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# Keith launches Lifestyle Asset Group

#### New luxury vacation business model aims to protect investors

FORT COLLINS — The founder of a once-thriving luxury vacation club in Fort Collins that ultimately ended in bankruptcy is again taking the plunge into pro-

viding high-end vacation experiences. This time the business model focuses on members owning the assets.

Richard Keith, who eventually signed up 450 members of Private Escapes before the club merged with Florida-based Ultimate Resorts in 2007 to become Ultimate Escapes, has launched Lifestyle Asset Group.

Keith said the new company, located at 1200 S. College Ave., aims to avoid the pitfalls that eventually brought down Ultimate Escapes, mainly by replacing the club membership model with a member ownership model.

With Lifestyle Asset Group,

Keith said, members are part of an LLC that buys and owns the vacation properties debt-free.

"Having a debt and members without any collateral were all epiphanies of what not to do," he said. "This is a completely 180-degree-different model."

Keith said he and his three partners — Karla Jones, Ed Powers and Tommy Robinson own nothing in the new model

# Solix BioSystems repositions itself in biofuels market

FORT COLLINS — After a long and uncertain winter, the algae-cultivation company Solix BioSystems has the 720-square-foot pool in its backyard ready for summer — with a considerable amount of green muck growing in it.

Solix is running its proprietary algae growth system called the Lumian AGS 4000 on the grounds of the Colorado State University Engines and Energy Conversion Lab in Fort Collins. The design of the inflatable tank includes 20 patentpending photobioreactor panels where algae is cultivated for use as oil, a base for biofuel, or whatever purpose a customer might have. Formerly considered research and development equipment, the algae growth system is now being marketed by Solix to other companies and institutions looking to make their own algae. It announced its first sale this week to New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, which

# From real estate selling to real crime solving

#### Christensen realizes a career dream with sheriff's department

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FORT COLLINS — When Nick Christensen started his new job with the Larimer County Sheriff's Department, he literally "hit the ground running."

Christensen, along with new Sheriff Justin Smith and several other department members, ran from the sheriff's office in east Fort Collins to the Larimer County Courthouse in downtown Fort Collins for their swearing-in ceremony, about four miles.

And that was on Jan. 11.

"It was a pretty cold day," recalled a smiling Christensen. But the former commercial real estate broker said he's found a warm welcome amongst the close-knit sheriff's department. "I've got to say the support has been impressive to see."

Christensen is a familiar face in the Northern Colorado real estate community, the co-owner of Chrisland Commercial Real Estate Inc. in Loveland, a company he founded seven years ago. Before that, he was with Realtec and then head of real estate for McWhinney for five years.

But the Minnesota native has had a long fascination and interest in law enforcement, going back to his law

school days. While studying for his law degree, Christensen volunteered in local law enforcement and focused on narcotics investigations.

After law school, he moved to Colorado and began practicing law in the Vail Valley and Aspen areas. But being stuck in an office didn't suit him, and he decided to take an opportunity to work in commercial real estate in Fort Collins in the mid-1990s.

That move started him up a ladder of success, but his passion for law enforcement never left him.

#### Eye-opening experience

Christensen, entering his 40s, thought any chance of transitioning into law enforcement might have passed him by. But still wanting to be involved, he began quietly working with sheriff's investigators on cold cases.

"Where they really needed help was in cold-case investigations, so I got involved in that as a volunteer," he said. It was an eye-opening experience, working on cases that had come to dead-ends, with families still yearning for answers.

"It gave me a lot of empathy for our investigators who work on these cases all the time," he said. "They're very difficult cases to work on and can be very draining. You think of Northern Colorado as a fairly safe area — and it is — but unfortunately there are things going on every day that are pretty tough."

Christensen said he didn't publicize his volunteer activities because he "didn't want it to be a distraction from real estate or make it a big deal."

But in 2010 a twist of fate offered him an opportunity to change gears and enter law enforcement full-time. During the election campaign, he became a supporter of candidate Smith, an officer he got to know while volunteering.

After Smith was elected in November, conversations began as to whether Christensen might bring his business and people skills to Smith's new leadership team.

"I shared with him how to take business principles to increase or improve efficiencies, and not to do things just because they've always been done that way," he said. "Sheriff Smith agreed with that approach and created a position as executive officer."

As executive officer, Christensen is an administrator who handles public relations

#### WoW - video games do have real benefits

Spring is in the air and that can mean parents' frustrations with their kids who opt to play video games instead of going outside are beginning to run high.

Doing nothing to relieve the tension are two studies by Jeffrey Snodgrass, associate professor of anthropology at Colorado State University, which examined different types of video gaming experiences and the effects they have on players' lives, including levels of stress, life satisfaction and happiness.

Snodgrass and his research team conducted surveys and interviewed World of Warcraft players about their gaming habits. The game, often referred to as WoW, is a wildly popular, massively multiplayer online game with 12 million players worldwide. Players develop an avatar that works with other players to complete tasks within the game.

In the first study, "Magic Flight and Monstrous Stress: Technologies of Absorption and Mental Wellness in Azeroth," Snodgrass and his team found that players who were more absorbed in the game reported more stress relief. However, the study noted that the escape must be controlled and temporary to be positive.

In the second study, "Enhancing One Life Rather Than Living Two: Playing MMOs with Offline Friends," the researchers looked at players who play with individuals met inside and outside of the game.

Offline friends can help regulate immersive game play, which can be positive, though it does make it more difficult to derive the stress-relieving aspects found in the other study.

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# Technology firms ready for SBIR battle

#### Small business funds face uncertainty in Congressional stall

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When the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services wanted to develop an analytical tool to monitor levels of the contaminant perchlorate in water supplies, the government found Advanced MicroLabs, of Fort Collins, a company with just five fulltime employees, to apply its technology for the job.

When the Department of Defense's Missile Defense Agency needed to expand

its airborne infrared multi-sensor systems network, the agency handed the task to Loveland-based Numerica Corp., with a staff of under 50 people.

The connections between massive government agencies and small technology firms are borne out of the federal Small Business Innovation Research program. Since it was established by Congress in 1982, SBIR has enabled government departments to offer contracts tailored to small enterprise — for needs in defense, health services, energy and science, among other arenas. The agencies benefit from the technology and expertise of dedicated companies, while small businesses that are frequently strapped for capital get funding to develop research projects into commercial applications.

"SBIR is crucial. It's enabled us to real-

ly start getting into the commercial sector," said Ken Ogan, president of Advanced MicroLabs. The company has received a handful of SBIR contracts since 2004 to develop its lab-on-a-chip technology for biomedical applications, industrial power generation, and environmental monitoring.

As a state, Colorado has benefited immensely from the program, with small companies receiving more than 2,000 contracts worth nearly \$813 million in the last decade. The figures rank the state sixth in the country for SBIR activity, much of which has occurred in Northern Colorado.

Despite the program's benefits to the government and budding tech firms, Congress has balked at reauthorizing SBIR this year. Legislation to renew the program,



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# New Belgium Brewing, CEO: 'Let your life speak'

#### Kim Jordan heads up true Colorado success story

What started in the basement of then married couple Jeff Lebesch and Kim Jordan in 1991 has evolved into the third largest craft brewery in the United States. New Belgium Brewing Co. Inc. is now owned by Jordan, her sons and her

coworkers. The company's core values and beliefs have earned not only the highest respect among their 380+ employee-owners, but numerous awards as well. New Belgium is a Colorado success

**Q:** How did New Belgium come to be? A: Jeff volunteered at Sierra Nevada (brewery in California) and took brewing classes at UC Davis. Then he went to New Albion Brewing, and hung around Boulder Brewing Co. In 1987 he started winning awards in national home brew competitions with his own beers. In 1989, when Doug, Corky and Wynn Odell opened Odell Brewing Co. in Fort Collins, we became friends. We found our niche in the bottled craft brewing scene.

**Q:** What were your initial sources and start-up costs?

A: We used credit cards and \$60,000 through a second mortgage on our house.

Q: When did you start having positive cash flow?

**A:** Within six months of starting the company.

Q: Did you use a business plan?

A: We had a set of values, a purpose, and outcomes we wanted to achieve, more like guiding principles and objectives. We had financial pro-formas, and a lot of work went into the diagrams for the electricity and the how the tanks were going to be engineered and manufactured.

**Q:** What was your vision for New Belgium?

**A:** In the spring of 1991, before we ever made a bottle of beer, we asked ourselves what we wanted this company to stand for. We came up with 1. produce world class Belgium style beers; 2. promote beer culture; 3. be environmental stewards; and 4. have fun.

By 1995, as we got more customers and coworkers, we expanded our vision to take their needs into account. We combined open-book management, employee ownership (our coworkers own 41 percent of the company), and a high-involvement culture. Our coworkers can see all financials, And our plans for branding, sales, capital expenditures, hiring, budgets, and strategies – and they

participate in strategy development. Once everyone knows where true north is, it frees people from uncertainty and allows them to do more creative work. Powerful ideas come from all across the company: big ideas, little ideas, moneysaving ideas, and culture-building ideas. I think most people here would tell you that they feel their contribution matters.

**Q:** Where do you see yourself and

your company in 10 years?

