for the home, most people go for a post-and-beam style, Rehorn said. With conservation in mind, posts are spaced to the maximum point the span of the beam can support, thus reducing lumber supplies.

It's similar to techniques used to construct a barn, Fuentes said.

Then, the straw comes in to play. Instead of fiberglass straw bales are stacked against the walls.

The final step is plastering.

In Colorado, the clay required for this step is pulled directly from the surrounding yard and applied to the home in multiple coats. The result is a stucco-looking exterior wall, some with undulating forms and others razor straight.

The final wall ranges from 17 to 20 inches thick. Plaster accounts for 1.5 inches of this, versus the standard half inch

taken up by a sheetrock wall. Paint or washes can be added to provide color and waterproofing, but the one thing to skip is a sealant.

"You want a breathable wall, so moisture can transpire," Rehorn said.

The ups and downs of baling

Colorado is an ideal location for straw bale construction.

"There is a ready supply of straw bales in Colorado," Rehorn said. "A lot of people are growing grain in Colorado."

This makes it cheap to transport bales to a worksite. Another benefit is the dry climate — once the bales are in place, there is less chance of mold growing. Mold is a concern with straw, but Rehorn is quick to point out it's a threat with wood houses, too, if not built correctly.

By designing homes with roof overhangs, the issue of mold is largely avoidable. This does eliminate a few building styles, but Fuentes said plenty of options are left.

"It's really applicable to a lot of different styles," Fuentes said. "It could be steel, concrete, metal, gable style, log; it could be a modern, contemporary building, or a traditional Southwestern or German style."

There are some drawbacks to straw bale homes, particularly when it comes to the plaster. For one, it's time-consuming, complicated by the fact it has to be completed during dry, hot times of the year. With many people doing the manual labor of construction themselves, this often leads to last-minute dashes, recruiting friends, family and

strangers to finish up homes before snow hits the ground, Rehorn said.

The alternative is hiring a professional, but this comes with a high price tag, making the otherwise affordable building technique a strain on some budgets.

Energy saving hugs

Either way, savings start adding up as soon as energy bills arrive, with the added insulation lowering heating and cooling costs drastically.

But the real benefit of a straw bale home has to be experienced, Rehorn said.

"Once you walk in to a straw bale house, you start to get that conversion," he said. "My wife says when you walk in to our house it feels like the house is hugging you."

Jen Carlson, co-owner of a straw bale home and Straw, Sticks & Bricks, a retail store in Lincoln, Neb., offering green building materials, agrees.

"It's quieter, because we have two feet of insulation," she said. "Some people come in and think it's very peaceful."

But the real payoff for Carlson, as it is for many involved with straw bale, is knowing she is doing something to help the environment. And it's something she's seeing more people relating to every day.

"There's just a desire for it," she said. "HGTV features shows all the time with green, and people pay attention to that. Once you know the reasons why green building materials are important, it's hard to go back."

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Greener lawns can be quieter lawns

ISLE's eco-goal: carbon-neutral grounds keeping

BOULDER — Environmentally friendly homes and green buildings are becoming more common, but what about the landscape surrounding these buildings?

The Boulder-based International Society reducing Lawn-care Emissions, or ISLE, is the first nonprofit organization in the world to create universal standards and metrics for carbon and noise pollution in grounds-maintenance equipment.

Richard Evans, director of ISLE, said the implementation of reduced grounds-maintenance pollution is possible without buying new equipment.

“Our mission is to lead the world to carbon-neutral grounds keeping,” he said. “It is an environmental issue that is not being addressed. Until recently, lawn-care equipment had no carbon restrictions. The committee is addressing the problem with equipment that is currently being used and would not meet ISLE standards for years.”

Evans realizes that ISLE cannot change consumer habits overnight. He has proposed that universities and other infrastructures begin with zones — controlled environments, overseen by ISLE-certified consultants, which produce quantifiable results.

ISLE would like to target the University of Colorado at Boulder's Wise Law Library as its pilot program, and the organization is working with three student ambassadors on campus. The library is already Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, or LEED, certified.

ISLE standards include looking at what time of day grass is cut, reducing noise pollution caused by equipment and training maintenance workers about best practices. The ISLE committee would work with groups to set goals and acts as

the regulatory body.

“Our goal by year's end is to have 80 universities worldwide with ISLE zones,” Evans said. “These zones are areas with high pedestrian traffic.”

Other universities that have shown interest in implementing ISLE zones are the University of Pennsylvania, UCLA and the University of Florida.

Part of ISLE's mission is to inspire the creation of comprehensive plans that guide universities and cities in achieving

carbon-free, low-noise grounds maintenance.

