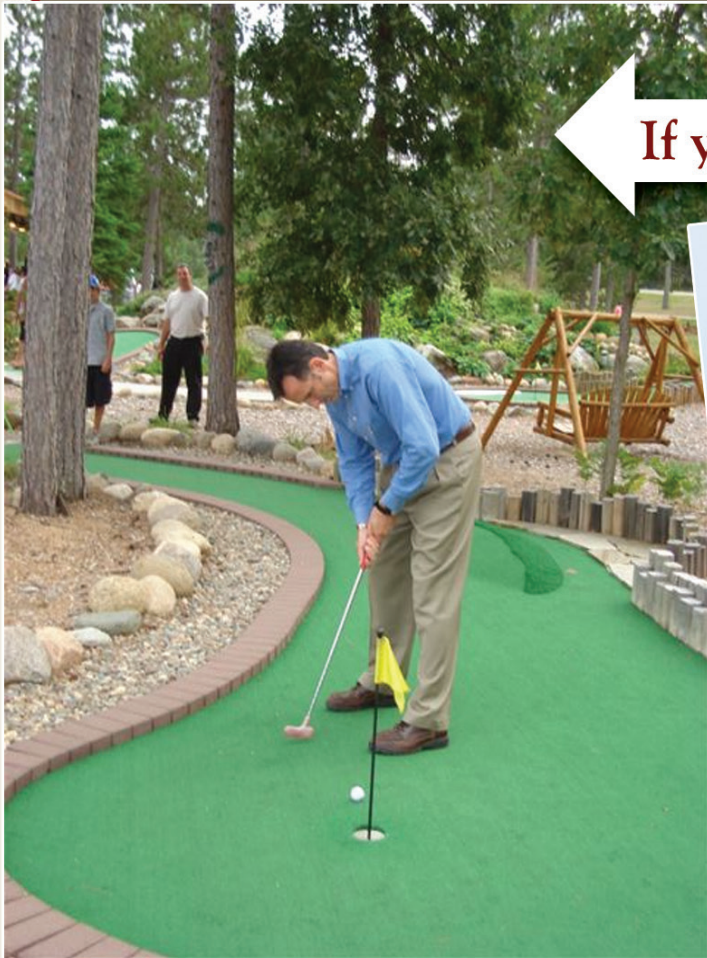

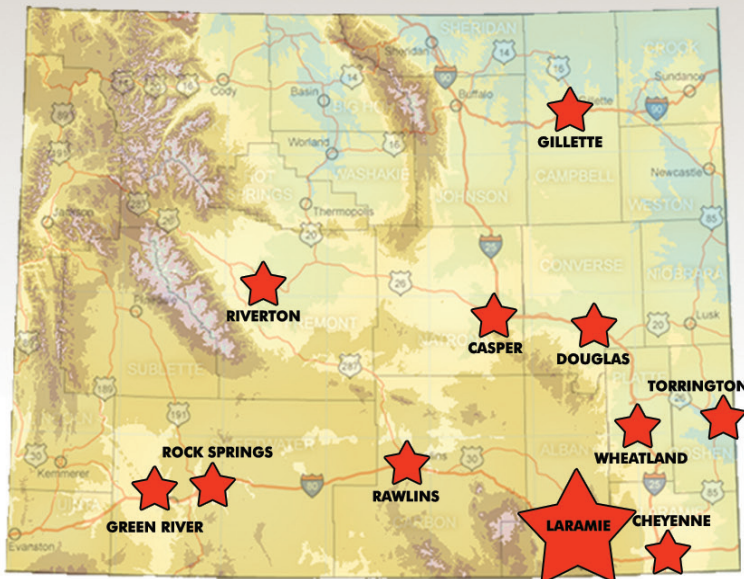

Local pros, new tools help novices, experts improve their games

New to the sport or with decades of golfing experience, we can all stand to improve on our game. And whether you'd like to learn your way around the links the old-fashioned way or with the help of the newest instructional and evaluative technologies, Northern Colorado's golfing community has got you covered.

"Golf instruction is important at any level," said John Hanrahan, director of golf and instructor at the Hanrahan Golf School at the Fort Collins Country Club. "For budding golfers, it is important so they get enjoyment out of the game sooner rather than later and avoid trial and error. The more experienced golfers take and enjoy lessons because they have a better understanding of the game and have the desire to improve. All golfers will hit certain plateaus, and the only way to bypass where they reach a standstill is through instruction."

