# Fastest-Growing Private Companies

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# New businesses top the list of fastest-growing firms

Four of the five fastest-growing local companies on *The Business Report's* "Fastest Growing Private Companies" list for 2001 are relative newcomers to the business world and the fifth is an eight-year-old Windsor-based firm that's seeing its revenues go into orbit.

And unlike last year — when software and other high-tech companies dominated the list's Top 10 spots —this year that group is much more diverse, even including a bank and a precast concrete manufacturer.

Top finishers on the list were honored at the Lincoln Center on May 15 during the second annual Mercury 100 Awards, sponsored by Engineering Computer Consultants, Inc. and *The Northern Colorado Business Report*. Other sponsors included Centerra and Alliance Construction Solutions.

Wowing the competition this year is a steadily-rising star in local real estate development, Loveland-based McWhinney Enterprises. Founded in 1995, the company reported a whopping 309 percent increase in revenue between 1999 and 2000. That jump in revenue earned it the title of "Fastest-Growing Private Company" for 2001 (see story page 4B).

Developers of Centerra, a high-profile, mixed-use development project at the intersection of Interstate 25 and U.S. Highway 34 east of Loveland,

McWhinney Enterprises increased its revenue from \$6.3 million in 1999 to almost \$26 million in 2000.

Coming in second on this year's list is Premier Manufacturing and Supply Chain, a Longmont-based printed circuit board manufacturer. Premier reported a 283 percent hike in its revenues from the \$306,000 it collected in its first year of operation in 1999 to \$ 1.2 million taken in the following year. Finishing third on the "Fastest Growing" list is New Frontier Bank, a Greeley-based bank founded in 1998. New Frontier posted a 242 percent earnings increase between 1999 and 2000 and increased its workforce sevenfold, from 7 to 49 employees.

Larry Seastrom, New Frontier president, credited the strong local economy as one reason why the bank had a spectacular year in 2000.

"More than anything we're lucky to live and work where we do," he said. "This economy makes us look smarter than we are."

Seatstrom credited a good location, knowledgeable employees and broad-based local ownership as other factors in the bank's success.

"That's fueled our growth beyond our wildest expectations," he said.

Fourth place belongs to Encorp, Inc., a Windsor-based company that designs, develops and manufactures devices that help connect businesses to the power grid and avoid power outages.

Encorp, founded in 1993, reported a 212 percent revenue jump and increased its workforce from 19 to 70 between 1999 and 2000.

Rocky Mountain Wireless takes fifth place on the list, reporting a 208 percent revenue increase. The Fort Collinsbased wireless distribution company provides services to nine states and is Colorado's largest Nextel authorized representative.

Founded in 1997, Rocky Mountain Wireless reported \$2.6 million in revenue in 1999 and \$8 million in 2000.

Sixth on the list is Terra Soft Solutions, a Loveland-based consulting company that reported a 171 percent revenue increase. Founded in 1999, Terra Soft increased its workforce five-fold and its revenues from \$140,000 to \$380,000.

Coming in seventh is Colorado

# McWhinney growth tops Mercury list

LOVELAND — McWhinney Berries had no "Inc." or "Co." or "Corp." attached to its name when it opened on a Southern California roadside in the middle 1980s.

Chad and Troy McWhinney, then in junior high school, hawked berries produced by a farmer who leased Orange County fields owned by the McWhinney family. The youngsters sold the strawberries from a makeshift stall on Beach Boulevard, one of the region's busiest thoroughfares.

"It didn't take long to realize that we could make more money selling strawberries than we could doing chores around the house," Chad McWhinney said. "We got \$20 a week for our chores, and could make \$300 a week selling strawberries."

Two other McWhinney brothers saw the light and enlisted. By 1991, McWhinney Berries peaked, operating 28 stands that employed 75 people and churning out more than \$1 million in sales during a four-month season.

Chad was 19, Troy 17.

A decade later, the brothers have done with land development what they did with California strawberries.

McWhinney Enterprises, the development company that has turned 3,000 acres of east Loveland farm fields into a

master-planned project called Centerra, more than tripled its revenue during 2000, landing it at the top of the *Northern Colorado Business Report's* "Mercury 100" list of the region's fastest-growing businesses.

During the year, revenue climbed to within a few dollars of \$26 million, up

from \$6.3 million in 1999.

#### **Centerra booms**

The accomplishment has lots of components: Centerra boomed during 2000 with new retail, hospitality, housing and office projects. The Prime Outlets, the factory-store mall that for

years served as the core money-maker for the McWhinney business, continues to post lofty sales figures. A California arm of McWhinney Enterprises has completed work on three major hotel projects in Anaheim and Garden Grove.



LOVELAND — A sleeping bear sculpture made from concrete lies in the front yard of Colorado Precast Concrete, Inc.

But the company is no sleeping giant. No, this bear has emerged from its winter cave and is foraging for food.

C olor a do Precast has jumped from No. 69 on *The Business Report's* 2000 list of fastest growing companies

to No. 7 on the 2001 list. The company's revenues grew from \$5 million to \$13 million, or 160 percent.