A: When we talk about being a business role model and creatively approaching the craft of brewing, my coworkers really get on the edge of their seats. Of course we all want to be profitable and growing, but, more, we want our work to mean something and to bring us joy and a sense of accomplishment. We are working with other breweries around the United States to develop some partnerships which — who knows? — may lead to bigger things. I think it would be great to create a consortium of breweries that collaborate and brew across the country thereby minimizing our environmental impact and being closer to our customers.

I might move into a chair role by then, as opposed to CEO. I'm cognizant of the fact that this has been an incredible gift and we're involved in a craft – so I want to remain a part of that. Of course, you never know where you will be.

Q: Tell me about your biggest challenges and anything you wish you had done differently.

**A:** It was originally a challenge to provide opportunities for our coworkers. Growth by itself was never compelling. We thought, "Gosh, we have all of these dedicated and talented people and if we don't grow, all of us are going to sit in the same chairs."

I think everything adds to both the mistakes and the successes – and you can't foresee either. It's following instincts, knowing the basics and stick-

## Debate continues on impact of health care act

#### One year into new law, sharp divides still exist

The nation's health-care reform act
— known officially as the Patient
Protection and Affordable Care Act and

as "Obamacare" by its critics — just marked its one-year anniversary in March.

Everyone probably remembers the act had an extremely difficult birth, with more than a year of fierce debate over what should and should not be in it.

The act finally passed on a party-line vote, with only one Congressional Republican voting for it.

Challenges to the new law were immediately filed by Republican state attorneys general, including Colorado's own Attorney General John Suthers.

Several lower court opinions have been issued in the last year, resulting in a fairly even split between those upholding the new law and those saying it is unconstitutional. A hearing by the U.S. Supreme Court could come as early as late this year. Meantime, the debate rages on as to whether the health-care reform law is good or bad for business, especially small businesses that have been struggling to provide insurance coverage for their employees in recent years in the face of ever-rising premiums.

One small business group that definitely isn't sitting on the fence is the National Federation of Independent Businesses, which has joined in the lawsuits. Tony Gagliardi, director of NFIB's Colorado chapter, said there's no doubt that the law hurts business.

"Businesses are still getting hit with 20 to 40 percent increases in their health-care costs, and the act has done nothing to stop that," he said. "What we have seen is small business is not receiving any kind of benefit from the act."

Probably the biggest benefit supporters point to in the still-unfolding act is the small business tax credits that went into effect last year. Until insurance exchanges are up and running in 2014, small businesses with fewer than 25 full-time employees that contribute at least 50 percent to the total insurance premium are eligible for a tax credit of up to 35 percent of the employer contribution for employees averaging less than \$25,000 in annual wages.

The tax credit is less for higher-paid employees and phases out at those earning \$50,000 per year.

Gagliardi maintains the tax credit portion of the bill has little effect on

small business employers. "We figure that only 12 percent of businesses will qualify for any part of the tax credit," he said.

But that's not what the California-based Small Business Majority is saying. Founder and spokesman John Arensmeyer said a study by The Lewin Group showed of the 99,700 small businesses in Colorado, 82,400 — or 82.6 percent — are eligible for some portion of the credit and 24,500 small businesses are eligible for the full credit.

"Ultimately, the biggest single problem facing small business is the cost of health care," Arensmeyer said. "We found that when you explain the tax credits to small business, 33 percent who are not offering coverage say they would use them and another 33 percent who are offering coverage say they would (use them)."

Arensmeyer said there remains a great deal of confusion and misinformation about the law one year after its adoption, and uncertainty about its long-term future. But he doesn't see the lock-step opposition to the law by business that some might want to portray.

"The businesses we talk to across the country are not lining up to advocate for repeal," he said. "If you look at everything together, there's a lot more good for small business than harm."

Meanwhile, Gagliardi says the law is simply failing on every level. "We're all seeing (health-care premium) increases, and (the act) has done nothing to attack the real cause, which is the rising cost of health care," he said. "This is not healthcare reform, it's insurance reform."

Gagliardi said a better alternative is to scrap the health-care act and let states independently address insurance reform through state divisions of insurance. "NFIB is confident and hopeful that this act will be overturned by the Supreme Court. That's why we maintain full standing in the lawsuit as the only business organization to do so."

Arensmeyer said he's not sure why there is such a strong divide in the business community about the health-care act. "These issues seem to be very ideological," he said. "The fact is the problem wasn't resolving itself and needed to be fixed."

Arensmeyer notes that the insurance industry was not removed from the health-care discussion by the act and will continue to play a large role in its implementation.

"We firmly believe the system has to work for the insurance companies as well," he said. "If you don't get insurance companies willing to sell in an exchange, it's not going to work. This (act) was simply a way for the government to play a role and do it within the free market system."

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

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# To build communities, strengthen nonprofits

#### Resource Center brings businesses, nonprofits together

Most people recognize that Colorado's nonprofit sector — a rich array of organizations of diverse sizes and purposes, operating in every region of the state — delivers crucial services that bring help and hope to people in

need, according to the Colorado Nonprofit Association in Denver. "What's not so well known is that the sector is also a major economic force, whose vitality contributes in countless ways to the economic health of the state," the organization points out.

Several communities in Colorado, including Boulder/Broomfield, Denver, El Paso County and Estes Park have created resource centers that serve the growing nonprofit populations in their respective cities, and there is now community-wide support for a similar center in Northern Colorado.

In response, Linda Hughey of Competent Assistance for Nonprofits and I have created the Northern Colorado Nonprofit Resource Center. We are currently collaborating with government agencies, local municipalities, library districts and professional organizations to accomplish this goal. We share a mutual passion for the nonprofit community and have dedicated the last two years researching and examining strategies that optimize capacity building for nonprofit organizations. Our collective research indicates a need for centralizing and organizing resources for services, programs and funding opportunities that encourage optimal efficiency and help reduce overlaps and gaps in service.

The mission of NCNRC is "to provide quality management support services to help strengthen and connect nonprofit organizations in order to maximize charitable resources." The center will provide resources for capacity building, best practices, networking opportunities and other programs to help advance the nonprofit mission. By strengthening the nonprofit community, donors can feel confident that their dollars are used wisely and nonprofit professionals can feel assured that they are receiving the most expert and up-to-date services.

Services will include training and workshops that offer information, education and development skills; a comprehensive referral system of nonprofit consultants that connects organizations with experts in the industry; complete on-demand management support and services that enhance an organization's ability to succeed; and networking

opportunities that encourage collaboration and relationship building among nonprofit professionals.

#### Two programs up and running

Two programs that currently exist as part of the center are the Northern Colorado Resource Fair and our monthly nonprofit networking events. The resource fair connects businesses that provide a service, program, product or fundraising opportunity with the nonprofit community in one convenient location.

"Often, nonprofit organizations approach the business community requesting financial support and in-kind services without reciprocity," Linda explained. "We are working to change this paradigm by encouraging mutually beneficial relationships between businesses and nonprofit organizations that will best meet the needs of the community. We determined the best way to approach the issue is by bringing both entities together in one convenient location to encourage conversation and open dialogue about their individual challenges and needs."

The Northern Colorado Resource Fair provides the opportunity for discussions about how businesses and the non-profit community can collaborate and work together to increase community impact and sustainability for the future. ### Community colleges to train for oil, gas jobs

# As Niobrara develops, workers will require range of new skills

The 250,000-square-mile Niobrara formation that spans from Wyoming through Northern Colorado has primed the oil and gas industry for an uptick in jobs, but exactly when these jobs will pop up and what they'll look like is still uncertain.

Tisha Schuller, president and CEO of the Colorado Oil & Gas Association, said it will be at least another year to two years before the scope of the Niobrara play is realized, but added that every new job within the industry creates three spinoff jobs in other sectors.

In 2010, the state issued the third-highest number of oil and gas drilling permits on record, 2,132 of which were issued in Weld

John Dill, Chesapeake Energy's director of Corporate Development and Government Relations for the Rockies, said Chesapeake plans to have 10 exploratory rigs up and running by the end of 2011; 20 by the end of

#### So you want to get into the oil-and-gas industry

With an **average hourly wage of \$27.28** – \$10 higher than the average for non-supervisory personnel in other private industries in 2008 – a career in oil-and-gas extraction can sound attractive, especially as the Niobrara play continues to boom locally.

Oil-and-gas field workers usually **must be at least 18 years old**, be in good physical condition, and pass a drug test. A high school diploma is not necessarily required, but is usually preferred.

Most workers start as helpers to experienced workers and learn skills on the job; however, **formal training is becoming more important**, as more technologically advanced machinery and methods are used. Employers now
demand a higher level of skill and adaptability, including the ability to work with computers. As a result, some
employers prefer to hire recent graduates of high school vocational programs in mining or graduates of junior
college or technical school programs in mine technology.

Employment in oil and gas extraction is expected to decline by 16 percent through 2018, as a result of new techniques that allow for more efficient production from a reduced number of drill sites. However, there will continue to be job opportunities due to the need to replace workers who leave the industry.