Of course, the traditional way to shave a few strokes from your game is to spend time observing, playing with, and practicing with the professionals. With face-to-face instructional sessions, either one-on-one or more economically as part of a group of students, developing golfers can get hands-on tips directly from pros trained to teach the game effectively.

And our region's educational resources are abundant. Among Northern Colorado's golf instructors are current and former PGA members, college-educated exercise scientists and sports psychologists, and even an LPGA Tour veteran and winner.

HIGH-TECH TOOLS

Today's golfing student can draw on a wealth of high-tech teaching tools. Modern technology can help golfers improve their swings, lengthen their drives, or lower their handicaps. Among the latest tech tools for improving your game:

VIDEO RECORDING

Recording a student's swing allows budding golfers to visualize what needs to be changed, and even compare their own swings to those of today's top Tour professionals.

"Video technology has the greatest impact on golf instruction," Hanrahan said. "Since 70 percent of your students learn visually, to be able to record, play back, and even compare their swings to another model such as Phil Mickelson or Tiger Woods or Annika Sorenstam improves the students' ability to understand what they need to work on and how we are working together to fix it."

COMPUTER SWING ANALYSIS

Computer software designed especially for golf instruction allows students to easily analyze every aspect of their swing with great precision. Alignment; head, hip, and knee movement; swing plane; spine angle;

speed, back spin, launch angle, and side angle can be seen immediately after every shot, allowing golfers to see in real time the effects of any swing adjustments they've made.

LOOSEN UP THAT CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM for a smoother swing

Add distance to your drives by developing core strength, balance, range of motion

Do yourself and your golf instructor a favor. Loosen up.

It's no secret that better balance, flexibility and a greater range of motion can improve not only your swing and score, but they can reduce the after-round stiffness that sets in at the 19th hole.

If you think limber and elongated muscles are the ticket, you're right. But physical therapist Roger Rettig explained what most people don't know is that you've got to get your central nervous system to cooperate.

Just going through basic stretching doesn't necessarily result in elongated muscles or greater range of motion, he said.

"A muscle is very elastic, but

what keeps it tight is the central nervous system," Rettig said. "Our nerves will send signals to tighten our major muscle groups to support the spine. When we stretch a muscle, the central nervous system automatically tightens nearby muscle groups to prevent possible spinal injury."

And since the big muscle groups are responsible for movements, when they become tight range of motion is limited.

Rettig, owner and director of Colorado Physical Therapy Institute PC in Broomfield, has created the Golf Performance Enhancement program. It uses specific equipment and exercises to strengthen those core muscles while stretching them, giving the central nervous system a sense of core strength so it won't tighten muscles for protection.

This goes a long way toward creating flexibility in the joints, and the ligaments and tissue that connect bones that are the key to achieving the maximum stretch. The hips, lower back and rib cage need to be at their greatest flexibility to achieve top performance from those muscles.