On the 2000 list, the company had grown slightly more than 16 percent, while in 1999, when the company ranked No. 26, it had grown more than 43 percent.

Colorado Precast makes a wide array of products, said Cindy Buckardt, vice president of general operations. Most of them fall into four categories: underground utility work, architectural work, landscape work and buildings.

"We manufacture more different products than anyone in the state," she said.

The company is family-owned.

Colorado Precast also puts packages together of products related to theirs, such as plastic pipes needed for underground utilities.

The majority of sales are to contractors. Colorado Precast delivers most of what it makes, whether it goes to New York, Montana or Texas, he said.

The biggest reason for the company's growth in the past year was an AT&T contract for 60 buildings.

"We've never had that quantity," Buckardt said. "Because we were able to jump on the project right away, we got the majority of the contract."

Hayward added: "They wanted us to turn the first building out in three weeks."

The logistics were a challenge. Colorado Precast had to get all the materials — including steel and doorframes — and coordinate with several subcontractors to get the job done.

"We made lots of phone calls and

# Construction giant posts \$160 million revenue hike

With annual revenues exceeding \$1.42 billion last year, Greeley-based construction giant Hensel Phelps is the largest of this year's "Top 100 Fastest-Growing Private Companies" in Northern Colorado.

Employing more than 500 locally and nearly 2,000 throughout the nation, Hensel Phelps comes in 78th on the list, posting a 12.8 percent revenue increase in 2000 over 1999, according to a survey conducted by *The Northern Colorado Business Report.* 

Ron Norby, company vice president and district manager for its Colorado market, said Hensel Phelps' 2000's revenue growth rate wasn't that unusual.

"I don't think it was exceptional," he said. "It was probably fairly normal."

Still, jumping by more than \$160 million in revenues over the previous year isn't too shabby.

And neither is the growth of Hensel Phelps, from its humble beginnings as a

"When they apply design standards that are more strict than the city requires, it's quite impressive,' Blanchard said.

Patience has also been a trait with which the McWhinnevs have been blessed, according to friends and associates — and patience will be a valuable attribute as Centerra's future unfolds.

While some real estate watchers say it will take two decades for Centerra to absorb its projected development, progress over a shorter window of time - say, five years — is easier to describe.

That's partly because projects that will appear by that time are already entering the development pipeline.

"I would say if you take what we have now and triple the size, that would be a close approximation," said Troy McWhinney, vice president for develop-

"Northern Colorado is one of the most difficult places in the nation for development. It requires us to start planning our projects much earlier. When people see things going up, they often don't realize that the planning for all that began about three years ago.'

#### **Brothers in balance**

The required balance between longterm vision and day-to-day shepherding of development details matches perfectly to the personality traits that Chad and Troy McWhinney bring to their jobs, Blanchard said.

"Chad is the visionary," he said. "He has the big picture of what Centerra will look like in the future. Troy is the implementer, the doer. He makes it all happen."

The brothers, who spent most of their young lives in California, relocated to Loveland in the early 1990s to begin planning for the development of land that had been in the family since it was homesteaded by their great-greatgreat grandfather, John Hahn. The original homestead deed hangs on the wall of Chad McWhinney's office.

But it took earnings from the strawberry business to get the ball rolling.

"Our grandmother passed away in December 1989, and there were inheritance taxes that needed to be paid on the Loveland farms," said Chad, who serves as president and CEO of McWhinney Enterprises. "We got an option to purchase it at the price set by

The McWhinneys, still in their early 20s when McWhinney Enterprises was incorporated, credit the advice and counsel of other developers in the region for helping them move their projects forward.

McWhinney Chad mentions names: Stu MacMillan of the Everitt Cos., David Neenan, founder of the Neenan Cos., Bill Neal, partner in Wheeler Commercial Property Services, Tom Hoyt, who heads McStain Enterprises, based home builder that will construct most of Centerra's planned 5,000 homes.

He also credits his younger brother and founding partner.

"Troy and I are aligned," he said. "When you're aligned, and have the same mission, the same values and the same goals, it's easy. It's when you have a disconnect, it creates tension and problems. We don't have

Precast Concrete, Inc., a Loveland-based maker of precast concrete products (see story on page 9B). The 26-year-old company reported a revenue increase of 160 percent.

Eighth place goes to 1994-founded MediaTech Productions in Fort Collins with a 158 percent revenue increase. MediaTech produces video, television commercials and programming, and recently added video streaming on the Internet to its services.

"It was a good year for us," said Maury Willman, company founder. "It was due to the fact that we were trying to build the company steadily since we started in 1994."

Willman said 2000 was particularly good for MediaTech because some big projects "that had taken years to get" finally came through.

"We saw the fruits of our growth in 2000, and hopefully that will continue," she said.

Facility Solutions, a Longmont project construction and management company that placed 19th last year, takes ninth place on this year's list. Founded in 1997, Facility Solutions reported a 150 percent earnings hike between 1999 and 2000.

Connie Bruce, company president, said several factors combined in 2000 to move it up on this year's list.