#### Refuse to be at the mercy of the economic fluctuations

I work with a lot of business owners who are struggling with this tepid market – in particular, how to grow their revenue and market share. Depending on your customers and market, here are some ideas which might just get things moving again:

■ Adjust pricing: Many pricing decisions may have been made in a much different market, and your current levels may be either too low or too high. If prices are too high, they'll drive customers away. If too low, you'll be giving away your profit and the ability to invest in other areas.

Ask yourself: If you were just starting now, how would you set pricing for the current market? Don't assume that a tough economy means that customers and competitors always exert

downward pressure: You may still find those opportunities to be rewarded for providing unique and compelling value.

■ Provide loyalty incentives: I understand why some companies focus on giving discounts to new customers they acquire, but this just helps to reinforce a market where people are encouraged to switch. You'll end up spending huge amounts to acquire new customers, who will jump to your competition at the first opportunity.

Your current customers are the ones who are — we hope — satisfied with the value you provide, and would like to have reasons to return. But they need to know that you value their business, want to continue to serve them, and have useful products and services to address their needs. What are you doing to maintain that relationship, and clearly articulate that customers' lives will be easier if they don't go to your competition? Do they have any reason to continue to do business with you?

# Local companies honored for business ethics

The five companies profiled here were honored, based on research performed by business students from Colorado State University, the University of Northern Colorado, and the University of Wyoming.

#### 1-10 employees

#### Niemann keeps values center stage

In a world where small-town music shops are hard to find, Niemann & Sons, Inc. in Cheyenne must be doing something right. The shop has prospered under the ownership of Dave Niemann since 1988, thanks to ethical practices and top-notch customer service.

Niemann's management practices make him stand out to customers, vendors and his

community, and because his shop is so small — just four employees, including Niemann — he is able to keep his values constant.

To instill these values in his employees, Niemann personally them, walking them through the store and teaching them everything they need to know with a hands-on approach. Niemann doesn't use an employee handbook, just his own vision and experience.

This personal dedication to ethical practices has earned Niemann & Sons this year's Torch Award in the category of businesses with fewer than 10 employees.

Both employees and customers benefit from Niemann's passion for what he does. He is in business not to simply make money, but to "help people make music," as his mission statement says.

To help young customers reach their potential as musicians, Niemann offers scholarships to underprivileged youth who exhibit interest and potential in the world of music.

These scholarships help provide students with the instruments they need to practice and develop their talents, which can lead to even greater opportunities down the road. He gave out 15 scholarships in 2010 alone.

Niemann also serves his customers by selling only the best brands of instruments in his store. Rather than stock instruments based on whether or not famous musicians choose to use them, Niemann selects his instruments based upon quality and integrity alone.

Niemann judges his products on the quality of the materials that go into a prod-

uct, as well as the product's history. He believes that if a particular brand of instrument has a long history, that particular company must be doing something right.

This practice leads to a great deal of customer satisfaction with the quality of the instruments Niemann sells. He believes in every product that he sells, and says he never sells an instrument that is not a good fit for the customer.

If ever there is a problem with an instrument, Niemann refers delicate work to craftsmen who specialize in instrument repair and acts as a proxy between the customer and the repairmen so that his standard of customer service will be upheld.

While an instrument is away being repaired, Niemann provides a temporary replacement instrument so that musicians can continue to practice or even perform if the need arises.

Niemann & Sons takes care of the environment as well as their customers, using heating and air conditioning systems that save energy, as well as energy-efficient lighting.

Recycling, particularly invoices, also plays a role, and all chemicals used to clean the instruments are environmentally safe. Some of these chemicals are biodegradable.

#### 11-25 employees HighCraft upholds high standards

The professionals at HighCraft Builders are concerned with more than simply getting more business. Founders Dwight Sailer and Bryan Soth work hard with their employees to make sure that customers are comfortable before the remodeling process begins, as it is happening, and after it is finished, leaving them thinking, "Thank heavens we chose






those guys."

Fort Collins-based HighCraft Builders understands that there are many options for people in Northern Colorado who want to improve their homes through remodeling, but they also know what sets them apart.

Employees adhere to a company value statement that is based on seven words: respect, humility, attitude, teamwork, mistakes, fun and family. These words are part of what keeps HighCraft grounded both in personal honor and in their families. According to the value statement, "family always takes priority over work."

The founders' commitment to providing straightforward and honest plans to their customers ensures the entire process is free from surprises. Because of this practice, the 13 people at HighCraft Builders have surpassed the expectations





of many customers.

Customer relations are so important at HighCraft that they are included in a section of the ethics policy to which each employee adheres. All employees are dedicated to building a relationship of trust with every client, and clients are their number one priority.

HighCraft uses a system of communication that alleviates the anxiety customers may feel when their homes are undergoing a remodel. Since remodeling a home can be a very costly process and brings builders into an intimate space, HighCraft believes that setting expectations and daily communication are of the utmost importance to gain and keep the client's trust.

Management at HighCraft also applies the philosophy of trust and honest communication with its employees, implementing an "open door" policy that helps maintain a positive attitude at the company. The policy works because it brings to attention issues that an employee may have and enables managers to help solve problems.

Management at HighCraft places a great deal of importance on letting their employees come up with solutions to problems by allowing them the flexibility to work their own way within the company's ethics guidelines. Sailer also acts as the company's ethics officer, and assists employees who need advice on how to best complete their tasks within the bounds of the policy.

Ethical practices also affect how HighCraft acts toward the environment. Before they begin a project, employees walk through the part of the building that will be remodeled and determine what is staying and what is not. The resources that are leaving the home are

recycled or reused elsewhere, as is all of the cardboard used to ship new items to

HighCraft Builders has been recognized twice as HBA Remodeler of the Year, in 2002 and 2008. They have also been featured in numerous publications and received three Chrysalis Awards in 2004 and 2005.

#### 26-99 employees Drahota delivers what it promises

"Doing business on a handshake," was the goal Terry Drahota set for himself and for his company when he founded Drahota Construction Co. in 1973. To Drahota, this means what is promised will be delivered.

The concepts of hard work and honesty run deep in this Fort Collins company, as well as a sense of community pride and a firm belief in environmental responsibility and workplace safety.

DCC places great importance upon training employees so that they can do their best, most educated work every day. The company makes use of a mentor program, which pairs new employees with those who are more experienced, so new employees don't feel alone when they begin. DCC employs 40 people, many of whom are Colorado State University graduates.

In order for tenured workers to stay current on their knowledge, DCC offers 'Tool Box Talks" on job sites.

Tool Box Talks are pulled from a database of thousands of short discussions on safety in the construction workplace. Drahota chooses one per week to discuss with employees, making sure they stay up-to-date on all the on-the-job safety measures they need to take.

These talks can relate to a particular job or chosen at random. Drahota usually picks a topic that relates to the current job so that the ideas discussed are fresh in the employees' minds.

The company also goes to great lengths to make sure that all employees feel respected and appreciated. DCC keeps a fully stocked refrigerator for lunch breaks, and offers flexible schedules so employees can take care of family needs that arise. Many employees even bring their dogs to work.

Employees also receive between three and five weeks of paid vacation time, depending on how long they have been with the company.

In keeping with the green initiatives that have become such a big part of Northern Colorado's culture, DCC has been part of the city of Fort Collins' Climate Wise program since 2006, and is currently a platinum member, the highest level of achievement.

Part of what makes DCC so green is its efforts to provide all staff members with a company bicycle to ride on local errands. Employees are also encouraged to use alternative forms of transportation to get to and from work. DCC even offers showers at its offices for those who choose to bike to work.

DCC also aims for very high standards of workplace safety. It participates in a program called Construction Health and Safety Excellence and works in tanwith Associated General Contractors, CSU and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration to perform safety audits.

These audits not only ensure a safe workplace for employees, but also make certain that the project will be a safe place after it is finished. Superintendents conduct daily inspections, and project managers inspect jobs weekly for compliance with drawing specifications, industry standards, and other safety measures.

#### Walker treats customers, workers right

Walker Manufacturing is a family company in every sense, from the team of two brothers who run the Fort Collins-based company, to "Family Reunions" that mark company milestones and bring together everyone considered part of the Walker family.

Bob and Dean Walker take pride in their ability to hire the best people and produce the best tractors and lawnmowing products while making sure that every customer gets the best service possible. The brothers firmly believe that

money should be the tool, not the goal, in a business.

One of the core beliefs at Walker is "Never ignore a request, be accessible." As part of his dedication to serving his customers, Bob Walker ensures that his calls and e-mails are never screened so that he may be immediately aware of a problem with any of Walker's products.

To better communicate with its customers, Walker sends out a semi-annual newsletter, "Walker Talks," to let customers know how the company is doing and what is on the horizon. The newsletter also features customers, letting them get involved with the company on a level beyond simply purchasing a product.

Customers can also interact with the people at Walker through events held periodically at the Walker factory near Timnath. Annually, Walker holds a Hymn Sing, which anyone can attend.

When the company reaches particular milestones, such as the production of their 100,000th unit in 2008, they invite clients and distributors who have assisted them in meeting a goal to celebrate with them at "Family Reunions."

Walker has 133 employees on its team, and most have been there a long time. The average tenure is 10 years, and this exceptionally low turnover rate is due to the way Walker treats workers and the rewards it gives for loyalty to the company.