Problem overlooked

Jordan Porter, a senior at CU, is also an ISLE ambassador. He said emissions created by grounds maintenance is a problem that is overlooked, especially on campuses with lawns.

"ISLE standards are real time and could be implemented immediately," Porter said. "These changes are a lot more likely to get done if the students are behind it. The problem is these issues are not well-known, and the community needs to be educated. Lawn-care tools are not being maintained properly, and environmental issues caused by gas spills are a big problem."

According to the Environmental Protection Agency, or EPA, 17 million gallons of fuel — mostly gasoline — are spilled each year while refueling lawn equipment. The spilled fuel then evaporates into the air, where it is cooked by heat and sunlight, creating smog.

Evans said of the millions of mowers used worldwide, most are not maintained to manufacturers' specifications and cause higher carbon pollution. ISLE standards include monitoring equipment upkeep such as air filters, oil and blades and using no-spill gas cans. These maintenance steps could reduce emissions of lawn-care equipment up to 50 percent and fuel consumption up to 31 percent.

John Chyz, part of the ISLE advisory board residing in Florida and a LEED-accredited professional, said CU is the perfect candidate for an ISLE zone.

"We have to go through a lot of red tape because universities

have their own committees, which must agree to new policies," Chyz said. "We have quantifiable results, but we do not have leading scientists worldwide working on this with us, and that can make involvement more difficult."

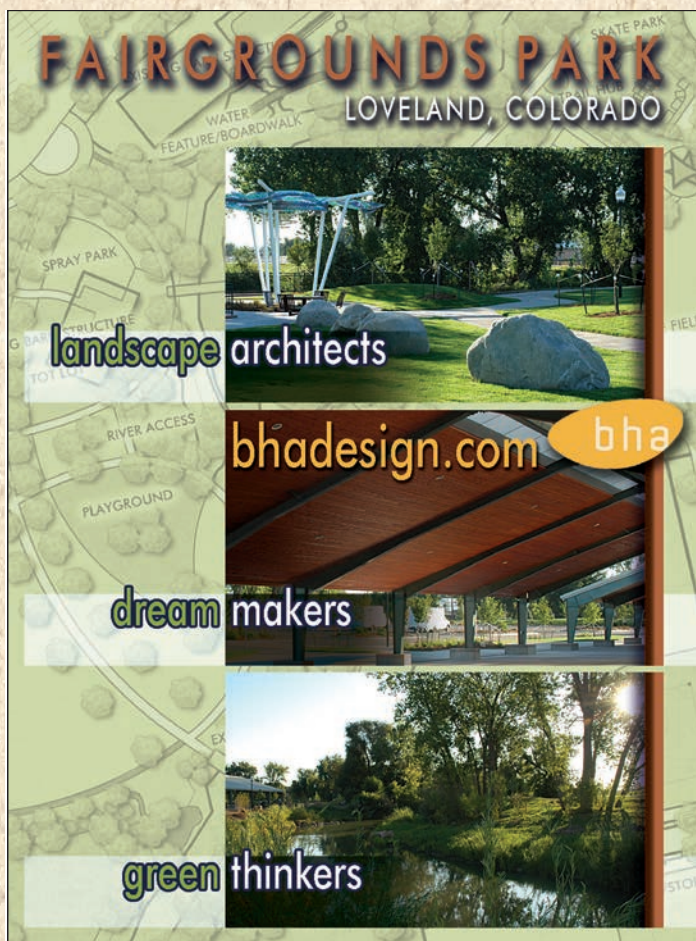
Chyz said the campus ambassadors help get the word out about ISLE.

The ISLE standards committee consists of five people, three of which are certified consultants. The business was launched this past spring with satellite offices in Florida, California and London to support ISLE certification in these areas. The \$25,000 startup capital for the nonprofit side came from fundraisers, corporate sponsors and donations.

The for-profit business will include the introduction of alternative-energy grounds-maintenance equipment. By October 2009, ISLE estimates that it will have 1,500 clients that would generate approximately \$3.8 million in revenue from CarbonView reporting and consulting. The reports track the progress on emission goals that have been established. ISLE consultants work on site to help implement zone standards.

Kryselda Mendoza, a sophomore at CU and ISLE ambassador, said noise caused from lawn mowing and leaf blowers has been a disruption to her studies on campus.

"Grass is everywhere, and people do not realize that mowing the lawn can affect the atmosphere," Mendoza said. "CU is already known as a green campus, and ISLE offers ways to reduce pollution now."



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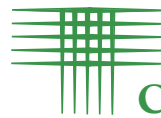

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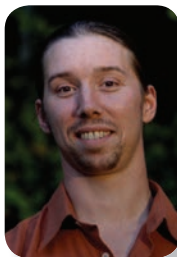