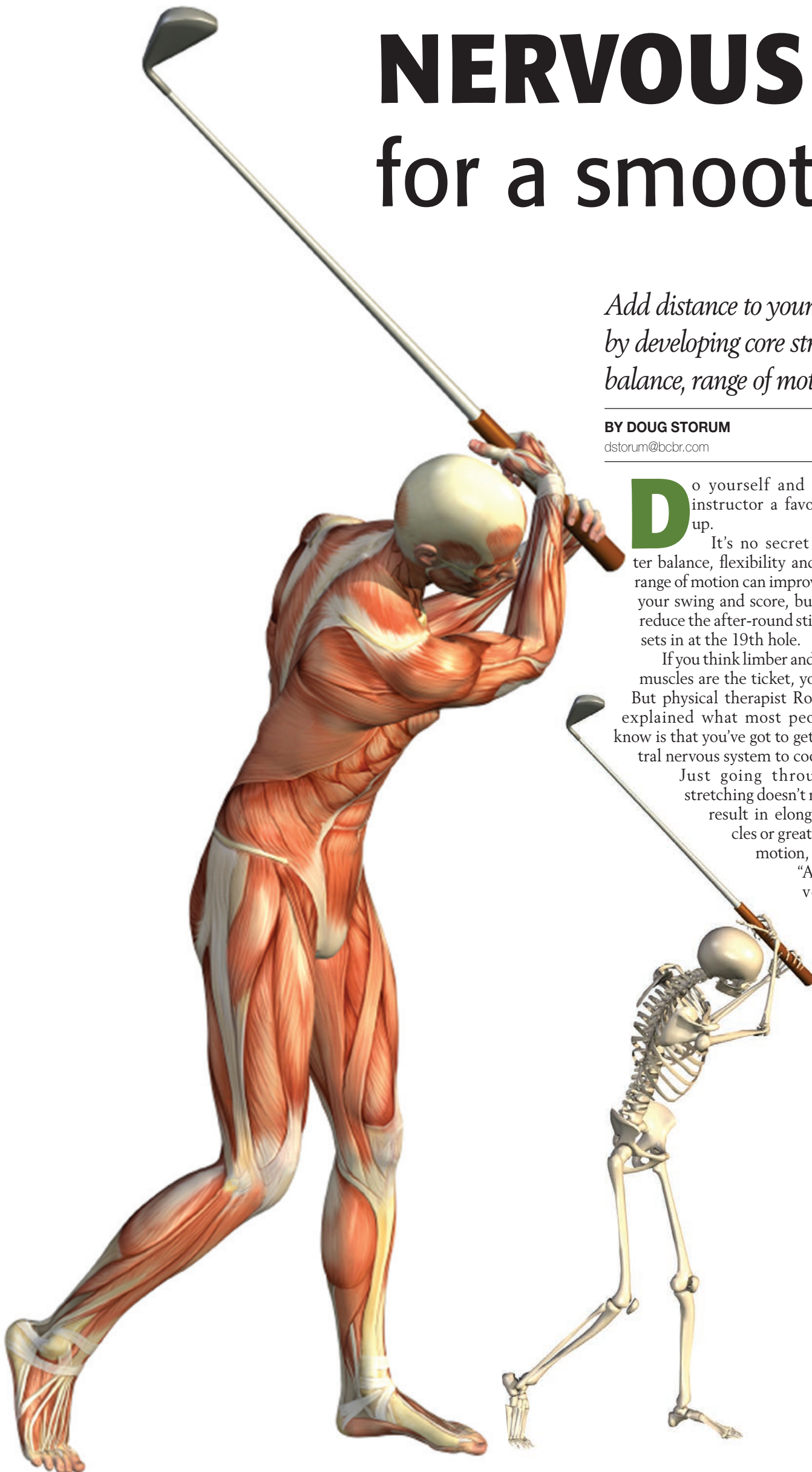

STRAP INTO ATM2

Rettig uses the ATM2 machine, which stands for active therapeutic movement, to achieve spinal stabilization. The machine started as a therapeutic device but has expanded into the athletic-performance market.

When strapped in by a series of belts, a golfer can work on range of motion of one area of the back while the belts support other muscle groups, sending a message to the nervous system that it doesn't need to contract muscles to

Three-session instruction

The Colorado Physical Therapy Institute PC in Broomfield charges \$285 for its Golf Performance Enhancement program. protect the spine.

Studies show that exercises using this machine result in an average 18.6-degree increase in range of motion and nearly 10 yards additional distance of drives. Long drive champion Gerry James achieved a 25-degree increase in range after four months on the machine.

Rettig said by using this machine and other exercise tools, golfers can focus on specific exercises that will improve the flexibility in their spine, shoulders and hips, all key areas of the golf swing. By creating flexibility in muscles and ligaments that connect bone to bone at joints, there also is benefit in maximizing the movement in joint sockets,

especially the hips.

The institute also has a nifty machine that develops core strength, a strong foundation necessary for balance. Rettig said the \$14,000 Power Plate's vibrating platform helps athletes improve muscle strength and posture control.

Studies show by simply standing on the vibrating plate, the body's muscles contract subconsciously 30 to 50 times per second, which can stimulate a power-training effect. But for working on balance at home, Rettig can prescribe a series of exercises on inflated plastic discs.

Rettig's crew also uses foam rollers of varying densities shaped like oxygen tanks to increase flexibility and core

strength of the neck, shoulders, mid- and lower-back areas and hips.

“Getting the rib cage to open is the first step in improving range of motion,” Rettig said. By using these rollers, a golfer can improve strength of muscles up and down the spine from the neck to the hips. “By repeating these routines, eventually your nervous system won't override the work you've done to stretch.”

The three-session program provides golfers with exercises and knowledge of some less expensive equipment to work on their golf fitness at home. “We think we can teach people pretty quickly what they can do to move toward their goals,” Rettig said.