At 15 years of service, employees are rewarded with a luxury watch. At 20 years, they receive \$20,000 cash, taxes already withheld; after 25 years, they receive an additional \$5,000, then \$7,500 at 30 years, and so forth.

In addition to monetary incentives to remain with the company, Walker makes

sure that its employees enjoy working there. The plant is run on a level-manufacturing schedule, so that the employees get a consistent number of hours all year.

When the economy took a downturn, Walker came up with an idea to allow employees to stay despite a decrease in workload. Employees were split up into teams and sent out to do community service with different organizations. Walker continued to pay them their usual compensation while they did work outside of the company, benefiting not only the employees, but also the community in general.

This is not a new concept at Walker, where employees spent nearly 590 hours volunteering last year. These hours were spent fixing up homes for the elderly, repairing facilities for local nonprofits and churches, and helping the Salvation Army.

Walker prides itself on the fact that it has never been the subject of an OSHA

inspection in its 35 years of operation.

Because of their commitment to product safety and quality, Walker was recognized in 2008 by its distributors for being "Exemplary and Honorable in Business."

#### Trihydro follows the ethical cowboy way

Trihydro Corp., headquartered in Laramie, doesn't use manuals or formal policies to operate in an ethical fashion. Instead, employees are instructed to work according to "The Code of the West," from James Owen's book "Cowboy Ethics."

This simple list of tenets by which to live includes instructions such as "finish what you start, take pride in your work, and ride for the brand." By following this down-to-earth code, Trihydro exhibits a great deal of trust in its employees to make the right decisions.

The company was founded in 1984 as a two-person environmental consulting firm. Today, there are 270 employees and 13 branches nationwide providing engineering, surveying, information technology, sustainable business solutions, air quality management and water and natural resource services in addition to environmental consulting.

Trihydro became successful by combining proper treatment of employees, honest dealings with clients, and quality work. The company begins by hiring talented, innovative employees, and retains these employees through extensive personal and familial support.

The company provides excellent benefits for their employees, including a package that allows senior employees an extra week of vacation for every year that they have been employed with the company.

Jack Bedessem, president and CEO of Trihydro, says that policy allows employees flexibility to take care of their families. The ability to be present for their children is one of the things that makes Trihydro employees proud of where they work.

Another source of pride for employees at Trihydro is the green initiative upheld by the company. As a company that offers environmental services, Trihydro places a great deal of importance upon reducing waste and recycling.

At corporate headquarters, the carpeting tiles are made from recycled plastic bottles and the break-room cabinets are constructed of material containing crushed sunflower seed hulls. Trihydro also has a Corporate Responsibility Committee to measure the results of all green policies within the company.

Trihydro also values safety, going above and beyond the 40 hours of safety training required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, requiring another 40 hours of company safety training, 10 hours of general construction training, and a weekly health and safety quiz completed by each employee.

All of these safety requirements help to communicate the message that employees are considered Trihydro's most important asset.

# The commercial valuation conundrum

#### Weight of distressed real estate dispersed unevenly in market

Lately I have been getting a fairly standard response when I tell people that I work in commercial real estate: A look of genuine concern followed by a question like "How is that going right now?"

It is at those moments that I am reminded that the general public largely associates "commercial real estate" with words such as "distressed," "troubled," "bankowned," "fore-closed," "bankrupt" and "toxic," probably due in large Joshua Guernsey part to the negative

headlines that saturate the daily news. In reality, the commercial real estate market is solidly in a recovery phase. Rental rates are stabilizing, vacancy rates are improving, many markets and property types are experiencing positive absorption, and transaction volumes are projected to double between 2010 and 2011.

However, despite the positive indica-

tors and my own personal sense of optimism, the impact that distressed real estate is having on the industry is certainly not just limited to public perception, and cannot be ignored.

Property values are top-of-mind for many people right now, particularly given that 2011 is a tax reassessment year. County assessors will be valuing property, which will determine property taxes to be paid in 2012-13. So how is distressed real estate weighing into commercial real estate valuations?

The valuation of commercial real estate has never been an exact science. In some cases valuation employs sophisticated modeling, and in others it absolutely defies logic, with the only possible explanation being that beauty is in the eye of the beholder.

#### Different approaches to valuation

To understand the role that distressed real estate is playing in valuations, it helps to first understand how commercial properties are valued by appraisers. The industry standard employs a combination/reconciliation of three different methodologies — the Income Approach, the Cost Approach and the Market Approach.

The income approach assesses the income and expenses associated with a property, and then applies a discount rate and/or capitalization rate to derive a value. The income approach can only be applied to improved properties with

Does distressed real estate influence the income approach? No, not directly, as the income is what it is for a given property, and the indirect effect is limited to the downward pressure on market rental and capitalization rates.

The cost approach calculates the replacement cost of the property. Construction costs have gone down throughout the downturn, partially associated with adjustments in material costs, but primarily driven by a competitive landscape that has contractors compressing profit margins and labor costs. Distressed real estate has had no direct affect on construction costs, but indirectly influences the land cost/value component of the replacement cost.

The market approach determines a property's value based upon an assessment of the recent sales of comparable properties. The market approach is most heavily relied upon for properties that don't have an income stream or improvements on which to calculate replacement cost — i.e., land.

Distressed real estate does have a direct impact on the market approach, and at present, it is the market approach that presents the greatest conundrum for commercial real estate appraisers. What is a "comparable sale"? Should considerations or adjustments be made for a sale that is motivated by a bank wanting to get a loan off its books? How

do you reconcile market comps for one value with distressed comps at 25 percent to 50 percent of that value?

These are questions with no definitive answers. Distressed real estate is presenting a valuation challenge on a level that has not been seen in decades, and arguably ever. How distressed real estate is factored into valuations will be something that appraisers, assessors, bankers and investors will have to grapple with well into the foreseeable future.

No matter what, the weight of distressed commercial real estate on valuations will continue to be unevenly dispersed. On the far end of the spectrum are assets that are valued incorporating the income and cost approaches; improved, class A, stable income, investment grade, "trophy" properties will continue to hold their value. They are being valued and trading at low cap rates, will continue to be in high demand by investors, and will be financed and refinanced with comparative ease.

At the opposite end of the spectrum are assets that are fully exposed to the market approach, drawing comparison to distressed asset sales. Deals involving these types of assets will continue to face valuation challenges. Transaction volume will be low as people struggle to finance these assets, and refinances will continue to be an uphill battle.

But if your shoulders hurt from carrying the disproportionate weight of declining property values, there is a silver lining to this conundrum. Those who have endured the most severe valuation declines are well positioned for relief when the 2011 tax assessments are issued.



#### **Creative Spirits**

Rob Caines attended a business conference that offered a Sip N Strokes event.

"I went crazy over it when I saw in action how much fun everyone was having," he said.

He promptly went home and sold his wife Patty on the idea. It took him only four months to come up with a complete business plan. Within a year's time they'd moved to Colorado to be near their adult children and opened Creative Spirits on South Mason Street in Fort Collins.

Caines says at one time he was inspired by Bob Ross, the TV painter of happy little trees, to pursue art. "But I saw how expensive all the art supplies would be," he said.

That is one reason Creative Spirits

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Wells Fargo

gears things for beginners and wraps a more formal approach to art instruction in a relaxed atmosphere. A session costs between \$25 and \$45 per person.

In addition to the openings and featured showings hosted at the in-house gallery, local and on-tour musicians make good use of the surprisingly fabulous acoustics to present concerts. "We enjoy promoting musicians and at the same time invite we new people into our building," Caines added.

#### **Gadabout Art**

Gadabout Art began as little more than a seed of an idea. When Lauren Howell made a presentation to the Fort Collins Art Lab, they caught her enthusiasm enough to sponsor a first-ever supper fundraiser last November. Before she knew it, Howell was in business, booking painting parties in venues all around Fort Collins.

She calls herself a "mobile painting instructor" and loves guiding these painting classes. "It is the most relaxing way to spend two hours of your time. You get friends, wine, a new experience and a piece of art you can take home and put on your wall."

All for only \$30; \$25 if you register early.

"Always have your eyes wide open because you never know where opportunities are going to be," she says about her business. She also encourages people who have never painted before to just try it. Gadabout Art brings everything needed to create a painting, including dropcloths, so there is no mess left behind at the end of class. When she's not gadding about, Howell has classes on Wednesday evenings at Tasty Harmony in Old Town and in May she'll be teaching in the Beer Garden at The Equinox Brewery on

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Remington Street.

Clever names and artsy paintings are the hallmark of the movement. Canvas and Cocktails has locations in Cherry Creek and Southglenn in Denver; Whimsey Paint and Sip harks from Erie and Painting with a Twist (aka Corks N Canvas) has franchises in Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, North Carolina, Tennessee and Texas.

So what is it about this friends, wine, and paint combination that has everyone flocking to grab a smock and palette for an evening's entertainment? Caines said one man told him, "I went to school and majored in history and math. But this woke up something inside me I never knew I had."

The truth is, some people just have a blast for one evening. But others, some who have never painted before, fall in love with it. All they had to do was show up.

and oversees accounting, finance, evidence storage, concealed handgun permits and internal affairs. His salary matches that of Patrol Captain John Manago — \$111,711.