"Our growth is for a number of reasons," she said. "Number one, I think we're much more established and the second thing is because of all the merg-

ers and acquisitions and the dot.coms starting up.

"It was a fun year."

Rounding out the Top 10 on this year's list is Loveland-based Stratotech Corp., which placed 27th last year. The company produces industrial engineering software tools and clean technology products.

Founded in 1996, Stratotech reported a 139 percent revenue increase.

worked lots of hours," Hayward said.

It helped that the company has been reducing worker turnover and making production more efficient over the past few years, he said. The efficiency is evidenced by the fact that Colorado Precast only hired three new workers in the last year, totaling 53.

"We've stabilized our work force. The less time you have to train someone is more production," he said. Turnover is about 10 percent. Hayward also gives credit for efficiency to good working relationships with subcontractors.

Customers, such as Biological Mediation Systems Inc., are impressed and keep coming back.

"Colorado Precast is probably one of the best precast companies in the country," said BMSI President Alex Rachak. BMSI of Fort Collins has been buying foundations and buildings from the company for about eight years.

"They're meticulous in the product they provide," he said. "They've been a very important part of our business."

Jack Sullivan, an estimator for Coulson Excavating Inc. of Loveland, said his company has worked with Colorado Precast almost since it started up in 1975.

"We're pleased with their performance and their work. Their delivery is always when they say it will be," he said. Colorado Precast is very helpful and responsive, too, he added.

"We've never had any complaints about the quality."

That kind of customer loyalty will

likely help Colorado Precast in its next expansion phase. The company is planning to build a new batch plant that will increase its production capacity by about 200 percent. It should be up and running by July, Hayward said.

"Because of the way the economy's been over the years, we try to keep things in check and not go crazy," he said. "We've been fortunate enough to jump on some of the bigger jobs and go after it."

growing up in California and McDonald in Washington.

Both moved to Hawaii in the 1970s and worked as construction carpenters, with Deal living on Kauai and McDonald on Maui. They met briefly once on the islands before coming to Fort Collins and teaming up to launch Parkside Homes in 1996.

Deal said business has steadily increased in Colorado, thanks in part to a thriving economy and rapid state population growth rate that shows no sign of slowing down.

"We think there's a broad market for entry level, affordable housing and we're striving to deliver it," said Deal. "It's a vast, under served market and I think our success proves it."

Deal and McDonald subcontract most of the construction of the detached single-family and multiple-family housing they build, with only 11 salaried employees on the company payroll.

But there are obstacles to providing low-cost housing. Deal and McDonald note that the cost of building permits, water and land has risen sharply in recent years and those costs have to be passed along in the price of housing.

Land, in particular, is becoming a difficult issue, they said.

"Our biggest problem is finding land," said Deal. "The local jurisdictions, especially Fort Collins, make it hard to get land in the pipeline at a reasonable price and a reasonable time."

#### **Pride in product**

Still, McDonald said he's proud of the

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homes Parkside has built over the last five years.

"We put out a good product that's quality and we back it with our name," he said. "Even though it's an entry-level house, we treat them like it's a million-dollar home."

While they could be building more expensive housing, McDonald and Deal say they like doing what they're doing.

"For me, it's more rewarding," said McDonald. "To see the smile on a young couple's face moving into a new house and getting their appreciation is very rewarding.

"Nothing's better when they say thank you, you've provided us with a home we never thought we could afford."

Deal shares the same philosophy.

"I like to drive through a neighborhood we've done and see the little things people have done to their yard to make it their own," he said. "It's very satisfying."

Deal said he loves seeing a home take shape.

"As a builder, it gets in your blood," he said. "Every day you get to see what you've done. It's very tangible and it's basic to that fundamental human requirement — shelter."

Both men are optimistic that

Parkside's future will be bright.

"Our goal is to maintain our profitability and a strong balance sheet while we achieve growth," Deal said. "Combine hard work with vision and I think you're going to have success."

#### Proven track record

Steve Skaar, who's acted as a lender on Parkside projects since the company's inception, said Parkside has proven itself in the construction world.

"I think the key to success in homebuilding or anything else is you've got to perform," he said. "That's really what I looked for as a lender, for somebody who found a market niche and who could implement a business plan."

Skaar said Parkside "provides a desirable product at a desirable location at a fair price. You've really got to have all three of those elements together. I think it's a reflection of the developers of Rigden Farm in seeing what they've accomplished and bringing them into that project."

Fred Croci, managing broker at Wheeler Commercial and a partner in Rigden Farm, said the Rigden project is his first collaboration with Parkside but he's found them to be "square shooters."

"Matt has been wonderful to deal with, making all the changes we requested," said Croci. "He's an excelent business manager."

Croci said he believes the Parkside project at Rigden will be a huge success.

"Most of the calls I've received in the last two years have been for town and patio homes," he said. "I think they're going to be very successful." "It's a vast, under served market and I think our success proves it."



With a projected population of more than 1 million new Coloradans in the next decade, both Deal and McDonald say they're confident they will continue to succeed.