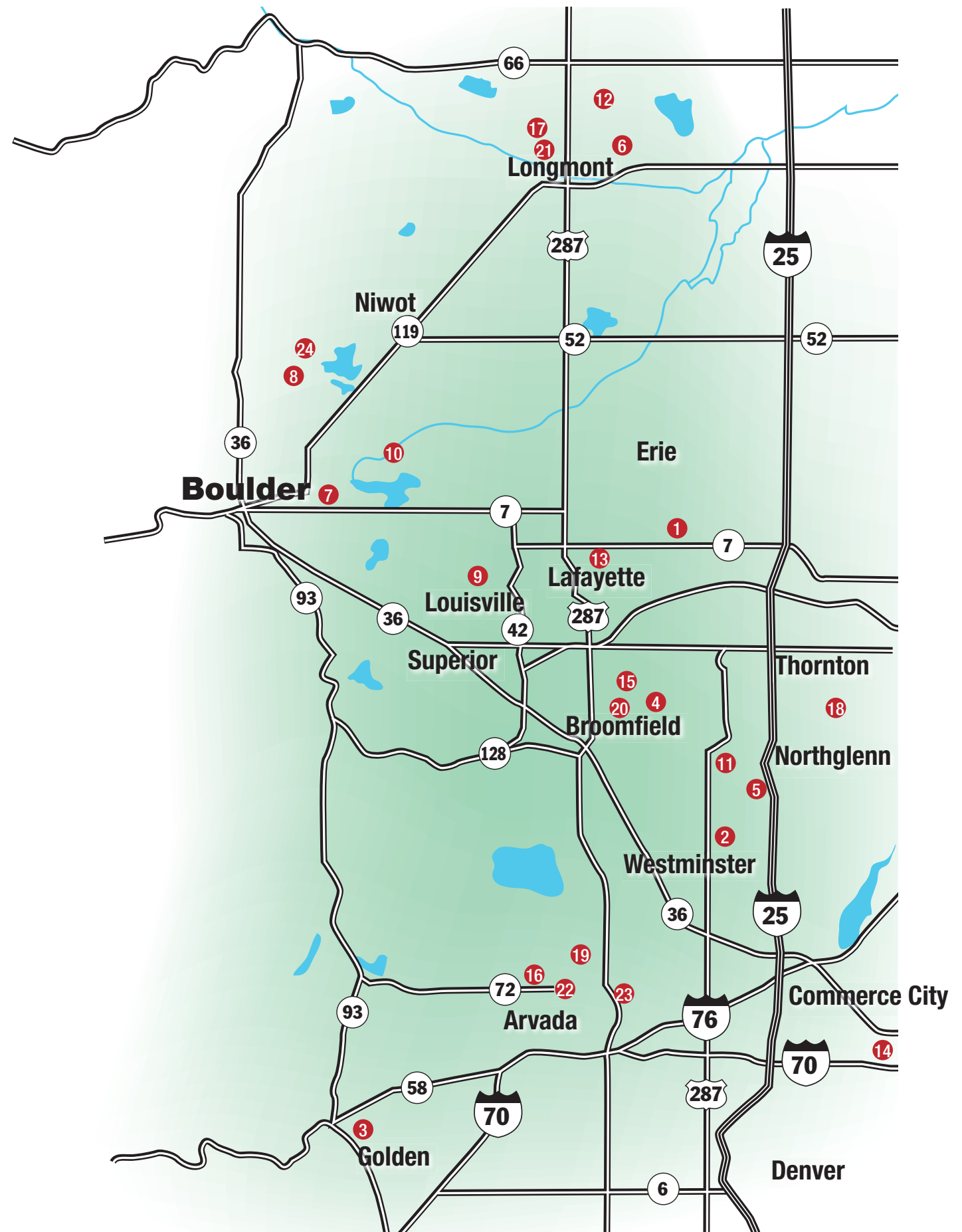

BISON ON THE GREEN

— and other 'only in Wyoming' hazards

Spectacular settings make for unique play on Cowboy State holes

Every golfer worth his clubs knows how to deal with sand traps and water hazards. But on the links in Wyoming, he may encounter hazards of a different sort. What do you do when you spot a herd of bison on the green? Play through?

Wyoming's golf courses have many features — high altitudes, spectacular views, and, yes, a wide variety of wildlife — that make playing them a unique experience, according to several of the

state's golf professionals.