One of Christensen's first — and biggest — assignments was literally a baptism by fire. He helped with public relations and interagency coordination in connection with the Crystal Fire that eventually burned more than 3,000 acres west of Fort Collins and destroyed at least 13 homes earlier this month.

"That's the biggest thing that's happened so far," he said, adding that there hasn't really been a dull moment in the three months he's been with the department. "But there's always something."

#### Still part of Chrisland

Christensen said he still checks in with Chrisland once or twice a week and remains a co-owner with Ryan Schaeffer, who was named company president in December and runs the day-to-day operations.

Christensen said the arrangement is so far working well. "I think the change has brought some new energy to the company," he said. "And it's allowed me to do something I'm passionate about."

Schaeffer agrees with that assessment. "It's been extremely good," he said. "In 2011 our activity has been very strong. I'm as busy as I've been in my career right now, although the transaction sizes are smaller."

Schaeffer said he is very happy for his partner, who had another opportunity to take a position in Minnesota law enforcement in 2006 but passed on it because he didn't want to leave the area. "He thought long and hard about taking that position, and he probably thought another opportunity like that wouldn't come along again. But one did, and it's kind of a dream come true."

Sheriff Smith said he's happy to have Christensen on board.

"I never thought I'd have a chance to bring someone like him into the agency," he said. "I was looking for a wild card, someone who would shake things up and be really out of the mold. When I saw how committed Nick was in the community, I saw that as a real boost. And it is."

Smith said Christensen's initial jitters about the new job were soon dissipated. "When he walked in he wasn't sure how he'd be received as a civilian brought into a top-tier level. But the feedback I'm getting is that they're really appreciative of what he's bringing to the agency."

And that's a shared feeling, Christensen said. "I feel very fortunate to have the opportunity to do this," he said. "I'm very glad to be here."

first exploratory wells."

Though timelines are hard to peg, some oil and gas companies are cautiously releasing employment estimates and are working with community colleges to prepare workers for jobs in the industry. Noble Energy plans to add 45 jobs in Northern Colorado by the end of the year. Noble has approximately 750 employees in the state, 300 of which are in Northern Colorado.

"We're hiring across disciplines right now and need jobs with a wide variety of pay grades, ranging in salary from the mid-30s all the way up to \$100,000 per year," said Noble Energy Public Relations Representative Jonathan Ekstrom.

Oil and gas jobs encompass many specializations including field technicians, contractors, geologists and financial analysts, but the initial job surge will likely occur in the field.

"If it (the exploratory drilling) proves to be as successful as we hope it will be we will put a premium on field-level employees, people that have a high school diploma or GED," Dill said. "Most have to have a valid driver's license and in general no criminal record. We value a lot of familiarity with mechanical aptitude and people who enjoy working with their hands and working outside."

#### **Beyond OJT**

On-the-job training is an industry standard, but Front Range Community College's Larimer Campus and Aims Community College in Greeley are working with the industry to better prepare students for job openings.

FRCC has a two-year clean-energy technology program that can be applied to many industries including oil and gas. The Energy Boost program, on the other hand, is a short-term program that was created two years ago specifically to fill job vacancies in the energy sector. FRCC, Vestas Blades America and regional utilities developed the program when Vestas announced plans to build its first North American factory in Windsor in 2007.

"We deliver this program when it's needed and we take a look at the audience that we're delivering to," said FRCC Director of Workforce Development Lynn Vosler. "If it's for folks that are unemployed, we can deliver the classes Monday through Friday for about two and a half weeks. If people who are currently working need to take the program, we can do nights and weekends."

Vosler said the 92 content hours that make up the Energy Boost program change depending on industry need.

"We only do this when a company is looking to hire a lot of people," Vosler

Front Range is currently working with oil and gas companies to facilitate the next Energy Boost session in Brighton.

"We plan on doing information sessions first so people really understand what jobs are in the oil and gas industry," Vosler said. "We try to get a lot of companies involved so folks going through the training will have a variety of options based on what works best for them."

Aims also has a history of helping large employers create a regional workforce. Several months ago, Anadarko Petroleum Co. approached the school about hosting a 10-hour Safeland course, which is an industry environmental health and safety program.

Now Aims is looking at creating curriculum specifically designed to train those interested in working in the oil and gas industry.

"Because Aims Community College is aware of the enormous growth that's expected in the oil and gas industry because of the Niobrara oil and gas deposit, we are in communications with oil and gas producers so we can help develop education and training programs for a career pathway in oil and gas," said Associate Dean for Corporate Education Don Sosnowski.

In mid-April, Aims hosted an oil and gas summit and the college is continuing to work on developing an oil and gas-related curriculum.

"We're working and talking and dialoging with the companies because we just know there's going to be so much growth and demand," Sosnowski said. "We just don't know how much."



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





plans to use the Lumian AGS 4000 to produce standardized biomass for jet fuel testing experiments in collaboration with the U.S. Air Force and the University of Central Florida.

The Lumian AGS 4000, said Joanna Money, vice president of business development for Solix, is "all-in-one, fully integrated, plug-and-play, all you need to harvest algae," along with sources of water, power and carbon dioxide.

The sales pitch and equipment repurposing are part of the broader set of services from Solix in 2011. The company, which opened in 2006 as a CSU-hatched venture and spinoff, has also revamped its name — from Solix Biofuels to Solix BioSystems — as part of its recalibrated focus on alternative markets and uses for algae beyond fuels.

In five years' time, hyped expectations and a wave of investment for algae and biofuels have fallen away to reality, according to José Olivares, biofuels program manager at Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico and director of the National Alliance for Advanced Biofuels and Bioproducts, a consortium of 30-plus businesses and research institutions, including Solix and CSU.

"I think companies, like Solix and many others, have realized for some time there are current limitations to the technology," Olivares said. "Current methods are not going to compete with the petroleum market."

Algae was once hailed as pond-scum wonder-fuel that would replace petroleum and gasoline. But gaps in technology have limited cheap and efficient production. In the deflated market, some algae companies have disappeared, while others, such as Solix, have repositioned themselves and adjusted operations to pursue avenues other than biofuels.

"I truly believe there's going to be an algae industry," Money said. "What products are going to be produced from algae is unknown, but I think fuel is almost certainly going to be one of them."

#### Hype and hope

Solix has weathered the ups and downs in the biofuels market, but not without some setbacks. This past January, the company announced that CEO Doug Henston and CFO David Maytubby had resigned; chief technology officer Joel Butler has since taken over as CEO.

Money said the turnover was part of "a natural evolution" that many startup companies endure, and that Butler's experience in technology commercialization fits well with the next phase for the business. Some market analysts, however, have speculated the moves have been related to disappointing production at the company's Coyote Gulch demonstration plant in southwestern Colorado, which first opened in summer 2009.

In March, Solix announced its name change, along with news that the company had secured over \$16 million in investments from the first part of its Series B financing round. The funding will support the company's push into commercial production and sales of the AGS 4000. But several previous investors, namely Valero Energy, were not included on the financing list, also raising flags with observers.

The released list doesn't mean more financing won't come forward, Money said, and Solix officials believe the AGS 4000 offers advantages in cultivation methods to attract buyers and promote progress

toward cheaper biofuels production.

"When I joined the company, algae was a hope, but also a lot of hype with people reporting data that was way out of line," Money said. "The technology has advanced enough that I think algae oil is a reality. It's just a matter of technology and investment."

It is also a matter of finding other uses for products derived from cultivated algae. Last fall, Solix inked an agreement with the global chemical company BASF "to investigate the use of algae to produce certain chemicals."

At the Coyote Ridge facility, Solix plans to be converting cultivated algae to crude algae oil by this summer. The oil can then be sold to manufacture bioplastics, fertilizers, animal feed, and a range of health supplements and antioxidants, sometimes called "nutraceuticals." The sales of the AGS 4000 should also enable other companies to test various strains

of algae to see which are best suited for different climates and uses.

By turning attention to the alternative markets and products, Solix can demonstrate and develop algae-oil technology, Money said. "We're really trying to target multiple markets. Biofuels is one of them."

#### **Biofuel future?**

Solix and other companies might not be giving up on biofuels, but forays into other markets signal that manufacturing affordable fuel from algae is more of a long-term goal. In particular, businesses must figure out how to reduce water and power use to run the photobioreactors, which would increase yields and decrease costs.

Olivares of the national biofuels consortium said companies must build up the size of operations to increase productivity, but that hasn't happened yet. In terms of commercial production, even Solix's Coyote Ridge site, which is

cultivating over 150,000 liters of algae in three growth systems on three-fourths of an acre, is relatively small.

Still, Olivares said the biofuels market isn't just a pipe dream.

"I don't see major roadblocks. We're producing fuels today out of algae. The barriers are really: Can we produce those fuels at a competitive price? In order to do that, we need to scale up," he said.

Initiatives, such as the January announcement by the U.S. Department of Defense to significantly reduce petroleum use and employ alternative fuels for its fleet of vehicles, could play a big role in supporting research and investment and larger biofuels pilot projects. Moving beyond the biofuels hype that surrounded the industry just a few years ago should also temper future expectations.

In the meantime, Olivares said, "Developing some of these intermediate markets is critical."



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
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

and function only as managers of the assets.

#### Long history of entrepreneurship

Keith has a long history of entrepreneurship in Northern Colorado, starting AppleOne Employment Services of Colorado in 1991. He sold the company in 1996 to Corestaff Services and then cofounded Center Partners, a call center business, in 1997.

In 1999, Keith sold Center Partners to the London-based WPP Group but continued as an executive with the company, heading up its call center services division. In 2002, Keith's Center Partners success was recognized with the Ernst and Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award for the Rocky Mountain Region.

In 2003, he founded Private Escapes Destination Clubs, which was acquired by Ultimate Resorts in 2009. Keith was a highlevel executive in Ultimate Escapes — the new club's name after the merger — until his resignation in October 2010.

Keith is candid about the demise of Ultimate Escapes, a merger that seemed like a good opportunity for club members in 2007 when the real estate market was still hot and the economic crash of late 2008 was hardly more than a distant rumble.

Although a letter of intent to merge was signed in 2007, it took another two

years to complete the deal. In September 2009, Keith said Private Escapes became an 8 percent minority partner in Ultimate Escapes, in a real estate market that was dramatically different than in 2007.

By the summer of 2010, Ultimate Escapes was operating at a loss and a last-minute attempt to merge with another vacation company fell through. The Fort Collins office of Ultimate Escapes was quietly closed in an attempt to stem losses, but on Sept. 20, 2010, the company went into voluntary Chapter 11 bankruptcy, declaring debts of between \$100 million and \$500 million and assets of less than \$50 million. Those who plunked down between \$100,000 and \$300,000 for lifetime access to Ultimate Escapes' vacation properties were left in the lurch.

Although the bankruptcy is still proceeding in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court in Delaware, Keith said any hope of restructuring under Chapter 11 is unlikely. It is probably headed toward a Chapter 7 asset liquidation.

#### Avoiding mistakes

Keith said he resigned from Ultimate Escapes on Oct. 1, and immediately began planning another luxury destination model that would avoid the mistakes of Ultimate Escapes.

"I said, 'What have we learned from this industry to create a far safer model?' We took four months to create this product and right out of the gate the No. 1 concern was how do we mitigate the risk?"

Keith said under the Lifestyle Asset Group model, members join an LLC to purchase and own a luxury property with an average value of \$2.5 million. Each member makes a one-time contribution of \$300,000 and has a one-eighth ownership in that property.

Each LLC will have a seven-year life, after which the property will be sold and the proceeds divided among its owners. Keith said seven years was chosen because it is the average length of time most people maintain a membership in a private club and also the amount of time it takes to fully emerge from an economic downturn.

Keith said the club intends to eventually sign up 200 members to own 24 luxury properties. The company's properties now include a mansion in Charleston, S.C.; the Blue Sky Lodge in Deer Valley, Utah; and a residential community in Cabo San Lucas, Mexico.

Lifestyle Asset Group opened its Fort Collins office in November but only took its product public in late March. Keith

### Former members staying home

FORT COLLINS – As former Private/Ulitmate Escapes owner Richard Keith launches a new luxury destination business, several former members say they're not interested in joining because they still feel the financial burn.

Chris Ray, owner of Vantage Properties
Management LLC, said he was traveling in Europe
when he received the news that Ultimate Escapes
had filed for bankruptcy and had canceled club
member vacation reservations.

"I really had to scramble for other lodging," said Ray, who had invested \$200,000 in his club membership a few years earlier. "They just kind of left everybody high and dry."

J.D. Padilla, owner of Post Modern Development, paid \$300,000 to be in the club and feels angry but powerless to do anything about his loss.

"I lost quite a bit of money on this," he said.
"Most people just went and joined another club or
they're too busy to fight (Keith). Is it worth it to
go get my \$300 grand back? I'm not very happy
about it. Maybe a class-action suit is what we
need to do."

Stu MacMillan, president of Colorado State
University Real Estate
Office and EverittMacMillan Development,
said he enjoyed his four
years as a member of the
Private Escapes/Ultimate
Escapes clubs. "I thought
the destinations were in

good places," he said. "From the standpoint of customer services, the locations and facilities were all done very well."

But MacMillan said he eventually saw the business model as too risky. "Everybody was thinking real estate was such a great deal and all they had to do was buy something and borrow against it and it would always be great," he said. "I guess I can't be terribly angry at them for doing what everybody else was doing."

Gary Hoover, chairman of Hartford Homes, was one of the first to join Private Escapes. "I can say from a personal enjoyment standpoint that I had a lot of great vacations and stayed in a lot of great places," he said.

But Hoover said the merger with Ultimate Resorts ultimately "compromised the model they had based the company on," with properties leveraged at 80 percent to 90 percent of their appraised value.

"Where it fell apart was because the loan payments were so high," he said. "When the economy went bad, they could not sell enough new memberships to feed the monster they created."

Hoover and other former Private/Ultimate Escapes members say they have been approached by Keith and Lifestyle Asset Group to see if they want to invest in the new business model that focuses on member ownership.

But Hoover, who lost his \$165,000 membership fee, said, "That's just an absurdity to me.

MacMillan said he's through with vacation clubs of any kind.

"I'd hoped to have my Ultimate Escapes membership well into my retirement but now I'm going to have to look for other ways to go," he said. "At this point, I don't have any desire to put my money into another club."

said the timing for a new vacation ownership model and for picking up luxury properties in a still-cool real estate market couldn't be better.

He cited an American Express-Harrison Group study that predicts a jump in high-end consumer spending in 2011 and property values that are as much as 40 percent lower than they were in early 2008.

"We think the timing is good on both levels," he said.

which expires at the end of May, has become tangled in D.C. politics, while larger technology industries are hoping to wrest away a share of the program funds. A suspension or end to the program could alter growth trajectories for small companies and also slow job creation in the local economy.

#### **Growth through SBIR funding**

Arguably, no northern Colorado company has been as successful as Numerica at growing its business through SBIR. The firm has developed its concentrations on missile defense, cyber security, geospatial information systems, and space situational awareness, in part, around SBIR projects.

Since 2002, Numerica has won 63 SBIR contracts, and the company has received \$26 million through the program since 2005, according to Becky Jensen, Numerica's marketing manager. This past February, Numerica was among 44 businesses honored with the Tibbetts Award, which recognizes companies that have used SBIR to advance innovation, research and development, and job and revenue growth. The firm then landed its largest-ever SBIR award in March, an impressive \$3 million contract to work on the Missile Defense Agency's airborne infrared sensor system.

"Without SBIR supporting us, we probably would not be as involved as we are at the national level," said Numerica President Jeff Poore. "There's no doubt that SBIR has had a profound impact on Numerica."

Coordinated by the U.S. Small Business Administration, SBIR programs exist at 11 federal agencies that have \$100-million-plus research budgets, from the Department of Education to NASA. Through SBIR, and its sister program, the Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) program, which provides money for projects that also include academic or nonprofit institutions, each department dedicates 2.5 percent of its research funds to small businesses, those with 500 or fewer employees.

Phase I contracts, usually below \$100,000, provide funds to test product concepts, and Phase II contracts then offer additional funding, reaching into the millions, to create market-ready projects and product prototypes. According to the nonprofit National Small Business Association, SBIR has helped generate more than 50,000 patents; presently, SBIR-supported projects contribute to seven new patents per day.

For the most part, the program has been seen as a win-win proposition, advancing government research needs and boosting small businesses. But that popularity has also led to the legislative bottleneck threatening the future of

#### Weighed down with amendments

With the program set to sunset this May, Congress has been considering several bills to extend SBIR. But some members have used the legislation as a "Christmas tree," tacking on non-related, and often controversial, amendments to a bill that would otherwise pass without much opposition. Lawmakers have offered 124 amendments to Senate Bill 493 meant to continue SBIR; revisions have been aimed at deficit reduction, tax-credit extensions, and unemployment compensation cuts, among other pet projects. The flurry of amendments has stalled the progress of the bill, which already makes changes to SBIR.

The Senate bill would significantly increase the percentage of funds available to venture-capital-backed companies. SBIR dollars are currently available to small businesses that receive venture capital backing and to other companies

that rely on venture capital for less than half of their funds, said NSBA vice president of public affairs Molly Branson, but some businesses want the program expanded. The biotechnology industry, in particular, has advocated for including larger venture-capital enterprises.

The compromises to the program aren't ideal, but they're acceptable to the small-business community, Branson said, especially because the Senate bill would raise the SBIR portion of agencies' budgets to 3.5 percent. The legislation would also extend SBIR for eight years, a relatively long time after the program's existence has relied on short-term continuing resolutions over the last decade.

A competing bill that divvies even more of the funds to larger companies and venture-capital-oriented business without increasing the SBIR allocations is also making waves and delaying a resolution. If Congress doesn't pass a meas-

ure before the program sunsets, SBIR might receive another short-term extension, but the uncertainty could undermine not only small businesses, but also local economies.

"The money is not flowing as freely as it ought to," Branson said. "And that stymies innovation and development as well as the small firms that are trying to create these innovations and create jobs."