"I've gotten a phone call from golfers who said, 'We're on the 8th hole and there's a whole bunch of bison,'" said Mark Bradley, Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis Club head golf professional. He went out to the hole to make sure the golfers waited to continue their game until after the herd wandered off the green.

Wyoming golf courses really are "where nature plays," Bradley said, and the Jackson Hole golf course is a playland for bison, elk, coyotes, deer and birds of prey.

"It's amazing," he said. "There are times when they wreak havoc on the course. The ungulates walk on the putting surfaces and punch holes in the green, walk through the sand traps. We have to deal with that and nobody else (at other courses in the country) does. But we wouldn't have it any other way."

Antelope are frequent visitors to the

Casper Municipal Golf Club, according to Gary Marsh, director of golf.

"We have fairly large herds here," he said. "The antelope leave a little mess, but as a rule, they're not too bad to deal with. The majority of out-of-town people are amazed at the antelope, mostly because they're fairly tame. You can get five to 10 feet away from them. They're not quite pettable, but pretty close."

"Every year we have a moose and her yearling that hang around the course," said Ron Dunham, director of golf at Teton Pines Country Club in Jackson. "A lot of guests get excited when they see the moose in the pond or stream. It's quite an attraction."

Because 14 of Teton Pines' 18 holes have water hazards, golfers see a lot of geese and other wetland birds there. The course is also a hangout for foxes and deer.

But not all the animals on the fairway

are wild.

"Wyoming is open range," said Dunham. "If you don't want animals on your property, you have to have a fence. One time 20 cattle got loose and ran across the green and fairway. It took quite a bit of fixing up."

Even the Cheyenne Airport Golf Course has its share of wildlife, said Mike Lepore, head golf professional.

"We have a few deer, foxes, a whole bunch of Canadian geese," he said. "We had a little bear once that we had to have Game and Fish come and get."

"It's the wild west here," said Mark Metzger, head golf professional at Powder Horn Golf Club in Sheridan. "We have geese, deer — you name it. We're at the base of the Big Horns, five miles from the peak. We've even spotted mountain lions. You're going to see just about everything."

The higher altitude of some of Wyoming's courses affects a golfer's game, the pros all said.

"We're at one mile (above sea level) here (Casper)," said Marsh. "The biggest difference is that someone coming from sea level is going to hit the ball a lot fatter; it's going to travel so much better. In Colorado they're used to that, but if they come from anywhere else, they're going to get a lot of boost from the altitude. They all like that."

Lepore said that depending how high above sea level a golfer is playing, the altitude will add about 20 yards a shot to each club. At 6,062 feet above sea level, Cheyenne offers golfing at one of the highest elevations in the state.

"It doesn't really affect people around here much, but you get a guy at sea level, he's going to notice a difference," he said.

At Teton Pines, golfers are teeing off at 6,485 feet above sea level, with the Tetons rising up in front of them to the summit of almost 14,000 feet. Golfers are likely to be even more impressed with the scenery than their drives.

"Looking up 8,000 feet to the top of the mountain is quite a view," Dunham said.

The grandeur of the Tetons rising up from the course, while a spectacular sight, can also be a hazard, Bradley said.

"There's the old cliché that you're supposed to keep your head down (when you golf)," he said. "When you see the magnificent beauty around you (here), it makes that difficult."

"Here at Powder Horn, what's unique is the view," said Metzger. "It's probably one of the prettiest places to play that I have seen. Powder Horn used to be an old working cattle ranch; now it's a 27-hole course."

It's not just Wyoming's wildlife, scenery or even weather — which makes for a short season — that make golfing here a

special experience, according to Marsh.

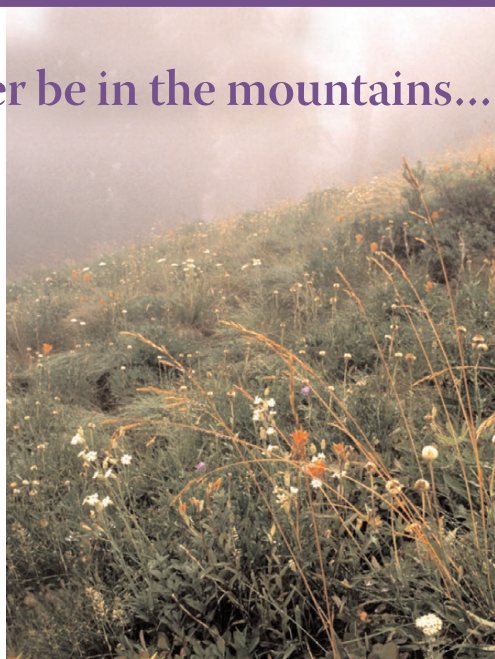
Its courses are unique because they are, for the most part "old style," he said, meaning that the fairways are wide open and very walkable and playable. The fact that many of them are designed by the community rather than well-known golf architects makes each of them different, he said.