The Northern Colorado Economic Development Corp. backs that up, estimating that for every job created by regional small tech companies like Numerica, the "spinoff effect" adds another 1.63 jobs in the community.

"It's interesting a program this successful has been so controversial with people," said Numerica's Poore. "I think a lot of people don't appreciate how large a footprint small business has in economic development."

#### Show us where our tax dollars are really going

You say you spent 12 hours completing your tax forms this year but don't have that feeling of accomplishment that comes from a job well done?

You say you want to pay what you owe, but GE and some of our wealthiest citizens don't seem to be on that same page?

You say taxes are what we pay to provide the benefits of government to all members of our democratic society, but someone in Washington whose paycheck would not be in danger from a government shutdown calls your livelihood — military personnel, Medicare providers, unionized public service workers — non-essential "out-ofcontrol spending"?

Is that what's bothering you, Bunky? You're not alone.

A pre-Tax Day poll by the Associated Press found that while in general Americans are slightly likely to say that they think the tax rate they pay is somewhat or very fair, a majority of those between the ages of 30 and 65 think they're paying too much. Unmarried males are particularly unhappy with what they pay, although the divide between Democrats and Republicans isn't as wide as Congressional posturing makes it seem.

Another study, by the Tax Policy Center, found that for the past two years, a family of four earning the median income has actually paid less in federal income taxes than at any time since at least 1955. The highest income tax bracket is the lowest since 1992, giving the United States the lowest revenues as a percentage of GDP of seven industrialized nations, according to the Congressional Research Services. We also have the lowest spending percentage, but the biggest gap between revenues and expenditures at 10.5 percent.

Could this have anything to do with record deficits?

We've heard lots about cutting federal spending, but we're not entirely clear where all our tax dollars are being spent now. Wouldn't it be great to get a receipt from the IRS showing how much of vour annual contribution goes to which "out-of-control" program?

An official federal tax receipt isn't available yet, but you can generate your own at a website run by the think tank Third Way — www.thirdway.org/taxre-

Enter the dollar amount of your federal tax bill and the site calculates exactly how much you ponied up for Social Security, Defense and Medicare (the top three budget items) as well as Arts and Culture, the District of Columbia and the White House (the bottom three).

Maybe some day we could say where our own dollars should go, too.



## Insights into NISP benefits from a community partner

Northern Integrated Supply Project continues to garner headlines in the region. I thought it would be helpful to have some insight from a community that will be a beneficiary of this farsighted vision of creating water storage by our growing community of Frederick.

NISP is an integral part of the long-term health of our community and the other participants involved. It is the most proactive partnership to be seen by the communities and water districts and will result in an ability to meet the long-term needs of our population both current and

NISP involves building a storage facility called Glade Reservoir north of Fort Collins and Galeton Reservoir northeast of Greeley. The efforts of the communities involved will protect the health and use of the agricultural waters that are being removed from farms across northeastern Colorado at an alarming rate. Without this project, municipalities will look to drying up productive farm lands through the purchase of agricultural water rights.

One only needs to look at what Thornton, Aurora and other metro communities have done over the last 20 years to understand the negative impact such dry-up of farmland causes. Thornton alone has purchased and will dry up over 21,000 acres of productive farm land to satisfy their water needs. Imagine if each community involved in NISP did the same.

By responsibly working together we are seeking to protect the rights of farmers to irrigate their lands in northeastern Colorado and the Weld County region (still one of the best-producing and strongest agricultural counties in the United States). At the same time by establishing NISP for future use by communities we ensure the ability to meet the municipal demand.

Growth is and will continue in the Front Range communities along the I-25 corridor. We must be poised to meet those growing demands of primary employers and others who desire to have their workforce live, work and play in the community in which they establish their businesses.

The NISP participants are gathering support for this project from a varied group of individual and business leaders as well as Chambers of Commerce and agricultural interests. Club 20, the premier voice of West Slope interests, has endorsed this effort and understands the importance and value of this project. To date the participants have spent over \$9 million to work through review and design processes. It is now with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to review and indicate whether the project can move forward. Many political leaders from both parties are supporting this project.

#### **Shared commitment**

Most of the largest communities along the north Front Range were foresighted many years ago to ensure their water portfolio and participated in projects similar to NISP. Pioneer leaders in water resources development mentioned more than once to me, through the years, to find and create new sources of water storage if you wish to maintain and grow your community. It

is now time for Frederick, Erie, Firestone, Windsor, Dacono and other communities to have that same shared vision and commitment to adequate and reliable water for future use.

The NISP effort is using existing water that otherwise flows to our neighboring state of Nebraska. In fact, had we had the NISP project built two years ago it would have been filling rapidly with the excellent snowpack from the last two years. Despite what some naysayers indicate NISP enhances and enlivens the Poudre River and provides for better and more predictable flows through much of the river.

Those who would oppose the project seem to be raising their heads and hand at every turn to place roadblocks that only cost the project more dollars and do nothing to improve the project. It is one thing to oppose for solid reasoning and based on fact and science. But, in this case, those opposed seem to only

- Get back to basics: Would you rather try to grow your business and go bankrupt, or shrink the company and survive? Sometimes it's better to concentrate on that core value which is extremely valuable to your customers and give up the optional extras, because you'll conserve your cash until the market starts to grow again. This can be an incredibly tough decision to make, but may be necessary for the survival of your company.
- Restructure your products or **services:** I see a great number of cases where the structure of customer offerings is no longer appropriate for an economy where people are pinching every penny. If you ask for a large payment at the beginning of a project, for instance, you might be asking the customer to take on too much risk.

Perhaps you require your customers to purchase bundles that are much larger than what they need. When you do this, you're opening up the door to new competition that's not constrained by past structure, who can deliver something much closer to the customer's need at a more appropriate price.

- Give customers options for payment: It's not as simple as just constantly reducing your prices. Many times, people just want options which better fit into their cash flow needs. Occasionally this can mean that customers want to pay earlier, such as with year-end tax breaks. More often, they just need to find ways to pay you when they have money come available. That might be on payday, on a predictable monthly cycle, or when a business gets paid by their own customers.
- Work your Accounts Receivable: It's not uncommon for customers and partners to use the weak economy as an excuse to stress your payment terms to the edge. But if you've done your part of the bargain, it's appropriate to get paid according to the agreed terms. When negotiating contracts, make sure that you're creating a fair and sustainable balance for both you and the other party.

Hiring an expert who can ensure you get paid on time can be a sound decision, perhaps immediately paying for the cost. Just make sure that this person works to maintain the larger relationship. If you hand things to a collections agency, then you've decided that the relationship is no longer worth maintaining, and that it's OK to lose this customer and anyone they might have referred.

#### **■** Expand your uniqueness:

Customers will pay for something which is unique and has compelling value for them. Perhaps that does not include your products, which may be easy for competitors to provide. Maybe it's the quality of experience you provide, lasting customer satisfaction, or auxiliary services.

I've actually been impressed by the number of companies which have shown that my loyalty is important to them, and work hard to ensure that I have reasons to prefer them over their competitors. Most don't, of course, but you can bet that I take my business to those that do.

If you want to survive the current economy and emerge as a future leader, then it's critical to use this time to examine your business, and adapt as swiftly as possible. Growth is quite possible for those who are resourceful and attentive and take focused action.

Q: What aspects of ownership have been the most rewarding and unexpected?

A: My biggest reward has been coming to understand how powerful we can be. Being in this industry is a gift because people are so interested in what we're doing, and I don't want to squander it. I want to spread the power. I still have 'Pinch me!' moments. I walk in and I can't believe this is our brewery. Watching our people get married, have children, and grow into their professional lives and their community involvement is really rewarding and really fun.

**Q:** What's most important for employees?

A: Key employee attributes are enthusiasm and dedication, which are slightly different but go hand in hand. We want generally good people who are decent human beings and are committed to community. And there has to be execution. We get a lot of things done around here.

Q: Do you recommend an MBA for an entrepreneur? Any recommended training or resources?

A: We don't look for people with MBAs when we hire. It is important to have the ability to read financial statements, understand ratios, and have a good overview of general HR legal policy, but you can learn all those things on the Web or you can hire people to do them.

Mastermind groups would probably be worth doing, once I'm not so busy. I have also used business coaches and I'm sure I'll use one again.

Q: Do you have a slogan to live by or what might your tombstone say?

**A:** "We are right where we're supposed to be." I think that would be funny on a tombstone. I am also very fond of

George Fox's saying, "Let your life speak." **Q:** Is there anything else you'd share

with an aspiring entrepreneur? A: It's important to love what you do. It is not unusual to work 15 hours a day at the beginning of any entrepreneurial venture. It's not unlike raising a baby. In that early period, it takes a lot of dedication and nurturing, the equivalent of work. Babies move into childhood, go to school, begin to take less of your time. The same progression applies to a business. If you're still having dinner table conversations about work on most nights and your business is more than 5 years old, then I'd say you haven't figured out how to balance those things. In anything you do, it is particularly satisfying when you figure out what feeds your soul and get that into the mix.

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#### Blueprints recognizes companies that keep moving forward

A letter from Publisher Jeff Nuttall

There's no denying that the 21st century has not been kind to the construction industry. The latest figures from the Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that between February 2001 and February 2011, the state of Colorado has lost nearly 60,000 construction-related jobs – closer to 70,000 from the high-water mark in July 2007, just before the housing bust signaled the beginning of the Great Recession.

And while economists tell us the recession "officially" ended in June 2009, many industries, including construction, continue to suffer. There have been some bright spots in Northern Colorado, in commercial and multifamily building, but our own regional economist John Green predicts that the modest gains made in residential construction in 2010 may not be repeated this year.

All the more reason for the Northern Colorado Business Report to recognize the local companies that continue to persevere in this dismal economy. You will find them here in Blueprints, both on our ranked lists and in the company directory in the back of this publication.

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# Aging CSU dorms get green upgrades

#### Corbett, Parmelee renovations set to begin in May

University is planning a series of renovations to two of its residence halls this spring to not only add capacity but also save energy and improve available amenities for students.

The multi-phase construction projects will give Corbett and Parmelee Halls a fresh look, energy-efficient features, and, in Parmelee's case, an extra floor full of student rooms.

The renovation of Corbett Hall will include a new brick façade, energy-efficient windows and gabled roofs. Corbett, which first opened in 1965, is CSU's largest residence hall, housing 900 students in suite-style rooms, with one bathroom for every two dorm rooms.

Fort Collins-based Dohn
Construction is the general contractor
on both projects, which will begin May
16, when students leave the halls for
summer vacation.

According to Tonie Miyamoto, CSU's Housing and Dining Services
Administration Director, the first phase of the Corbett renovation will include wings F and G, which face Laurel Street, and is scheduled to be completed by the time students return for this fall's semester.


The rest of the renovation could take place in either one or two phases, Miyamoto said. The other four wings could be finished together if time permits, or split into two separate phases if necessary. The renovation could be complete in time for the fall 2012 semester or could be extended to end just before the fall 2013 semester.

Regardless of completion time, construction in Corbett will happen only during summer vacations. When the renovations to the building are complete, the courtyard at the center of Corbett Hall will be upgraded as a place where students can play volleyball or basketball, or do their homework or eat at the picnic tables.

Currently, only one side of the courtyard is open, but the renovation will open up the opposite side as well so that students can walk all the way through to the main campus.

The original green tiles covering the outside of Corbett will be removed, sandblasted, have the CSU ram logo inlaid, and be for sale to alumni in the CSU bookstore this summer to help pay for the project.

Phase one of the estimated \$6 million Corbett project is expected to cost \$1.6 million.

Funds for these projects do not come from the state budget, student fees, or tuition, Miyamoto said. Instead, residence hall construction projects are funded through the Housing and Dining Services operating budget.

#### Parmelee pops up, goes green

The Parmelee Hall project will continue into the fall semester, when half of the building will be under construction while students live in the other half.

When the students return from winter break for spring semester 2012, they will move into the completed half of the building while construction begins on the other half. Moving supplies and assistance will be available for the residents, who will not be charged extra room and board to live in the newly renovated building.

"Moving halfway through the year is payment enough," Miyamoto said.

A fourth floor will be added to the hall, making room for an additional 120 beds, with new carpeting and a centralized elevator. Other amenities to be added are a new student kitchen, study rooms and lounges, and a revamped

laundry room. Gabled roofs will also be added to Parmelee.

When the fourth floor is completed, only returning students will be able to live there, an effort aimed at keeping upperclassmen in on-campus housing. These rooms will feature lofted ceilings and air conditioning, according to the Housing and Dining Services website.

In keeping with CSU's green initiatives, the renovations in both Corbett and Parmelee will make the buildings more energy-efficient and sustainable. The windows that will be installed are 300 percent more energy efficient than the original windows, according to Miyamoto.

"Students will benefit from the energy efficiency because it will lower the utility bills for the halls as a whole and that will enable us to keep their costs low," said Jim Dolak, executive director of housing and dining services.

CSU is "rebranding" its residence halls to make them more energy efficient and give them a residential look, Dolak added. In addition to the new windows, highly rated insulation will be placed behind the brick facades. The same insulation and windows were used in renovations performed on Edwards and Ingersoll Halls, resulting in a 50 percent decline in steam use in the first three months of operations.

In Parmelee, ultra-low-flow shower-heads and a mechanical ventilation system with energy-recovery capability will also be installed. The system works by extracting 72 percent of the energy from the air exiting the building and using it to preheat or pre-cool the air, Miyamoto explained.

In addition, 98 percent of the existing structure will be reused in the renovation, and xeriscaping will replace traditional landscaping to minimize water usage. Bike racks to accommodate 80 percent of residents will be added to promote students' use of alternative methods of transportation.

In May 2012, Braiden Hall will undergo a renovation similar to Parmelee's, also allowing it to house an additional 120 students. The cost of renovating both Parmelee and Braiden is expected to total \$26 million.

# Noble Energy about to begin new district office

**Greeley location prime to support operations in Niobrara formation**

REELEY — Noble Energy is poised to take full advantage of their leases in the exciting Niobrara play in Weld County with a new building in the Highpointe Business Park just outside of Greeley. Designed by Denver-based Barber Architecture, the regional field office is scheduled to break ground within the next few weeks.

Highpointe, five miles east of Interstate 25 at the U.S. Highway 34 and Colorado Highway 257 interchange, is well located for the Houston-based firm, whose northern region headquarters are in Denver. The company reportedly looked at existing buildings before deciding to construct this new facility.

The new District 15 field operations center will replace an office in Platteville and hold up to 300 employees. The old office will be given a new yet-to-be released purpose, according Jon Ekstrom, Noble spokesman. Platteville employees will be transferred and new

employees will likely be added; Noble Energy currently has 45 positions on its job boards. The building should be complete by the end of the first quarter in

2012. General Contractory is GE Johnson Constructruction, based in Denver.

Noble Energy is using Barber Architecture, an award-winning firm whose diverse project portfolio includes working on public, corporate and residential projects. Among other projects throughout Colorado, Barber Architecture did the design for the 1,000,000 square foot Hewlett-Packard Harmony Park Technology Center campus in Fort Collins. The firm also completed a remodel of the Noble regional headquarters, which occupy 10 levels of the World Trade Center in Denver.

Only a few details are available for the District 15 office, Ekstrom said. Located on a 23-acre site, the 66,520-square-foot office will be ribbed pre-cast concrete with combo glass and aluminum curtain wall and punctured windows. An aluminum curtain wall is typically a non-structural part of a building used to keep out the weather and reduce building

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sway induced by wind. The aluminum often frames glass.

While the District 15 office can house hundreds of employees, and will contain some administrative functions, on a given day, about half the employees will be in the field.

And it's a big field. Noble Energy's largest project area is in the Denver-Julesburg basin, Wattenberg field, Estrom said. Today, the company has 7,000 wells in the Wattenberg field with leases to drill 830,000 acres; 400,000 of them are immediately around Greeley. The rest of the lease is located in Northeast Colorado and Southeast Wyoming.

The company has been in the area for over 25 years. Twenty-one Noble wells have been online for more than 30 years with a 30-day average of over 500 barrels of oil equivalent per day at 45 percent to 75 percent liquid content, according to

the company's website.

#### The Field and the Wells

Noble Energy is just one of about 50 companies in the Niobrara field, and, like most oil companies, they lease their rigs. Ensign Drilling, headquartered in Calgary, Alberta, provides both rigs and crew for Noble Energy. Ensign also transports the rigs from site to site.

While horizontal drilling has been in the news lately, of the 550 wells Noble Energy plans to drill in the upcoming years, only 70 of them will be horizontal — that's up from 27 last year. "There is still a lot of drilling that is vertical or directional," Ekstrom said, adding that horizontal drilling was still an important part of Noble Energy's business. Ekstrom pointed out that the technology for horizontal drilling isn't new, it's been around since the 1950s, but that the relatively

new 3D seismic imaging, which provides a photo of the underground geologic formations, is one of the aspects that has made it easier.

Horizontal wells, with their different pipe specifications, are more expensive, but have a reputation for being more productive. The production ratio for horizontal wells versus vertical wells is 3.2-to-1, while the cost ratio of horizontal versus vertical wells is only 2-to-1, according to horizontaldrilling.org.

According to Ron Scheeff, oil and gas equipment expert at American Augers, based in Ohio, horizontal drilling is still vertical drilling because you vertically drill into a horizontal platform. It's made more complicated and more expensive by hydraulic fracturing, or fracking, a process where water and chemicals are pumped into the well under pressure to create cracks in the strata to release the oil.

In horizontal drilling you'll drill down 500 feet and then begin to build the curve to get to the formation, then drill out 5,000 to 7,000 feet. Drill pipe does bend, but as the horizontal leg gets longer, the ability to push it though the strata decreases. With traditional drills, steel-weighted collars are used to help the drill bite, but there are only so many you can use. Eventually the drill will stop.

American Augers has developed a new horizontal drill called the VR500 that employs a rack-and-pinion system that through mechanical force applies the needed weight to the bit. It also eliminates traditional drilling components, such as cables, winches, tongs and catheads. While American Augers hasn't leased out any equipment to drilling operators in Colorado, Scheeff thinks it's only a matter of time before this technology moves into the mainstream.





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
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