But what really distinguishes Wyoming golf courses from others in the nation is the friendliness of the people here, another pro said.

"There are golf courses (in other states) that provide great customer service," said Lepore, "but (in Wyoming), we have a hometown 'we're proud of this place' feeling."

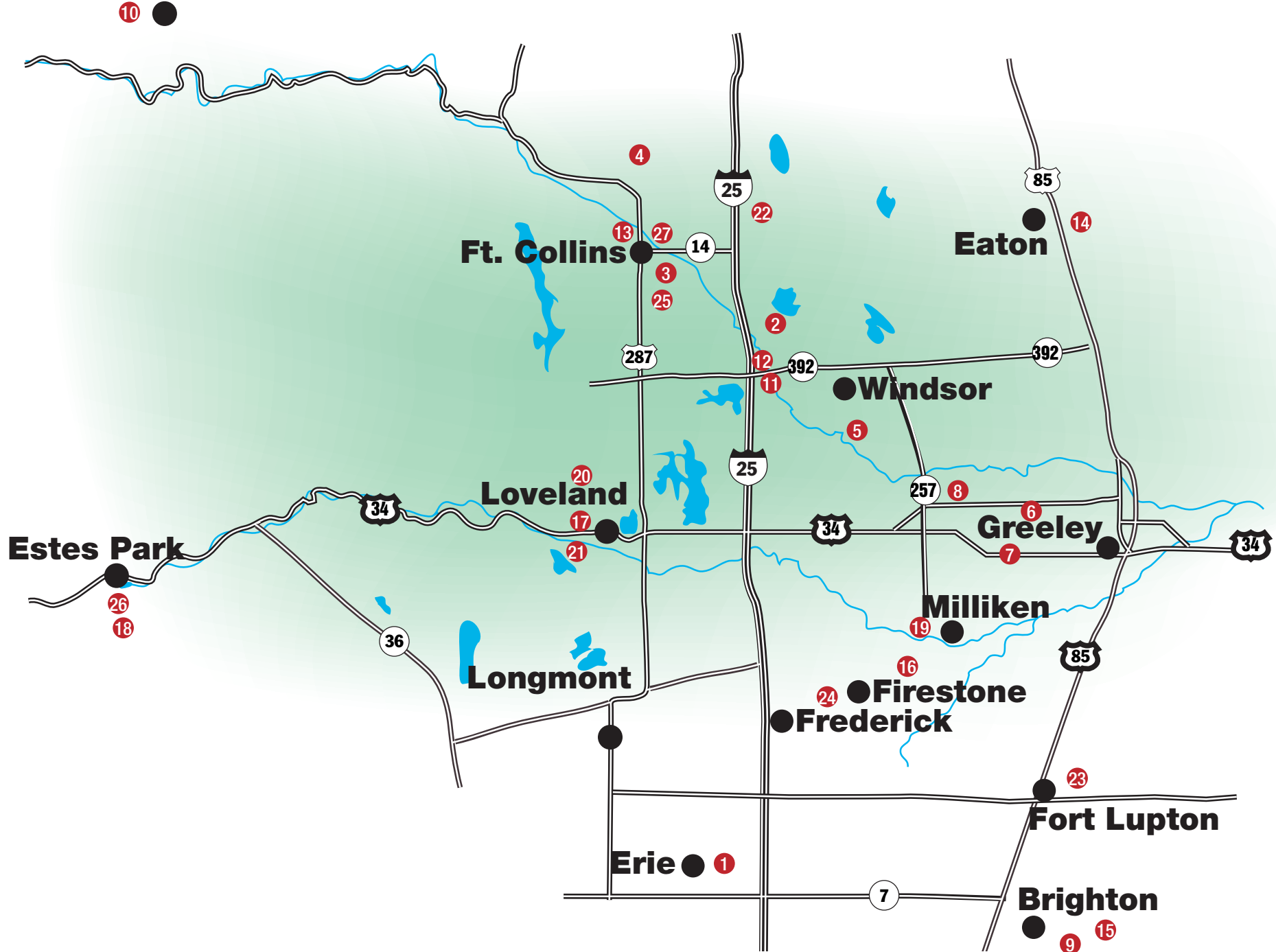

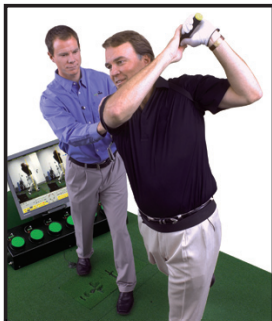

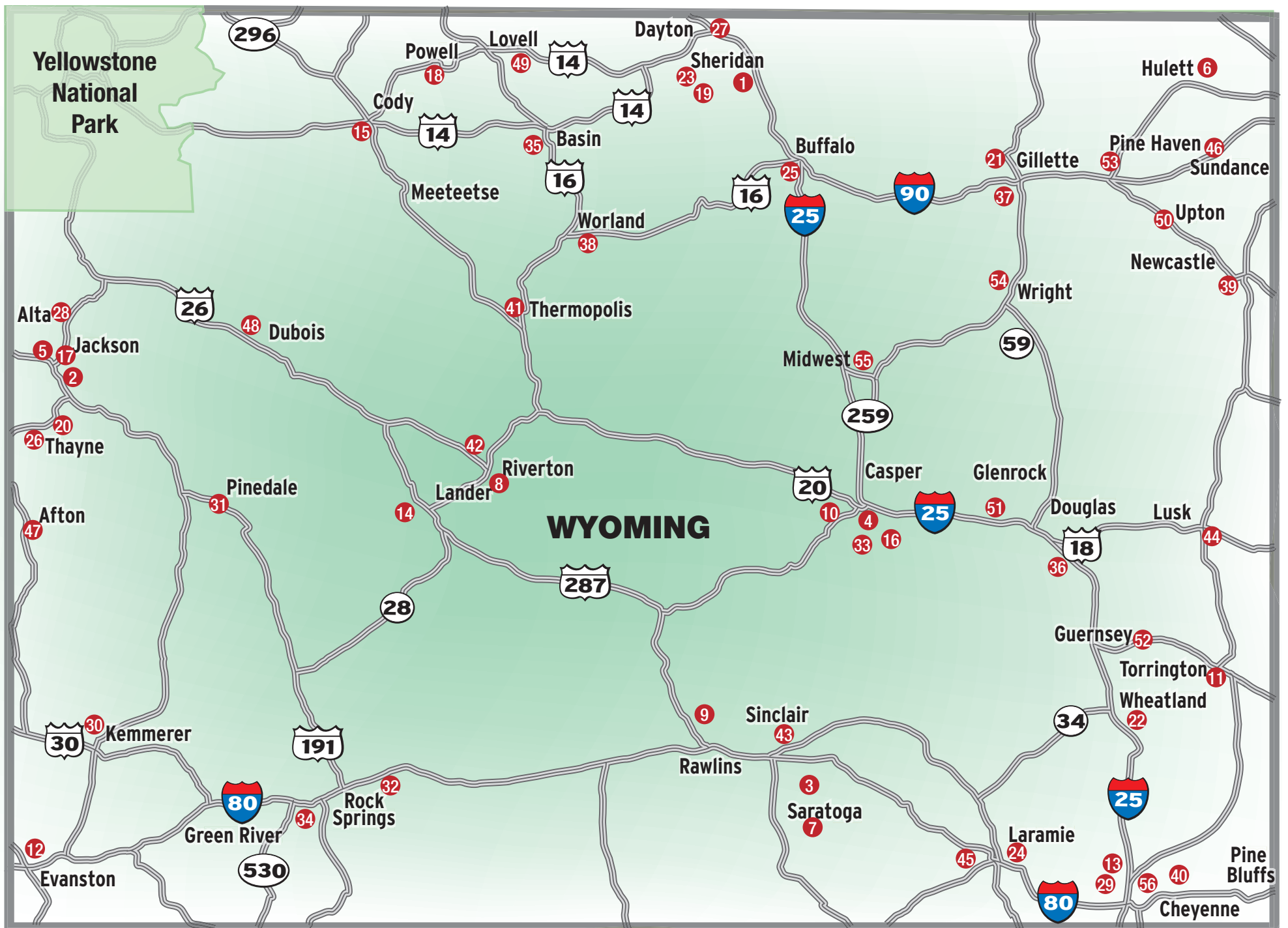
